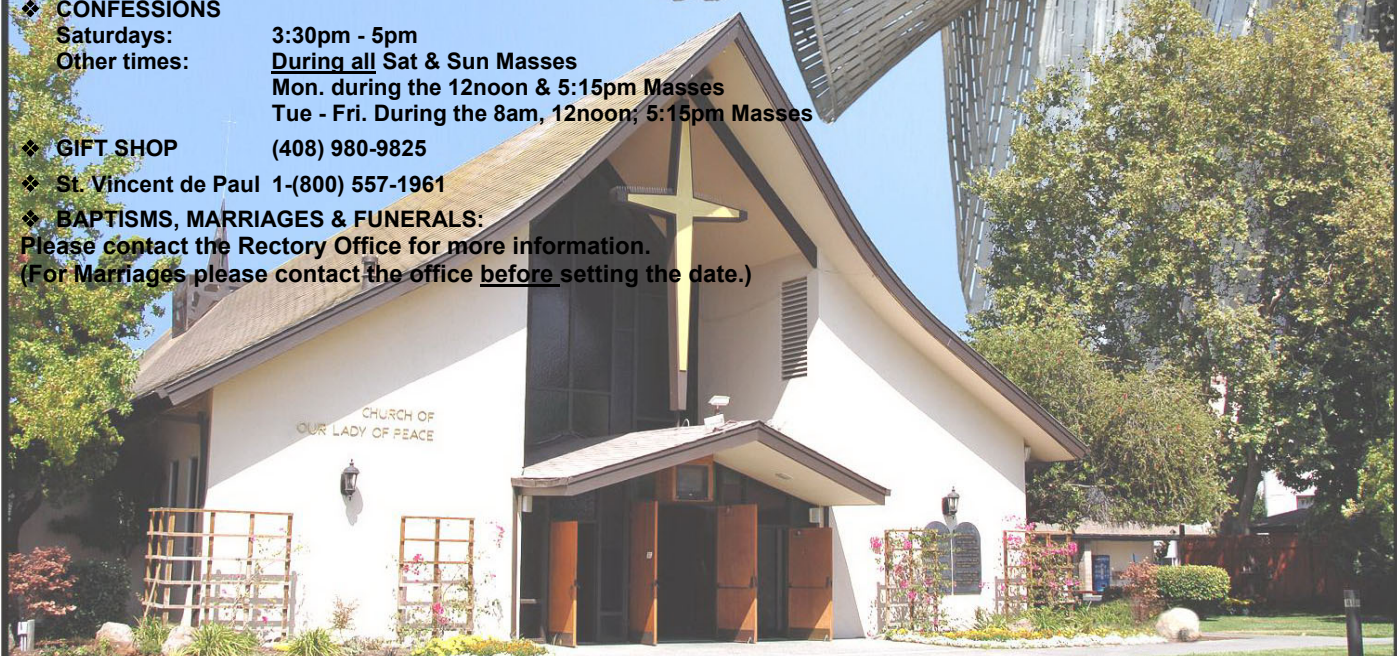
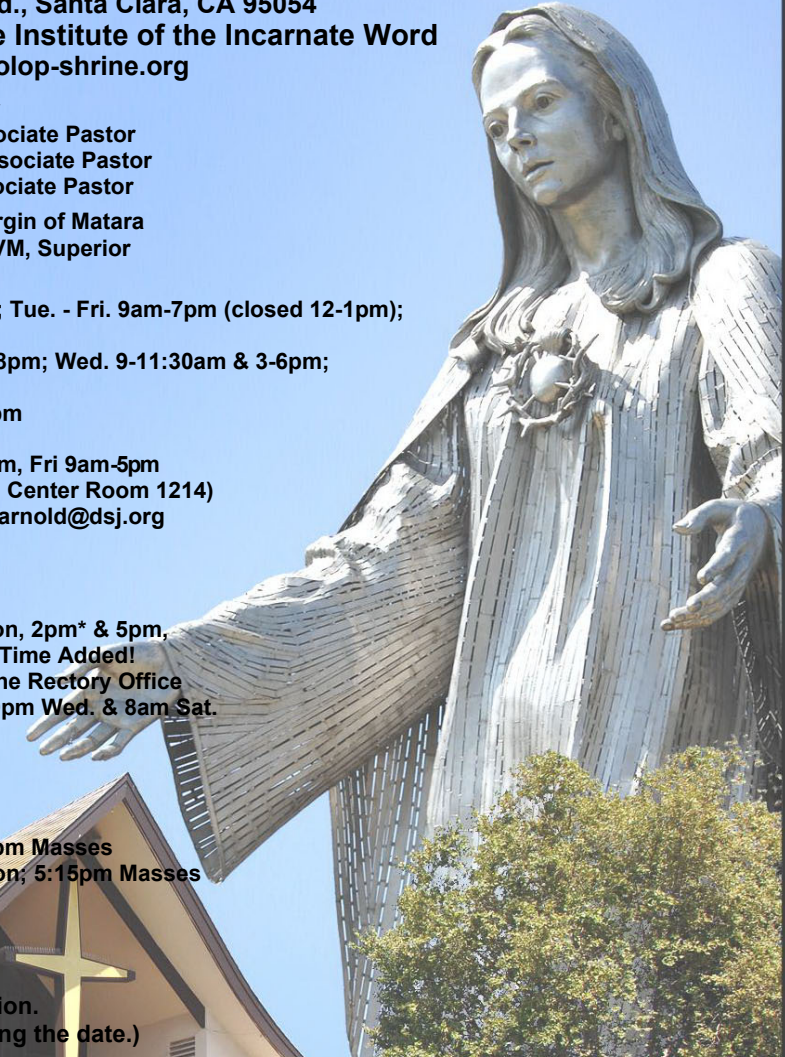

