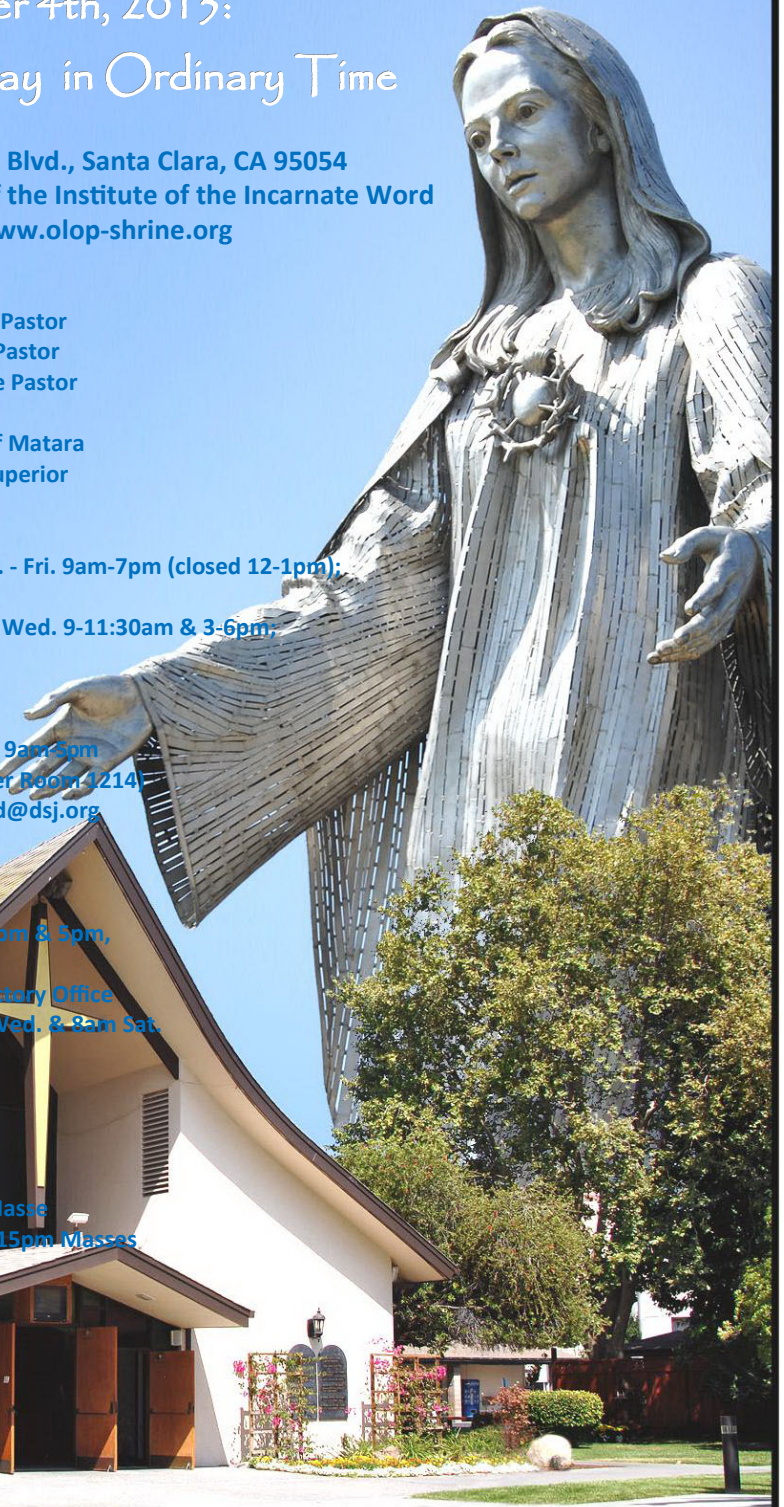

From Our Pastor

Dear Parishioners,,

Coming up this week, on October 7, we will celebrate the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary.

Often times as I walk through the grounds of the Shrine I'm very pleased to see many people approach to the feet of our Blessed Mother with a deep prayerful attitude. And it makes me think, how this shrine becomes a place of encounter with the Mother of God who is also our Mother. Indeed we all go to the feet of our Lady knowing that she will not reject us that she is waiting for us with outstretched arms. Thus, we go to her to present our needs, to give thanks, to ask forgiveness and to begin again. And we do well! How many conversions, priestly and religious vocations, engagements and marriages, have been born at the feet of our Mother! How many tearful farewells! We come bringing our lives, because here we are at home and because we find in our Lady "a true Mother, one who helps us to keep faith and hope alive in the midst of complicated situations." (Pope Francis)

This coming Wednesday, we will hear in the gospel the petition of the apostles to our Lord: *Lord, teach us to pray.* (Lk 11:1). The prayer of the Holy Rosary has been strongly recommended by the Holy Fathers and by Our Lady herself especially when in Fatima she repeatedly asked the three little shepherds to "pray the Rosary every day."

Ven. Archbishop Fulton Sheen said, "The rosary is the book of the blind, where souls see and there enact the greatest drama of love the world has ever known; it is the book of the simple, which initiates them into mysteries and knowledge more satisfying than the education of other men; it is the book of the aged, whose eyes close upon the shadow of this world, and open on the substance of the next. The power of the rosary is beyond description."

