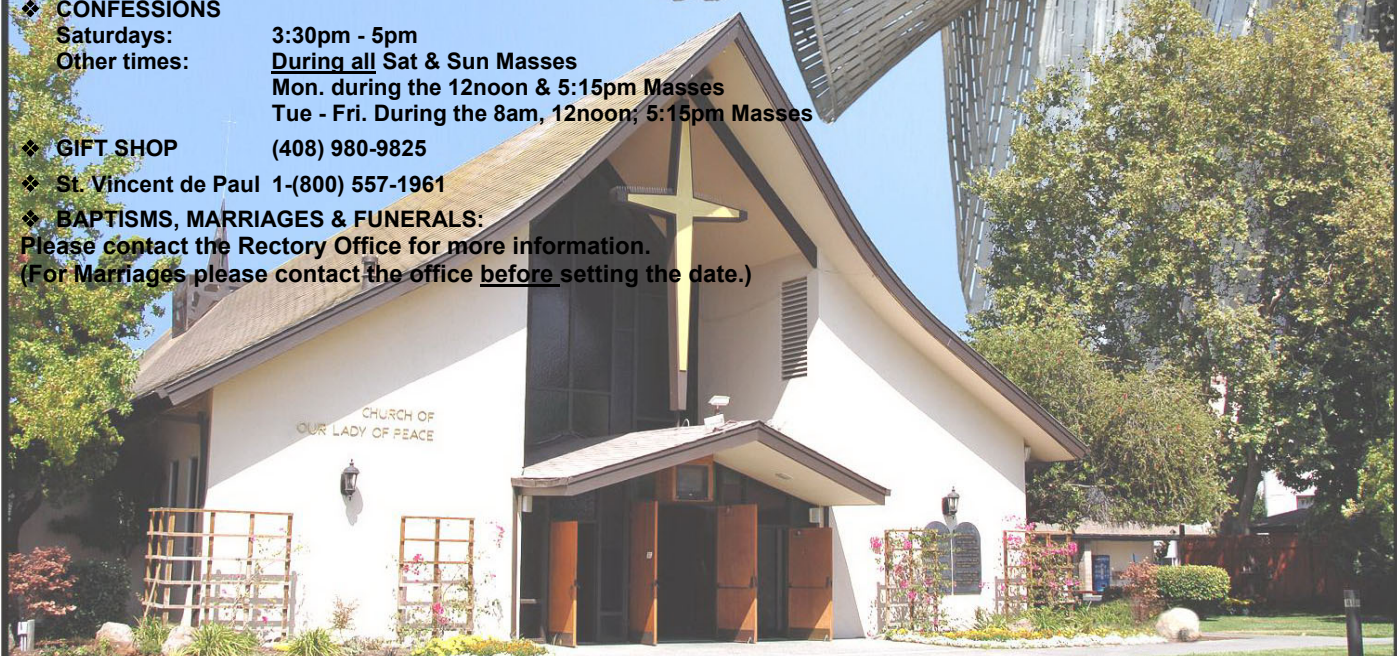
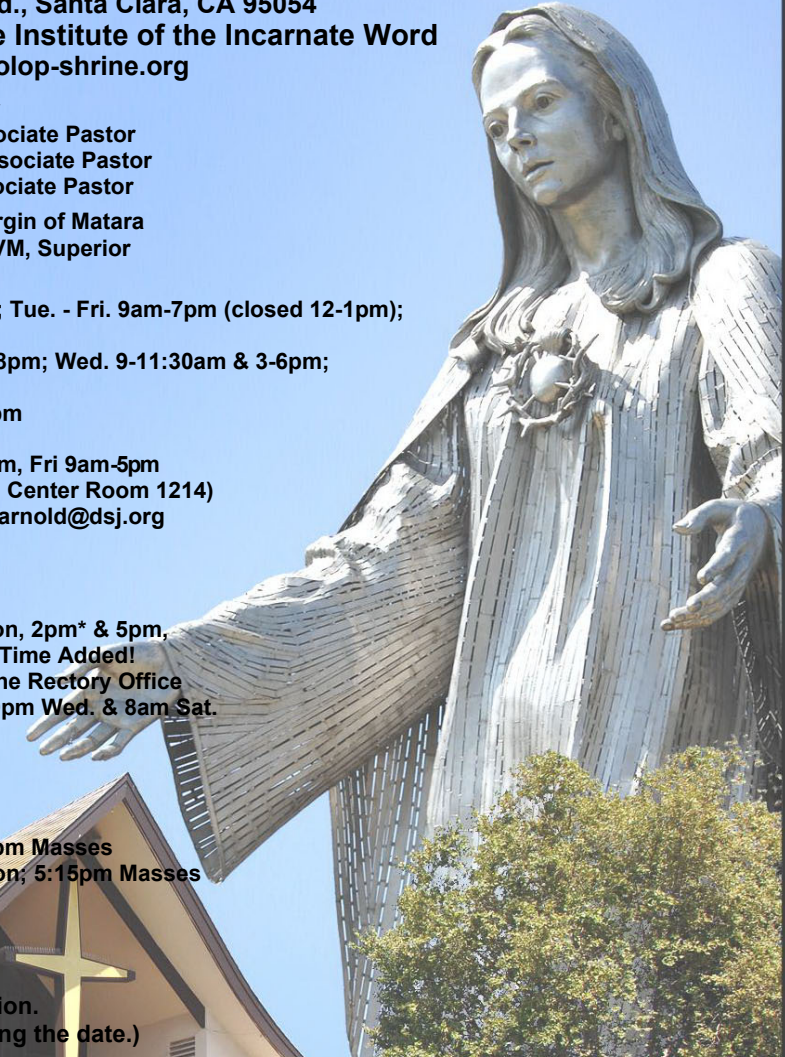

The Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Coming up in this week is the feast day of Saint Pius of Pietrelcina (Padre Pio), the Priest. This celebration gives us the opportunity to "contemplate in him how gentle the yoke of Christ is, and how truly light is his burden when it is borne with faithful love. The life and mission of Padre Pio proves that difficulties and sorrows, if accepted out of love, are transformed into a privileged way of holiness, which opens onto the horizons of a greater good, known only to the Lord." (St. John Paul II, Mass of Canonization, 9/16/02)

As we prepare for his feast day, I'd like to highlight five things that we can learn from St. Padre Pio:

1. **Prayer** is essential for every Christian. He loved to repeat, "I am a poor Franciscan who prays" convinced that "prayer is the best weapon we have, a key that opens the heart of God." Padre Pio not only practiced intense communication with the Lord Himself but he also exhorted his listeners to do the same. He acknowledged that prayer is indispensable for anyone who is serious about following Christ. "You must speak to Jesus not only with your lips, but with your heart. In fact on certain occasions you should only speak to Him with your heart."

2. The **Holy Eucharist** is the treasure left behind by Christ Himself; the **Holy Sacrifice of the Mass** is necessary for authentic development in holiness. Much of Padre Pio's prayer time was spent in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. "Every Holy Mass, heard with devotion, produces in our souls marvelous effects, abundant spiritual and material graces which we, ourselves, do not know...It is easier for the earth to exist without the sun than without the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass!"

3. Padre Pio unhesitatingly proclaimed the importance of frequent **Confession**. He compared weekly confession to dusting a room weekly. He has said: "Jesus tells us that in Heaven, there is more rejoicing for one repentant sinner than for the perseverance of ninety-nine righteous. This declaration of the Redeemer is truly comforting for so many unfortunate souls who, having sinned and repented, wish to return to Jesus." "Let us hurry confidently to the tribunal of penance where He, with fatherly anxiety, waits for us every moment; although cognizant of our debt to Him, let us not doubt that our sins have been solemnly forgiven. Just as our Lord has done, let us bury them."

4. He was also strongly devoted to **Our Blessed Mother**. He daily prayed multiple Rosaries and urged his steady stream of visitors to have recourse to the Madonna. Padre Pio said many times: "I wish I had a voice loud enough to tell all the sinners of the world to love Mary. She is the ocean across which one must travel in order to reach Jesus." Above Padre Pio's door were the words: "Mary is the reason of all my hope."

5. Saint Padre Pio believed the love of God is inseparable from **suffering** and that suffering all things for the sake of God is the way for the soul to reach God. He who underwent so many sufferings provides us with very practical advises to keep in mind when the hour of trial strikes: "Have great confidence in God's goodness and mercy, and He will never abandon you; but don't neglect to embrace His holy cross because of this." And he adds: "Suffering, no matter how difficult it may be, when compared to the good that is accomplished, makes every pain a joy for the soul." And if "the good Lord wishes to prolong the hour of trial, do not complain and look for the reason; but remember always, that the children of Israel had to remain forty years in the desert before reaching the Promised Land." "The longer the trial to which God subjects you, the greater the goodness in comforting you during the time of the trial and in the exaltation after the combat."

I pray through the intercession of St. Padre Pio that we may be eager in our pursuit of true holiness after the example of the Redeemer. Today, let us also remember to pray for our Holy Father's visit to Tirana, Albania and for our fellow Albanian brothers and sisters.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ON SACRED MUSIC

The Order of the Mass is the fundamental and primary song of the liturgy. It forms the part of the Mass that is of the greatest importance, and therefore it should be sung ideally before any of the other parts of the Mass are sung. When the Order of the Mass is sung, the liturgy becomes most true to itself, and all else in the liturgy becomes more properly ordered.

The Proper of the Mass, comprising the chants of the third degree, form an integral, yet often overlooked part of the sung liturgy.

The Proper of the Mass consists of three processional chants and two chants between the Lectionary readings. These parts of the Mass, contained in the Roman Missal and Graduale Romanum, are unlike the Order of the Mass and the Ordinary of the Mass in that they are not fixed and unchanging from day to day, but change according to the liturgical calendar, and therefore are "proper" to particular liturgical celebrations: Entrance Antiphon, Responsorial Psalm, the Alleluia and its Verse, the Offertory Antiphon, and the Communion Antiphon.
