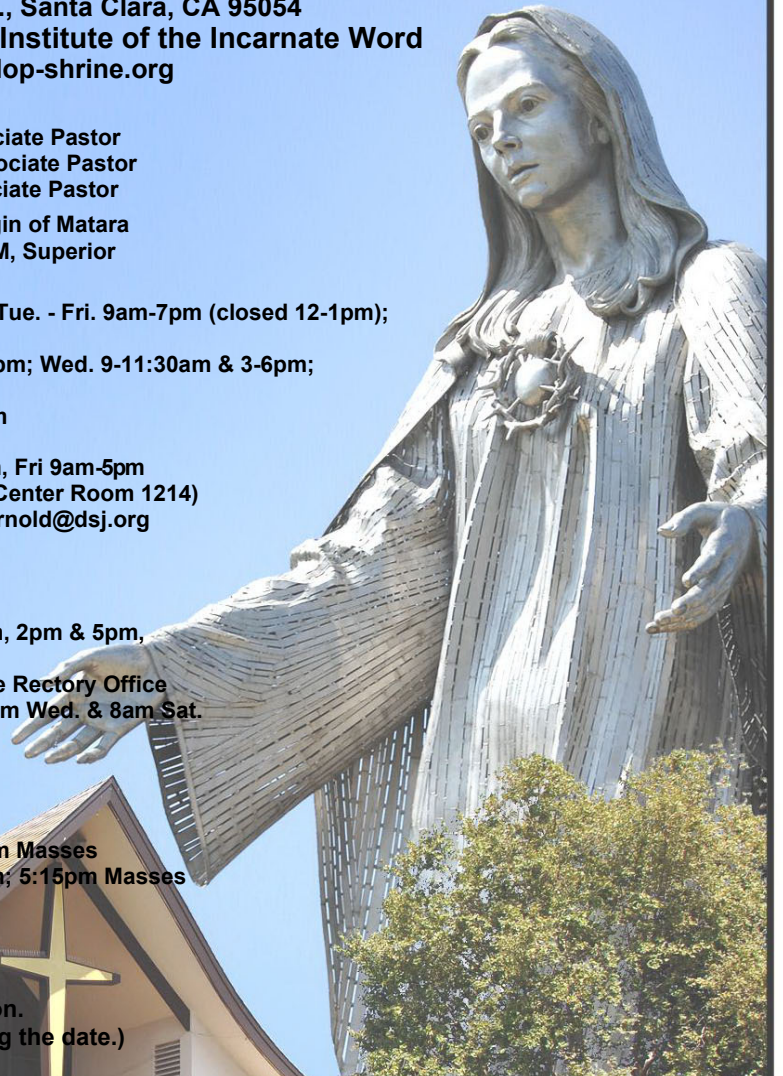

The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Today, the Church celebrates the feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. The Basilica of St. John Lateran is the cathedral of Rome. This is not St. Peter's, but it is the Pope's cathedral.

Actually, this Basilica was the first to be built after the Edict of the Emperor Constantine who, in 313, conceded to Christians the freedom to practice their religion. The dedication of the Basilica was celebrated by Pope Sylvester in about 324 and the temple was dedicated to the Most Holy Savior; only after the 6th century were the names of Sts. John the Baptist and John the Evangelist added, from which came its common name.

This feast became a universal celebration in honor of the basilica called "the mother and head of all churches of Rome and the world" (*omnium urbis et orbis ecclesiarum mater et caput*) as a sign of love for and union with the See of Peter "which", as St. Ignatius of Antioch affirms, "presides in charity" over the entire Catholic communion (cf. *Epistula ad Romanos*, 1, 1).

On this solemnity the readings recall an essential truth: the temple of stones is a symbol of the living Church, the Christian community, which in their letters the Apostles Peter and Paul already understood as a spiritual edifice, built by God with living stones, namely, Christians themselves, upon the one foundation of Jesus Christ, who is called the cornerstone (cf. 1 Cor 3:9-11, 16-17; 1 Pt 2:4-8; Eph 2:20-22). Brothers, you are God's building, St. Paul wrote, and added: holy is God's temple, which you are (1 Cor 3:9c, 17).

