FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The Solemnity of All the Saints and the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, with which we begin this month of November dedicated to pray for All Souls, reminds us that the goal of our existence is not death; it is eternal life! It confronts us with what should be the most important concern of our life: to be holy in order to live with God forever in Heaven.

Our Lord says it explicitly this Sunday: *For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life.* (Jn 6:40)

This spiritual destination, to which all the baptized strive, is reached by following the way of the Gospel. It is the same path Jesus indicated and which all the Saints have striven to follow, while at the same time being aware of their human limitations. This path has a name and a face: the face of Jesus Christ, as Pope Francis likes to say.

Many times in our lives we are so absorbed by earthly things that we find it difficult to think about God as the protagonist of history and of our own existence, neither do we think of heaven as our true homeland. But pay attention to this: Holiness is a vocation for everyone. I'm sure you have read or heard this well-known saying of Mother Teresa on sanctity: "Holiness is not the luxury of the few. It is a simple duty for you and for me." And still we think of sanctity far away from our reach.

My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ: Holiness is attainable, above all, because it is God's work!

Not so long ago, Pope Francis had said, that the Saints who are the friends of God "are not supermen, nor were they born perfect." The Saints were people like each one of us. People who, before reaching the glory of heaven, lived normal lives with joys and sorrows, struggles and hopes. What changed their lives? When they recognized God's love, they followed it with all their heart without reserve or hypocrisy. They spent their lives serving others; they endured suffering and adversity without hatred and responded to evil with good, spreading joy and peace. This is the life of a Saint. Saints are people who for love of God did not put conditions on him in their life; they were not hypocrites; they spent their lives at the service of others. (Cf. *Angelus*, 2013)

They seemed, in the view of the foolish, to be dead; and their passing away was thought an affliction and their going forth from us, utter destruction. But they are in peace –says the first Reading for today– *...because God tried them and found them worthy of himself.* (Wis 3:2-3,5)

Saints are those "who do not place their security in material things but in love for God, for those who have a simple, humble heart that does not presume to be just and does not judge others, for those who know how to suffer with those who suffer and how to rejoice when others rejoice. They are not violent but merciful and strive to be instruments for reconciliation and peace. Saints, whether men or women are always helping people to become reconciled and helping to bring about peace. Thus holiness is beautiful, it is a beautiful path!" says the Holy Father.

Therefore, these two liturgical feasts give us a message. They tell us: trust in the Lord because the Lord does not disappoint! Through their witness, the Saints encourage us not be afraid of going against the tide, or of being misunderstood and mocked when we speak about Him and the Gospel. By their life they show us that, he who stays faithful to God and to his Word, experiences the comfort of his love on this earth and then a *hundredfold* in eternity. This is what we hope for and ask of the Lord, for our deceased brothers and sisters.

Let us pray for all the faithful departed, not only our own loved ones but also of all souls, especially those most forgotten and most in need of Divine Mercy. May the Virgin Mary, Queen of all the Saints, lead us towards our heavenly homeland.

Frequently Asked Questions on Sacred Music ~ Church Music Association of America

Q: What about "full, conscious, and active participation?"

A The participation of the faithful in the liturgy was a primary concern of the Council (*Sacrosanctum Concilium* ¶14). We need to distinguish two forms of participation: internal and external. Both are necessary for the full *actuosa participatio* of the human person because human beings are made up of both body and soul. The interior element is the "heart" of the matter, which finds expression in exterior action. One kind of external participation is singing. In his *Ad Limina* Address (October 1998), Pope John Paul II reminded U.S. bishops that "active participation does not preclude the active passivity of silence, stillness and listening: indeed, it demands it. Worshipers are not passive, for instance, when listening to the readings or the homily, or following the prayers of the celebrant, and the chants and music of the liturgy. These are experiences of silence and stillness, but they are in their own way profoundly active." The call for active participation in singing long predates the Council. In *Tra le sollecitudini*, Pope Pius X commends the active participation of the people in the public and solemn prayer of the Church. In his Encyclical on Sacred Liturgy, *Mediator Dei* (1947), Pope Pius XII praises congregational singing of liturgical chant as a means to "foster and promote the people's piety and intimate union with Christ" (¶106). ~ to be continued next week...