The Rosary is basically a gospel prayer, and for those who pray it properly, it is, as Sr. Lucia said, "a simple method of getting closer to God." But to pray it properly requires that each decade be a reflection on some aspect of the joyful, sorrowful, luminous or glorious mysteries of our redemption. Without that meditation, the Rosary would become monotonous repetition. As Bl. Pope Paul VI wrote in *Marialis Cultus*: "Without this (contemplation) the Rosary is a body without a soul, and its recitation is in danger of becoming a mechanical repetition of formulas." This time, I'd like to offer your two very brief reflections of our Holy Father, Pope Francis on two difficult moments in Mary's life, that I think can help you meditate as you pray the Holy Rosary.

1. **"The birth of Jesus.** There was no room for them. They had no house, no dwelling to receive her Son. There was no place where she could give birth. They had no family close by; they were alone. The only place available was a stall of animals. Surely she remembered the words of the angel: *Rejoice, Mary, the Lord is with you.* She might well have asked herself: "Where is he now?"

2. **Jesus' death on the cross.** There can be no more difficult experience for a mother than to witness the death of her child. It is heartrending. We see Mary there, at the foot of the cross, like every mother, strong, faithful, staying with her child even to his death, death on the cross. Then she encourages and supports the disciples.

We look at her life, and we feel understood, we feel heard. We can sit down to pray with her and use a common language in the face of the countless situations we encounter each day. We can identify with many situations in her own life. We can tell her what is happening in our lives, because she understands.

Mary is the woman of faith, she believed. Her life testifies that God does not deceive us, or abandon his people, even in moments or situations when it might seem that He is not there. [...] A Mother who learned, amid so many hardships, the meaning of the words: *Do not be afraid, the Lord is with you.* A Mother who keeps saying to us: *Do whatever he tells you.* " (Homily, July 11, 2015)

Gazing once more on our Lady's image I pray that the daily recitation of the Holy Rosary may be the sweet chain that ties us to God.

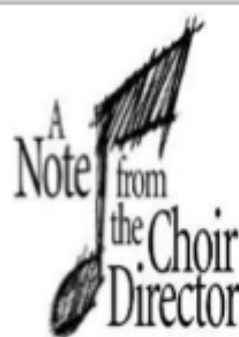

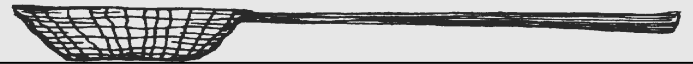

40 Days for Life

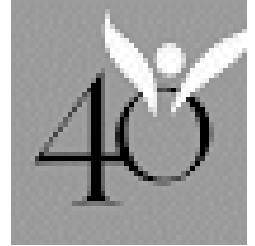

Jubilee Year of Mercy

On Divine Mercy Sunday 2015, Pope Francis issued *Misericordiae Vultus*, Bull of Indiction of the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy, to highlight the Catholic Church's "mission to be a witness of mercy."

The Jubilee year of Mercy begins December 8th, 2015, with the opening of the holy door at the Basilica of St. Peter in Rome, and continues until the closing of the Jubilee Year on November 20th, 2016.

Our Lady of Peace has been designated as a pilgrimage Church to gain plenary indulgences during the Jubilee year.

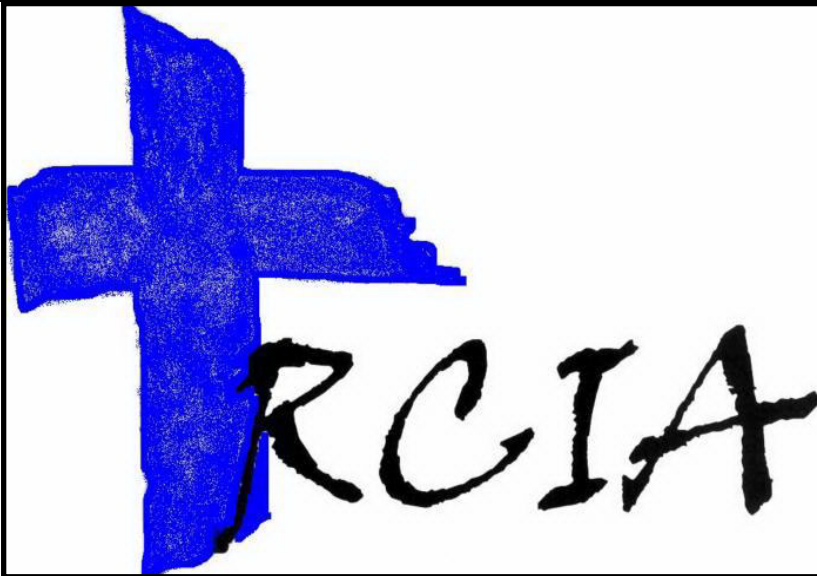
Pope Francis' Jubilee Year Prayer

Lord Jesus Christ,

you have taught us to be merciful like the heavenly Father, and have told us that whoever sees you sees Him. Show us your face and we will be saved. Your loving gaze freed Zacchaeus and Matthew from being enslaved by money; the adulteress and Magdalene from seeking happiness only in created things; made Peter weep after his betrayal, and assured Paradise to the repentant thief.

Let us hear, as if addressed to each one of us, the words that you spoke to the Samaritan woman: "If you knew the gift of God!" You are the visible face of the invisible Father, of the God who manifests his power above all by forgiveness and mercy: let the Church be your visible face in the world, its Lord risen and glorified. You willed that your ministers would also be clothed in weakness in order that they may feel compassion for those in ignorance and error: let everyone who approaches them feel sought after, loved, and forgiven by God.

Send your Spirit and consecrate every one of us with its anointing, so that the Jubilee of Mercy may be a year of grace from the Lord, and your Church, with renewed enthusiasm, may bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed, and restore sight to the blind. We ask this through the intercession of Mary, Mother of Mercy, you who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit for ever and ever. Amen.