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

There is perhaps no more tender and touching expression in our language than "filial devotion." It compounds in a single phrase the whole attitude of mind and will, that a loyal child should have for its parents. If this is the case with our earthly parents, how much more should it be with regard to our heavenly Mother!

Today we have the joy of celebrating the birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary when we praise her, who entered into this world as a sinless infant through the privilege of the Immaculate Conception and, is the firstborn of the redeemed. Her nativity is a cause for great joy because it is considered the "dawn of our salvation" as Pope Paul VI wrote in the document *Marialis Cultus* in 1972.

How beautiful must have been the soul of our Lady as an infant in the sight of heaven and earth! St. Thomas Aquinas, the great Doctor of the Church, declares that the fullness of grace in the Blessed Virgin Mary is threefold. She was full of grace in soul, so that from her very inception her holy soul belonged entirely to God. She was full of grace in body, so that she merited to clothe the Eternal Word with her immaculate flesh. She was full of grace for the benefit of all, so that all mankind might share in it.

Today we place into the Immaculate Heart of our Lady the intentions and petitions that so many of you have brought to us, as well as the many other petitions that remain in the depths of our hearts. We place them all into the pure and generous heart of our Blessed Mother because we know that never was it known that anyone who implored her help, or sought her intercession was left unaided.

Could there possibly be anyone in this world upon whom the Blessed Virgin Mary would refuse to turn her merciful eyes, if that person but wishes for her mercy? Anyone upon whom she does not bestow some favor if a favor is asked? Let us never forget that our Lord has, indeed, established our Blessed Mother as the channel of the graces and mercies which He desires to dispense to us.

So as I place your intentions into her Immaculate Heart, I invite you to place yourselves and your families, under her maternal and tender care and protection.

"She is the Mother who loves, protects, advises, consoles and gives life so that life may be born and endured. She is the Daughter who honors her family, is ever attentive to the needs of her brothers and sisters and is prompt in making her home beautiful and welcoming; she is the Wife capable of faithful, patient love, of sacrifice and of hope." (Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, 2008)

And in turn, let the love for our Blessed Mother remain in your hearts too. There is no better way to celebrate our Lady's birthday than to make her the Queen of our lives and the Queen of our homes.

