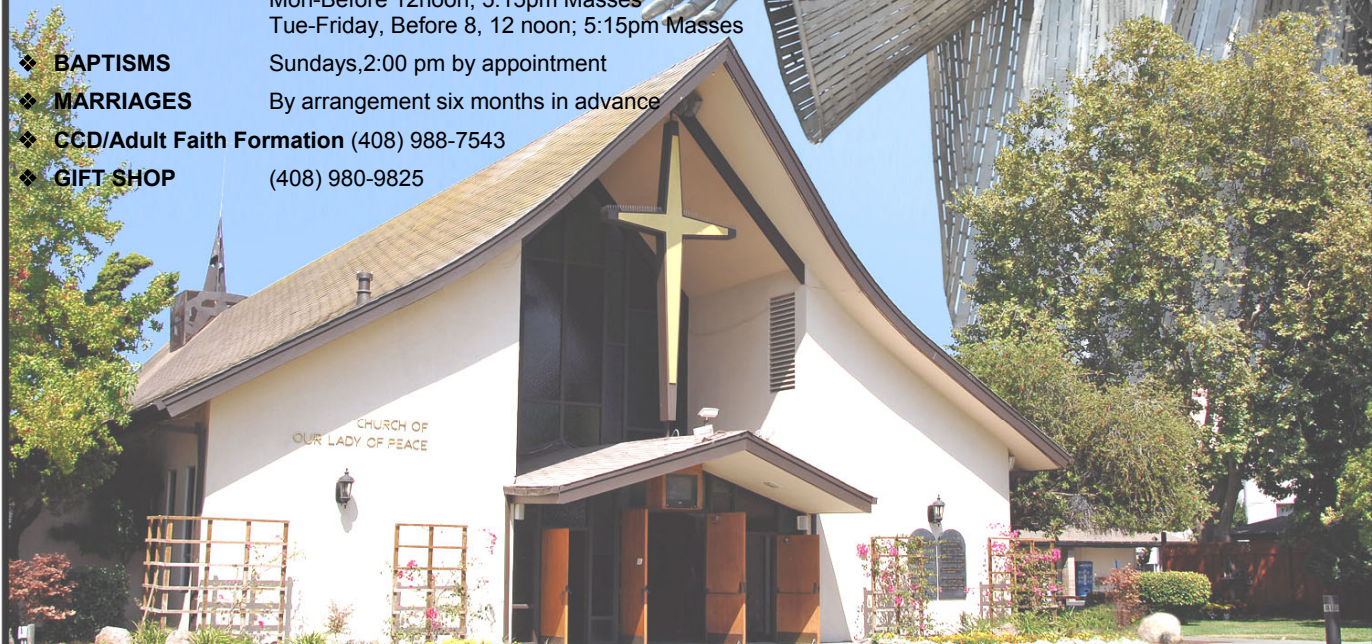

# Welcome

### FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The second part of the celebration of the Holy Mass is called Liturgy of the Word. There are virtually no changes to the English texts we use for the Liturgy of the Word, except for the Creed.

The readings will conclude the same way. The reader will say, "The Word of the Lord," and you answer, "Thanks be to God."

**Remember:** when the priest says before the reading of the Gospel, "The Lord be with you," you answer, "and with your spirit." When the Gospel is announced, you still say, "Glory to you, Lord." And at the conclusion you still say, "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ."

The words we say to profess our faith in the Creed are going to change, but our faith is staying the same. Again, the guiding principle for the revised translation is to make the English closer to the Latin original.

**"I believe"** instead of "We believe". The Creed is still the faith of the whole Church, but each of us proclaims it to assert our personal faith together with other believers.

**"Of all things visible and invisible"** instead "of all that is seen and unseen." Some things that are visible by nature are actually unseen at certain times and places. Your relatives who live across the country are visible, but unseen to you. Your great-great grandfather was visible once upon the time, but now he is unseen. We believe that God is the maker not only of the things we cannot see for whatever reason, but also of things that are in fact invisible, such as angels.

**"Only Begotten"** instead of "only". It expresses that Jesus did not merely materialize as the Son of God, but he was intentionally begotten.

