Today We Celebrate

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

On this last Sunday of the liturgical year we are celebrating the Solemnity of Christ the King. Pope Pius XI, who instituted the feast of Christ the King (1925) wrote in his Encyclical Letter *Quas Primas*: "We firmly hope, however, that the feast of the Kingship of Christ, which in future will be yearly observed, may hasten the return of society to our loving Savior." (24)

Before the institution of this feast it was a common custom to refer to our Lord with the metaphorical title of "King," because of the high degree of perfection with which He excels all creatures. But our Lord is also called King because He is the King of hearts, too, by reason of his "charity which exceeds all knowledge." And his mercy and kindness which draw all men to Him, for never has it been known, nor will it ever be, that man be loved so much and so universally as Jesus Christ. (Cf. *ibid.*, 7)

However, we know from the Gospels that Jesus refused the title of king when it was meant in the political sense, by the standards of the *rulers of the Gentiles* (Mt 20: 25). But when He was asked by Pilate: *So you are a king?*, He answered, *You say that I am a king* (Jn 18: 37); although previously declaring, *My kingship is not of this world* (Jn 18: 36).

Today's Gospel insists on the universal kingship of Christ the Judge, with the stupendous parable of the Last Judgment, which St. Matthew placed immediately before the Passion narrative (25: 31-46). *When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with Him, He will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before Him. And He will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the king will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father.'* (Mt 25:31-34) Then our Lord enumerates the criteria for this judgment which is no other than the works of mercy.

Clearly, all of us expect that the Judge will condemn evil and impose sentence on the guilty. And we tend to think of evildoing as stepping over the line and infringing on the rights of others, taking their possessions, maybe even taking their lives. The problem with this understanding of sin is that it is incomplete, even shallow. Lots of people think that as long as they don't lie, cheat, and steal, but just keep to themselves and mind their own business, they deserve big rewards from God.

The story of the Last Judgment addresses these "decent folks." Imagine their shock as they swagger smugly up to the judge's bench expecting praise only to be sent off to eternal punishment! Why? Because they neglected to do the good love required them to do. They did not "commit" offenses or infractions of the law; they did nothing positively destructive. They just, in the presence of suffering, heartlessly did absolutely nothing. Their sins were not sins of "commission" but sins of "omission." But note—these sins of omission ultimately seal the fate of the damned.

There are lots of negative commandments, often expressed as "you shalt not's." But the two most important commandments are positive "you shalt's". *You shall love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, soul, and strength and you shall love thy neighbor as yourself.* These commandments require an interior disposition that issues in outward actions. If you truly love your hungry neighbor as yourself, you don't just say a prayer and offer sympathy (James 2:15-17). Loving God with all your heart doesn't mean giving a respectful nod to God and then going on your merry way. It means going out of your way, passionately seeking to love Him and serve Him in all that you do.

So ultimately, the judgment is simple and it all comes down to love, as St. John of the Cross said: "At the end of your life you will be judged on love."

May our Blessed Mother, who sits as Queen at the right of Christ the King, teach us and help us to make our Lord reign in our souls, in our desires, in our families, in all we do.

Frequently Asked Questions on Sacred Music ~ Church Music Association of America

Q: What is polyphony and what makes it especially suited to liturgy?

A: *Polyphony* literally means *many voices*. Polyphonic music has two or more voice parts that move independently (or *contrapuntally*) to weave a musical fabric. The term generally applies to sacred vocal music from the late Middle Ages through the Renaissance. Polyphonic music occasionally sounds chordal (or *homophonic*), but the contrapuntal style is generally distinguished from the homophonic style in its approach to harmony. In homophony, chords are presupposed, and voice parts are written chiefly to fit into a chord. In counterpoint, voice parts are written more as individual melodies, with chords resulting from the simultaneous tones of the independent lines. This emphasis on the individual vocal lines shows the influence of chant, from which polyphony grew organically.

The "golden age" of sacred polyphony lasted from about 1400 until 1650, but composers of later eras continued to favor the contrapuntal style, especially when writing for the church. Some of the most important composers are: Josquin Desprez (c. 1450-1521), Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina (1525-1594), Tomas Luis de Victoria (1548-1611), Thomas Tallis (c. 1505-1585), William Byrd (1543-1623). Many later composers were inspired by these Renaissance masters of polyphony. ~ to be continued next week...

Be King of those who are deceived by erroneous opinions, or whom discord keeps aloof, and call them back to the harbor of truth and the unity of faith, so that soon there may be but one flock and one Shepherd.

Grant, O Lord, to Thy Church assurance of freedom and immunity from harm; give tranquility of order to all nations; make the earth resound from pole to pole with one cry: Praise to the divine Heart that wrought our salvation; to It be glory and honor for ever! Amen.

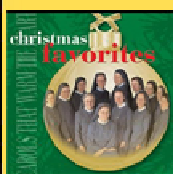

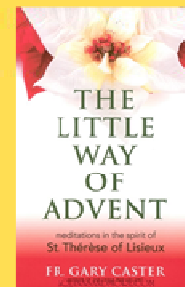

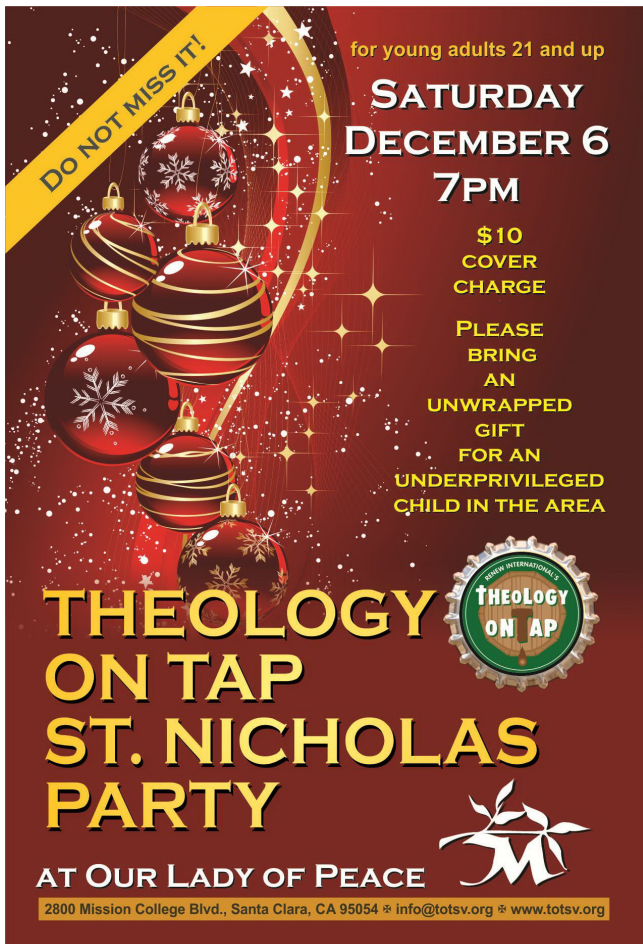

- Either fasting, giving alms, or offering a votive candle for the good of another (or all of the above) on the day of consecration; do some spiritual penance and approach consecration in a spirit of mortification.

A copy of the Act of Consecration will be provided to you in the Church which you will sign.