Finally, I wish to share with you some of my petitions to our Lady for you and indeed for us all:

I pray that our Blessed Mother, as a woman of faith, may inspire all parents to transmit the Christian faith to their children; that in the setting of family-love, children might learn free and loving obedience, inspired by Mary's obedience to God. May her example of concern for others exercise its gentle influence in our relationships with others. May we be inspired by her readiness to fulfill God's will in all our endeavors. May she who was sinless since the first instant of her conception give us the grace to remain in God's grace; that if we are tempted she may be our sure Refuge; and that if we sin, she may bring us back under the mantle of her protection. May our Blessed Mother be the consolation for all those who are suffering, especially the sick members of our parish, those who are lonely, and those who have gone astray. May our Blessed Mother, our Lady of Peace, bring peace to our souls, to our families, to our workplace, to our world. May she who became the Paradise of God give us the grace to contemplate her one day in Heaven.

I entrust you all to her motherly love and mercy.

Profession of Faith: The Apostle's Creed

In the rubrics of the Roman Missal the ideal is outlined for the Entrance Songs . Paragraph 48 of the General Instruction of the Roman Missal reads: "This chant is sung alternately by the choir and the people... or by the choir alone..." While most parishes opt for a standard hymn at the entrance, the rubrical preference for a psalm with antiphon may still be accommodated today. Ideally, we should be singing chant Propers from the official books.

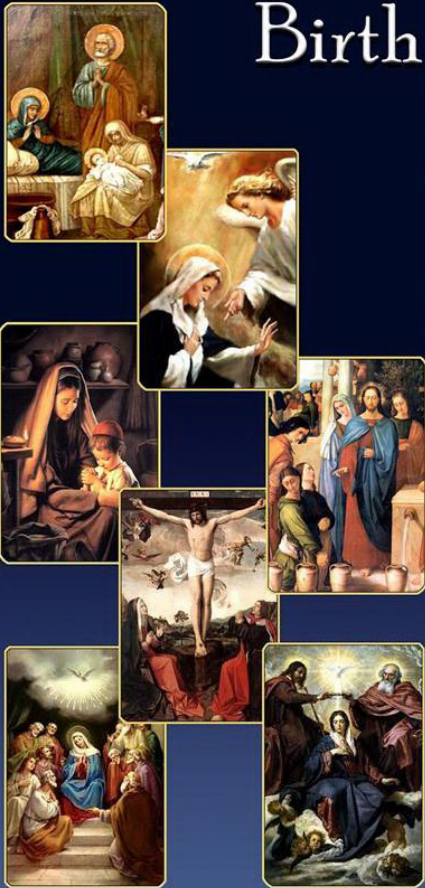

The Story of Her Birth

Saint John Paul II's Letter on the 100th Anniversary of Pope Pius X's document on music

Pope John Paul II in his "encyclical" dated on the Feast of Saint Cecilia, patroness of music, November 22, 2003 and released December 3, 2003.

In order to ensure dignity and integrity of forms to liturgical music, the pope stresses the need for intensified training of musicians, choirs, congregations as well as of priests and seminarians, so that "the musical aspect of liturgical celebrations be left neither to improvisation nor to the will of individuals". The pope mentions in particular the continued need for schools of sacred music, "which deserve to be supported and developed for an ever improving understanding and execution of good liturgical music".

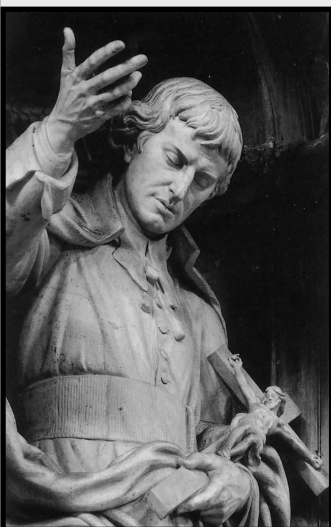