There are three simple teachings, which I'd like to point out to you today, inspired by the three features of the Basilica; its sheer size, its red columns and beautifully carved pilasters, and the gilded bronze pillars near the altar of the Blessed Sacrament.

First of all, is its size. Temples in the ancient world were very small and that's because people in the ancient world did not participate in worship. Instead, only the priest would enter the sanctuary to offer sacrifice. The people stood outside while the priest worshipped for them. So the idea that people would actually participate in worship was revolutionary. St. John Lateran was the first place built for public Christian worship in the City of Rome and as such it set the standard for all others. It taught them, and it teaches us, that the Mass is never something we watch like spectators but always something in which we participate. No one can do our prayer for us. Do you see why Jesus drove the money changers out of the temple? He didn't want a temple in which others offer purchased sacrifices; He wanted a new temple in which the presence of God dwells and those assembled are members of his body raised up.

The second lesson of St. John Lateran is in the Baptistry—it is the lesson of the red columns and beautifully carved pilasters. These were taken from other imperial monuments in Rome and used to build the baptistry. They didn't have to use things from other buildings. But they did so for a purpose, to teach a truth of faith. In baptism, that which was secular becomes sacred; that which was profane, is now profoundly incorporated into the body of Christ. That is the power of baptism. It changes all people and makes them new in Christ. The Church always has been a community of sinners seeking God's grace. The baptistry of St. John Lateran reminds us that no sin is greater than God's mercy, and that the waters of Baptism and the grace of Reconciliation continue to take what is secular and make it sacred. St. John Lateran teaches us that the Church is where we trust and celebrate God's all-powerful, unbounding, transforming mercy.

Lastly, the gilded bronze pillars near the altar of repose for the Blessed Sacrament. These pillars were given by Constantine to the Basilica of St. John Lateran to make a statement: a new day has dawned, a new chapter in world history is now opened, Christianity is no longer only a private, personal experience of faith; it is now a public witness to the point that "one cannot understand a Christian without this witness and this testimony." (Pope Francis) Those pillars are a statement to us today that we are to be courageously prophetic, and publicly vocal in our witness of faith.

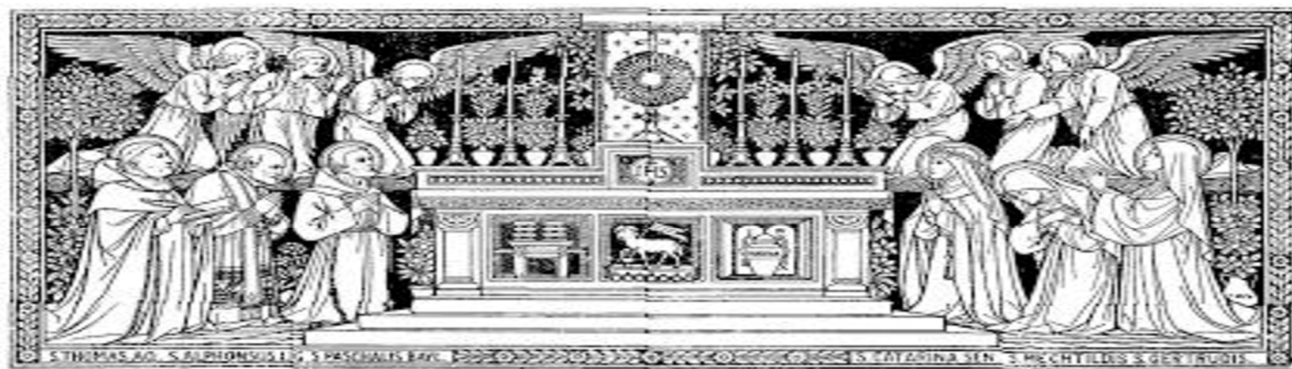

Frequently Asked Questions on Sacred Music ~ Church Music Association of America

Q: What is the sung Ordinary?

A: The Ordinary refers to the parts of the Mass that are generally repeated in each liturgy. These include the introductory and penitential rites, the Preface dialogue, the communion rite, and the concluding rites. The sung Ordinary refers to the five principal Ordinary chants, which are identified by their opening word(s): *Kyrie* (Lord have mercy), *Gloria* (Glory to God), *Credo* (Creed), *Sanctus* and *Benedictus* (Holy, holy), and *Agnus Dei* (Lamb of God). Traditional polyphonic Mass settings consist of these five movements. Modern vernacular Mass settings may include music for the Memorial Acclamation, Great Amen, and even the Our Father.

