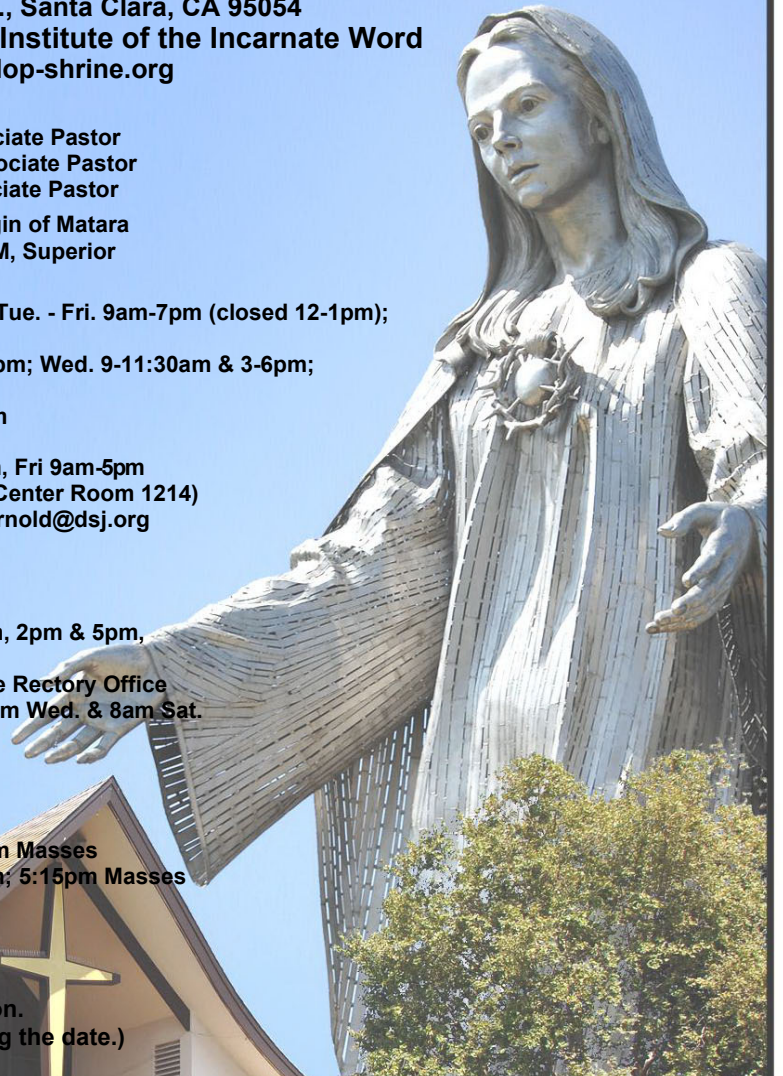

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

"Everyone knows John Paul II: his face, his characteristic way of moving and speaking; his immersion in prayer and his spontaneous cheerfulness. Many of his words have become indelibly engraved in our memories, starting with the passionate cry with which he introduced himself to the people at the beginning of his pontificate: 'Open wide the doors to Christ, and be not afraid of him!' Or this saying: 'No one can live a trial life; no one can love experimentally.' An entire pontificate is condensed in words like these. It is as though he would like to open the doors for Christ everywhere and wishes to open up to people the gate that leads to true life, to true love." (Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI)

This coming Wednesday (22nd) we will rejoice in the celebration of the memory of our most dear Saint John Paul II. We all know that his magisterium covered almost every aspect of human experience in the Church, and his teachings alone have earned him the title of John Paul the Great.

Now, St. John Paul II walked in our country seven times – once coming to California in 1987. I think his feast day gives us a good opportunity to re-read the homily (I recommend a full reading of the text) that he preached, not so far from our parish, at Candlestick Park in San Francisco on September 18, 1987, in which he explains what it means to be a Christian.

First, he says, it implies **acceptance of "the testimony of the apostles"** concerning the Crucified and Risen Christ...Christians then are those who have been baptized." And, he further explains: "Through baptism Christ comes to every person with the power of his Paschal Mystery. To accept Christ through baptism, to receive new life in the Holy Spirit – this is what it means to become a Christian. [...] However, "Baptism alone is not sufficient. The initial faith and the new life received in baptism, need to advance to fullness. After having begun to experience the mystery of Christ, his followers must develop their understanding of it. They must come to know better Jesus himself and the Kingdom; they must discover God's promises in the Scriptures, and learn the requirements and demands of the Gospel."

Second, "to be a Christian means **to go up to the mountain to which Christ leads us**. To enter into the temple of the living God that is formed in us and in our midst by the Holy Spirit. To be Christian means to continue to become Christian, learning from Christ the ways of the Lord so as to be able to *walk in his paths* (cf. Is: 2, 3). To be a Christian means to become one every day, ascending spiritually towards Christ and following Him. In fact, as we recall, when Christ first called those who were to become his disciples, He said to them: *Follow me*."

