Today We Celebrate Palm Sunday

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Christ became obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. (Phil 2:8) These words of the Gospel acclamation for this Palm Sunday set the tone for the Major Week of Christianity.

These days in which we focus on the crucifixion and death of our Blessed Lord on Calvary cannot actually be fully pondered unless we turn our gaze also to his Sorrowful Mother *who stood beneath the Cross*. It is as if we cannot proclaim Christ Crucified without thinking on His Compassionate Mother next to Him shedding silent tears of love.

Let us then enter into this Holy Week accompanying our Sorrowful Mother asking her to impress in our souls the manifold lessons of the mysteries we are going to reenact. Let this be also an opportunity to see God's love for us through the rent of her heart transfixed by the pain of seeing her only Son die on a cross. "Every torture inflicted on the body of Jesus," says St. Jerome, "was a wound in the heart of the Mother." St. Augustine assures us of the same thing: "The cross and nails of the Son were also those of His Mother; with Christ crucified the Mother was also crucified." So much so that, as Saint Bernardine writes, "At the same time that the Son sacrificed His body, the Mother sacrificed her soul."

The entire *mystery of the obedience of Christ to His Father* is revealed during his agony on the Cross. But at the same time, our Blessed Mother, "suffering grievously with her only-begotten Son and by lovingly consenting to the immolation of this Victim which she herself had brought forth" give us a magnificent and eloquent example of the obedience of faith. (Cf. St. John Paul II, *Homily*, 1987) *Although he was Son, he learned to obey through suffering* (Heb 5: 8), and together with Him, our Blessed Mother learned obedience too.

Certainly, the Crucifixion of our Lord was a heroic trial of Mary's incomparable faith. "Naturally speaking, our Lord's Divinity was never so obscured. Supernaturally speaking, it never was so manifest. Could it be possible that the Incarnate Word should be the subject to the excesses of such unparalleled indignities?" (Fr. Faber, 1857) Think what faith was hers!

In front of such a sorrowful mystery we can ask ourselves: Why did He suffer who had the power to escape the cross, and why did she suffer who could have been dispensed from it by her Son? St. John Paul II answered this question saying: "The mystery of the Cross on Golgotha and the mystery of the Cross in the heart of the Mother of the Crucified One cannot be read in any other way: only in the perspective of eternal Wisdom is this mystery clarified for our faith... For Wisdom also means Love." (*Homily*, 1984)

In other words, the key to this mystery is love. For it is the nature of love to seek not the good of its own but the good of others. Its greatest happiness is to serve. Its greatest sorrow is to be denied the joy of sacrifice for others. Thus, the Incarnate Word and his Sinless Mother suffered not because they have sinned but because *we* have sinned. And in doing so, One re-opened Heaven for us, and the other the gates of Compassion by becoming the "Refuge of Sinners," while our Lord told her: *Behold, your son*.

Practical conclusion: "True wisdom is not to be found in the things of this world nor in the souls of those who live in comfort. Our Lord has fixed his abode in the Cross so firmly that you will not find Him anywhere in this world save in the Cross. He has so truly incorporated and united Himself with the Cross that in all truth we can say: Wisdom is the Cross, and the Cross is Wisdom." (St. Louis de Montfort, *The Love of Eternal Wisdom*)

During this Holy Week as we follow the footsteps of our Lord in his Passion and of his Sorrowful Mother, may we be given the grace to understand the Wisdom of the Cross. May we become convinced that side by side with each of us, beneath our own cross, we have a loving Mother who has experienced sorrow and understands pain, and who, in her motherly love offers us the reassurance of loving care and personal concern for each of us.