**"Born of the Father before all ages"** instead of "eternally begotten of the Father." This change makes the expression more precise. Jesus dwelled with the Father before time began.

**"Consubstantial"** instead of "one in Being." The Latin word "consubstantialis" means "having the same substance" which is more fundamental than "one in Being." Consubstantial is a very unusual word. We don't use it for anything else. But it is describing a very unusual thing- the nature of Jesus Christ.

**"Incarnate"** instead of "born." It means something like "giving flesh." It professes our belief that the Word became flesh in the womb of the Virgin Mary. The current word could be misunderstood to state that the Word became flesh when Jesus was born. That is not our faith. Jesus was not simply born by the power of the Holy Spirit; He was conceived that way. The new translation makes it clearer that Jesus did not become a human when he was born; He was incarnate in the womb, and in that event "became man."

**"Suffered death"** instead of "suffered, died." The Latin is ambiguous. Literally, it says "he suffered and was buried," and the word "suffered" implies his dying. Because the verb "died" is not there in Latin, "suffered death" seems a better way to express what happened to Jesus.

**"In accordance with the Scriptures"** instead of "in fulfillment of the Scriptures." In Latin, the word more nearly means "in accordance with" or even "according to."

**"Adored"** instead of "worshipped." It more nearly resembles the word in Latin.

**"I confess"** instead of "We acknowledge." In the context, "confess" means "profess belief in" – not "express sorrow for sins." It sounds stronger than "acknowledge" because it involves the heart, not just the head.

**"I look forward to the resurrection"** instead of "look for the resurrection." This is a clearer translation of the Latin.

**Message from United States Conference of Catholic Bishops  
Conscience Rights Violated by Sweeping HHS Contraceptive Mandate**

**URGENT: Respond by September 30**

In implementing the 2010 Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (the new health care reform law), the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) recently issued a rule requiring almost all private health plans to cover contraception and sterilization as “preventive services” for women. The mandate even forces individuals and groups with religious or moral objections to purchase and provide such coverage if they are to receive or provide health coverage at all. This poses an unprecedented threat to individual and institutional religious freedom.

The rule includes a religious exemption so extremely narrow that it protects almost no one. It covers only a “religious employer” that has the “inculcation of religious values” as its purpose, primarily employs and serves persons who share its religious tenets, and is a church organization under two narrow provisions of the tax code. A great many religious organizations -- including Catholic colleges and universities, as well as hospitals and charitable institutions that serve the public -- will be ineligible. Individuals and religiously affiliated health insurers will not qualify for the exemption.

The new rule would force insurance plans to cover “all Food and Drug Administration approved contraceptive methods, sterilization procedures, and patient education and counseling for all women with reproductive capacity.” Never before has the federal government required private health plans to include such coverage. The FDA-approved “emergency contraception” (EC) drugs that are covered by this mandate can work by interfering with implantation of a newly conceived human being. Also, the drug the FDA most recently approved for EC, “Ella,” a close analogue to the abortion drug RU-486, has been shown in animal tests to cause abortion. Thus, the mandate includes drugs that may cause an abortion both before and after implantation.

The public comment period on this interim final rule ends September 30.

**ACTION:** Please send an e-mail message to HHS by visiting [www.usccb.org/conscience](http://www.usccb.org/conscience). Once you send your comments to HHS, you will be automatically invited to send a message to your elected representatives in Congress, urging them to support the Respect for Rights of Conscience Act (H.R. 1179/S. 1467) to ensure that such federal mandates do not violate Americans’ moral and religious convictions.

**MESSAGE TO HHS:** “Pregnancy is not a disease, and drugs and surgeries to prevent it are not basic health care that the government should require all Americans to purchase. Please remove sterilization and prescription contraceptives from the list of ‘preventive services’ the federal government is mandating in private health plans. It is especially important to exclude any drug that may cause an early abortion, and to fully respect religious freedom as other federal laws do. The narrow religious exemption in HHS’s new rule protects almost no one. I urge you to allow all organizations and individuals to offer, sponsor and obtain health coverage that does not violate their moral and religious convictions.”