Third, to be a Christian means to **identify oneself with Christ**, "not only at Mass on Sunday –which is extremely important– but also in all the other activities of life." [...] "To be identified with Christ means that we must live according to God's word. As the Lord told his first disciples: *You will live in my love if you keep my commandments, even as I have kept my Father's commandments and live in his love* (Jn 15, 10)."

Such identification with Christ also includes becoming a *sign of contradiction*. [...] "In the face of many common evils, the Christian family that truly lives the truth of the Gospel in love is most certainly a sign of contradiction; and at the same time it is a source of great hope for those who are eager to do good."

Finally, Saint John Paul II concluded with a fervent exhortation for us all: "To be Christian also means to proclaim this message untiringly in every generation, in our generation, at the end of the second millennium and at the threshold of the third!"

May our Blessed Mother give us the grace to live and die as true Christians, always walking *in the light of the Lord*.

Frequently Asked Questions on Sacred Music ~ Church Music Association of America

Q: What are the characteristics of sacred music? (Part 2)

A: On the centenary of its promulgation, John Paul II urged us to revisit and learn from St. Pius X's *Motu Proprio* on Sacred Music, *Tra le sollecitudini* (1903). Pope Pius distinguished three characteristics of sacred music: "it must possess holiness and beauty of form: from these two qualities a third will spontaneously arise - universality" (§2).

Sacred music must be *true art*, says Pope Pius, "otherwise it will be impossible for it to exercise on the minds of those who listen to it that efficacy which the Church aims at obtaining in admitting into her liturgy the art of musical sounds." Beauty is what holds truth and goodness to their task. To paraphrase Hans Urs von Balthasar, without beauty, the truth does not persuade, goodness does not compel (*The Glory of the Lord: A Theological Aesthetics*, I: 19). *Beauty*, as expressed in the Church's liturgy, synthesizes diverse elements into a unified whole: truth, goodness, and the human impulse to worship. Concerning *universality*, sacred music is supra national, equally accessible to people of diverse cultures. The Church does admit local indigenous forms into her worship, but these must be subordinated to the general characteristics of the received tradition. By insisting on the continuous use of her musical treasures, especially chant, the Church ensures her members grow up hearing this sacred musical language and receive it naturally as a part of the liturgy. ~ to be continued next week...



**A Statement of Support by the California
Catholic Conference of Bishops for the
California Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act
(Proposition 47)**

"We will not tolerate the crime and violence that threatens the lives and dignity of our sisters and brothers, and we will not give up on those who have lost their way. We seek both justice and mercy. Working together, we believe our faith calls us to protect public safety, promote the common good, and restore community". - Responsibility, Rehabilitation, and Restoration: A Catholic Perspective on Crime and Criminal Justice – Statement of the Catholic Bishops of the United States, 2000

Despite years of effort, the criminal justice system in California remains desperately in need of significant reform. Victims are not receiving much needed assistance in healing, the State's over-crowded prisons are under Federal scrutiny, and rehabilitation programs barely exist in the State's prisons. An inconsistent patchwork of sentencing practices has been a major contributor to this unhealthy situation. So, too, failing schools and a woefully inadequate community mental health system are becoming merely preludes to prison. Incarceration does a miserable job of educating people and treating mental illness—but that has become the norm for California.

The *Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act* (Proposition 47)ii will provide educational support and treat mental illness where it can yield the best results for the communities of California. Prop 47 will eliminate the disparities in sentencing for certain non-violent crimes. It addresses prison overcrowding and sentencing discrepancies in constructive ways, and uses the savings for victims' assistance, mental health programs, public education, drug treatment, and inmate rehabilitation. This will make our communities safer.

All human life is sacred and, therefore, all social policies and actions in the realm of criminal justice – as with all of our individual and societal actions – must begin with respect for the life and dignity of the human person.

In the context of criminal justice, this means that we must first stand in solidarity with victims. When families are shattered, communities are ripped apart and lives are destroyed. We must seek healing and restoration to the fullest extent possible.

Victims and their families need to know that they are not alone

and that the resources of the Church and greater community are there to walk with them through their suffering and pain. We must also adequately fund programs to prevent crime. Protecting each of us from harm is among the most basic of government functions. The common good requires a safe, nourishing environment in which all members of society can flourish. It also demands that those who have broken society's trust are not considered lost but – while paying the price for their actions – are given an opportunity to once more become contributing members of society.

Simultaneously, we must work to eliminate the root causes of crime by recognizing the social value of having good schools and an effective community health system, including mental health.

Safe neighborhoods, dynamic educational institutions, and quality, accessible health care provides all of us with security, opportunity, and the chance to prosper together.

Finally, we must also acknowledge the contributions of the women and men who labor daily in the criminal justice system – from district attorneys, police and correctional officers to ministers and volunteers who bring spiritual care to victims and offenders. They are society's surrogates in a difficult environment and we owe them our thanks and our prayers for their dedicated service.

A debate on criminal justice practices is long-overdue in California and it requires thoughtful attention. Distilling complex realities to "soft" or "tough" on crime slogans ignores the fact that we are dealing with real human lives, with complicated social dynamics and with the need to balance accountability, justice and fairness in our justice system. Prisons do not make