Q: What are the sung Propers?

A: The Propers refer to the parts of the Mass that change from liturgy to liturgy. There are five sung Propers: Introit, Gradual, Alleluia (or Tract), Offertory, and Communion. These chants can be found in the *Graduale Romanum* and *Gregorian Missal*, both published by the *Abbey Saint-Pierre de Solesmes*, the center for chant restoration in the 19th and 20th centuries.

Dear Parishioners,

This Financial Report is a summary of our Income and Expenses in the past Fiscal Year for the Parish. As you can see on the first line, our estimate of Sunday collections was met and we thank each of you for your consistency and loyalty. The parish is dependent on your weekly offering to maintain the current level of services. Thanks primarily to a large donation received this year from the estate of one of our dedicated parishioners who passed away, our net income was actually \$446,980 over budget. This blessing helps to fund extraordinary expenses due to Feast Day Celebrations and Outreach efforts as well as provide for any needed parish improvements.

As for expenses, we make every effort to control/manage our operating expenses which includes salaries but you will find that we did exceed budget by \$45,000 in the area of the Liturgy and liturgical celebrations. This was primarily due to the beautification of the church and grounds at Christmas time and our big celebration on Divine Mercy Sunday for the canonization of St. John Paul II to which over 4,000 people attended the outdoor Mass and witnessed the dedication of our new bronze statue.

Last of all, you will notice under "Outreach" an increase in Parish Programs for young adults (like Theology on Tap), spiritual retreats and other parish activities accounts. These successful programs will be repeated, God willing, this fiscal year to reach out spiritually to those in need.

The Finance Committee, together with the Pastoral Council, help the Pastor and Parish Administration be good stewards of your gifts of time, talent, and treasure. This report is provided to you for your reference so that you may know how your contributions are managed. Fiscal Year End Statement (many pages) has been submitted to the Diocese; contact the rectory office if you would like more information about this.

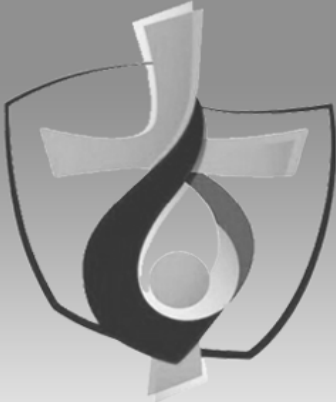

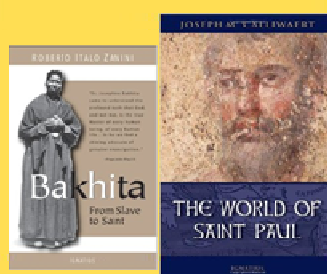

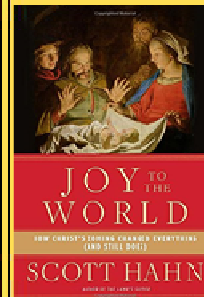

of the Catechumenate.**

You're invited to a pot-luck on Sunday, November 30, 2014 following the 12:00 noon Mass to meet the new members of the Catechumenate.

As inquirers into the Catholic Faith experience an initial conversion and begin to enter into a relationship with God in Christ, they publicly declare their intention to enter the Church. The Church formally accepts the inquirers into her midst as catechumens. This is done at the *Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens*.

The Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens is of the utmost importance because these individuals are assembling publicly for the first time to declare their intention to the Church and the Church in turn carrying out its apostolic mission, accepts them as persons who intend to become its members.

We also surround with special care and support those baptized inquirers as they prepare to be sealed with the gift of the Spirit in Confirmation and take their place at the Banquet Table of Christ's sacrifice. Bring a dish and meet in rooms 1101-1103 following the Mass, and welcome those who want to enter the Church.

The Family as First School of Human Virtues # 1

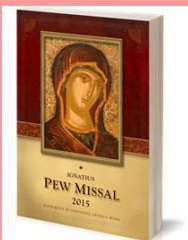