Afraid to Attend Mass on Game Days? **DO NOT STOP COMING** TO SUNDAY MASS AT OUR LADY OF PEACE

Dear Parishioners,

“The sense of the Church community is nourished and expressed in a particular way by the community celebration on Sunday.”

Dies Domini, 35.

With these words St. John Paul II invited us to make every effort to ensure a lively sense of community within the parish “in the first place through the *community celebration of Sunday Mass*.”(35) In short, this includes attendance at Mass and contributing of your gifts for God’s work.

Mass

Attending Mass in our community gives us a sense of belonging to this beautiful family of Our Lady of Peace. As many realized already (with the opening of the Levi’s® Stadium) many parishioners and visitors hesitate coming to our parish during game days in order to avoid traffic jams. This is understandable, however:

We need to admit that traffic isn’t that bad and it is actually smoother than what it was first expected. In addition, you have 10 Mass times to choose from—most of which are not impacted by traffic on game days. We have two Vigil Masses (Saturday 5pm & 7:30pm) and eight Masses on Sunday (7:30am, 9am, 10:30am, 12 noon, 2pm, 5pm, 6:30pm (Spanish), and 8pm).

This letter to you is my effort to reach out to all those whom we miss at Sunday mass. According to the Annual October Mass Count, we see an increase in attendance Saturday night and 7:30a.m. and about 300 people attend the 2pm, but we’ve also seen an average total decrease of 650 people. Are they attending Mass elsewhere or not attending Mass at all? **I encourage you and those you know to persevere and continue coming to pray with us.** Remember that you are part of Our Lady of Peace family and we count on you.

Solidarity and On-Line Giving

Furthermore, the Sunday Eucharistic gathering is an experience of brotherhood, where we are given the opportunity, not only to thank our Lord for the gifts we have received individually and as a community, but also, of sharing God’s gifts with others. Now, gift-giving is easier than ever.

To exercise your practical solidarity, we’ve added a convenient option for your Sunday offering. You can still use (ask for) weekly envelopes, but you can now also automate your gift-giving through checking account transfers or credit card donations. Either 1) set this up on-line at www.oloop-shrine.org, 2) talk to an office staff member for a registration form, or 3) sign up in person after all Masses Saturday, November 8 or Sunday November 9. Please continue to be as generous as you can.

As Pope Francis has said, “Faith is a gift and an act which concerns us personally, but God calls us to live with our faith together, as a family, as Church.” We invoke the maternal intercession of our Lady of Peace so that from Sunday to Sunday we may persevere in prayer and in our commitment to her Son at our parish community.

What is the Communion of the Saints?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that: "It is not merely by the title of example that we cherish the memory of those in heaven; we seek, rather, that by this devotion to the exercise of fraternal charity the union of the whole Church in the Spirit may be strengthened. Exactly as Christian communion among our fellow pilgrims brings us closer to Christ, so our communion with the saints joins us to Christ, from whom as from its fountain and head issues all grace, and the life of the People of God itself."

Communion with the dead. "In full consciousness of this communion of the whole Mystical Body of Jesus Christ, the Church in its pilgrim members, from the very earliest days of the Christian religion, has honored with great respect the memory of the dead; and 'because it is a holy and a wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be loosed from their sins' she offers her suffrages for them." Our prayer for them is capable not only of helping them, but also of making their intercession for us effective." (CCC # 957, 958)

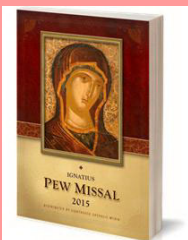
