FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified... (Cf. Jn 12:23) With these words the Gospel introduces us into the fifth week of Lent.

No one need wonder why Christ so often spoke of *His hour*. Divine Providence had infallibly determined it from all eternity, and before it came His enemies could do nothing against Him. The nearer this hour approached, the more urgent became His warnings to His disciples. It was the hour of the excruciating suffering, the hour of the offering, the hour of the revelation of infinite love, "the hour when we received the gift of love that is stronger than death." (Cf. St. John Paul II, 04/09/04)

Many times we come across people who imagine that the interior life is but a pleasant easy ascent, along a flower-bordered path. You know it is not generally so. In fact, "it is impossible to go to Heaven by any other way than that which Jesus went by, the way of the Cross." (Bl. Columba Marmion, *Suffering With Christ*) So we too, will have to undergo *our hour* when suffering strikes.

Therefore, I'd like to share with you some brief thoughts about the patience of our Lord during his sufferings, pointing out at some passages that illustrate precisely "the mystery of God's patience," as Pope Francis speaks of it, especially during His Passion.

- He is the Model of admirable patience even so far as to endure having near Him the one He knows is to betray Him.
- He is silent before Herod who treats Him as a fool.
- He submits Himself to Pilate who condemns Him to an infamous death.
- *Like a lamb that is led to slaughter, and like a sheep that is silent before its shearers, so He did not open His mouth.* (Is 53:7)
- *He did not cover His face from humiliation and spitting.* (Is 50:6)

Why did Jesus submit without complaint to all these atrocities? Well, certainly because of the reverence and love He had for his Father Who had fixed the circumstances of His Passion.

Our Lord wishes us, especially during this season of Lent, to learn that He is *meek and humble of Heart*. Since this should be also our disposition and attitude during times of trials. But be aware: Patience is not the passive attitude of listless souls.

"Patience," Pope Francis warned, "is not resignation, it is something quite different. Patience means bearing the things of life, the things that are not good, the bad things, the things that we do not want. This patience will cause our lives to mature." (*Morning Meditation*, 02/17/14)

Let us also accept willingly the mortifications sent to us by Providence: hunger, cold, heat, illness, small inconveniences of place or time, slight contradictions coming from those around us and a long etcetera. It is by patience that we share in his sufferings. Remember that God is never so near to us as when He places His Son's cross upon our shoulders; never do we give our Lord more glory than the one He receives from our patience in such moments.

May our Blessed Mother, Mirror of Patience, by the merits of her grief seeing her Son die before her eyes, grant us the grace that we may bear with patience the trials of this life.

I also would like to take this opportunity to commend myself to your prayers as well as all my IVE brothers priests, seminarians and our dear founder Fr. Carlos Buela, since this coming 25th of March we will celebrate the 31st Anniversary of our Institute. *Deo gratias!*

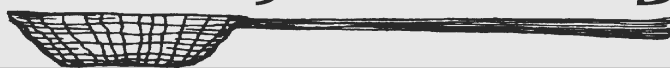

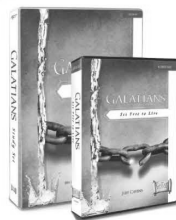

The Family as First School of Human Virtues # 19

Let us now continue discussing the virtue of *obedience*, in which children need to be trained since their early years.

Let us now continue discussing about **how parents should approach some of the more common faults in the way their children obey.**

What Parents Should Do (Cont.)

"Training in obedience also calls for powers of **observation** and for **sensitivity** on the part of the parents, because many factors can contribute to a child's having a rebellious, disobedient attitude.

In the case of small children, if you give them **clear information at the right time** and then make demands in an **affectionate way** and **follow them up**, in a general, orderly atmosphere the results are usually positive. But from this age up to thirteen or fourteen you often get a **recurrence of the 'no' stage** typical of the three- or four-year- old.

There are all sorts of reasons for this. For example, excessive insistence by parents on things of secondary importance; nervousness on parents' part; misuse of threats and empty promises; and also a series of factors on the child's side."
