FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

In this month of May which we traditionally dedicate to our Blessed Mother, we have the immense joy to celebrate her on two prominent occasions: one of them will be the welcoming of our Lady of Luján to our parish on May 8th, and the other one will be the beginning of our Fatima Pilgrimage on the 13th.

Thus, I thought it would be opportune to share with you a little bit of the history of our Lady of Luján, in order to prepare our hearts better to draw more graces during her feast.

Our Lady of Luján is a terracotta image of Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception which is about 14 inches tall covered in an ornate blue and white dress and crowned as Queen. She also has a halo of twelve stars and the moon at her feet. Behind her, there are rays like the spikes of a wheel on an arch bearing the words: "You are the Virgin of Luján, the First Foundress of this Town" (*Es la Virgen de Luján, Primera Fondadora de este Villa*). It has been venerated in Argentina since 1630.

On that year, a Portuguese ranch owner saddened by the lack of religious influence in his adopted district, Sumampa, Santiago del Estero, asked a friend in Brazil to send him a small statue of Our Lady for his chapel. The friend, unsure of how the farmer wanted Our Lady to be depicted, sent two statues, one of the Madonna with Child, the other a representation of the Immaculate Conception.

Having been first transported by sea, the images were then placed on a cart for the journey inland. After three days of travel, the oxen pulling the statue's cart stopped moving near the Luján river about 42 miles northwest of Buenos Aires. After much failed coaxing, the ox driver unloaded the image of the Immaculate Conception and found the oxen would again move. The caravan took this as a sign that the Virgin Mary wanted the statue to be venerated at that place.

The statue of our Lady was taken off the cart, it was solemnly carried to the ranch of Don Rosendo de Oramus—where they had stopped to rest—and enthroned in a room of its own. This room soon became a popular shrine and remained so for the next 40 years. Many miracles have been attributed to Our Lady of Luján's intercession.

Noteworthy of mention is the fact that our Lady of Luján, has been honored in different ways by various Popes. For instance: Pope Leo XIII honored the statue in 1886 with a papal coronation. Pope Pius XI declared Our Lady of Luján to be the patroness of Argentina, Uruguay and Paraguay in 1930. In 1982, Pope John Paul II became the first pope to visit Our Lady of Luján in person and bestowed upon her the Golden Rose. Finally, our Lady of Luján was honored by our Holy Father Pope Francis, the first "son of Argentina" to follow in St. Peter's footsteps, when he offered her flowers and "placed all the joys and worries in the hands of the Most Holy Virgin." (Cf. *General Audience*, May 8, 2013)

The IVE's Founder, Fr. Carlos Buela, in his book *Maria de Luján*, tells us that our Lady's folded hands remind us that in heaven she is fulfilling that main task she was given, which was also hers here on earth. and This is the office of interceding for us, of praying for us.

Certainly, our Lady doesn't have the omnipotence of the divine nature—explains Fr. Buela—because hers is a human nature, but she does have a very particular form of omnipotence which is the "omnipotence of intercession," it is the omnipotence of the one who attains always what she asks for.

Therefore, I encourage all of you to take part in the celebration of our Lady of Luján as an opportunity to renew our hope and confidence in the maternal intercession of the Mother of God and ask her many graces for you and indeed, for everyone in need. Praying for others is a great work of mercy. Remember that.

Pope Pius X ~ Motu Proprio promulgated on November 22, 1903

I General principles

2. Sacred music should consequently possess, in the highest degree, the qualities proper to the liturgy, and in particular sanctity and goodness of form, which will spontaneously produce the final quality of universality.

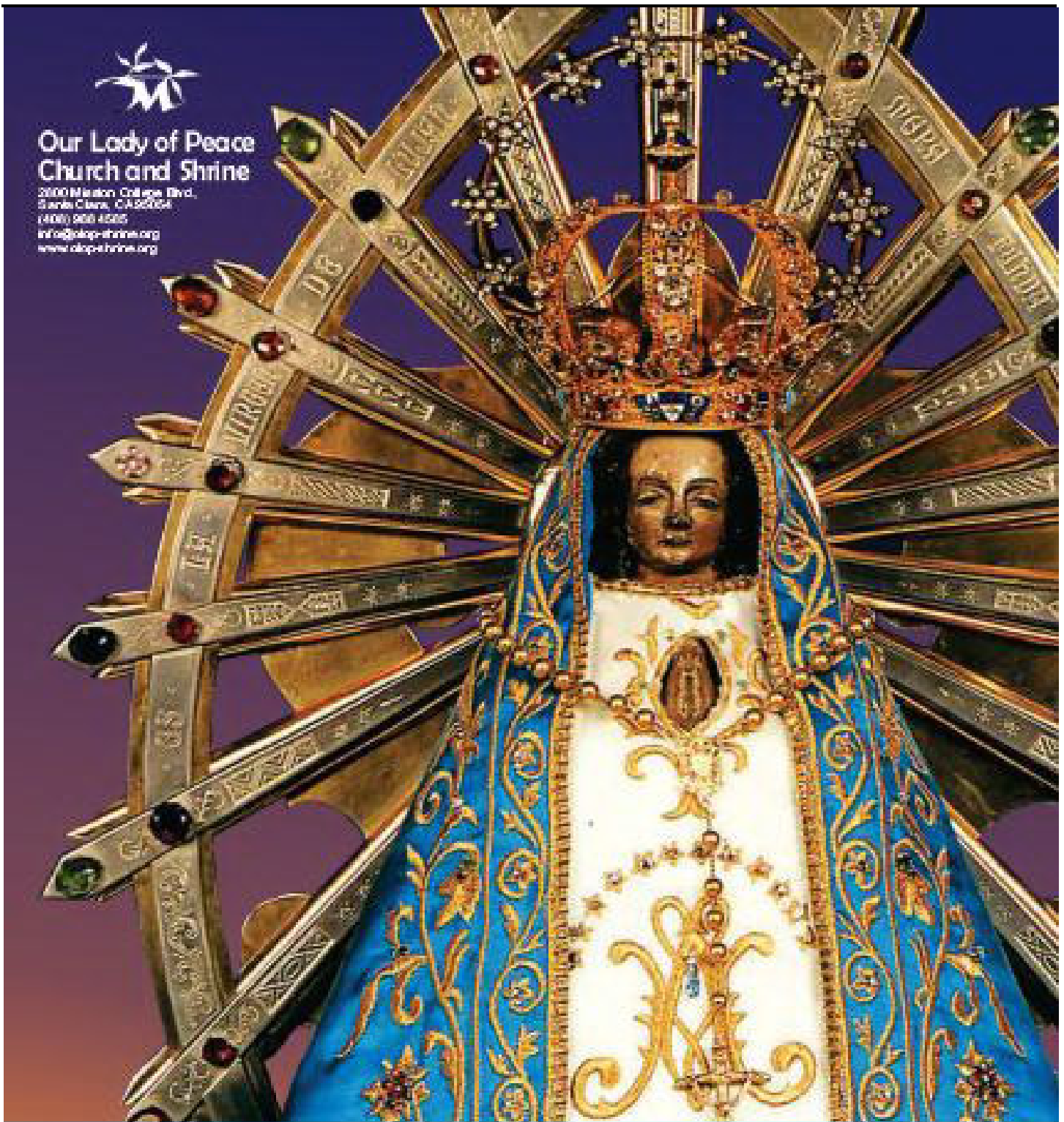
It must be true art, for otherwise it will be impossible for it to exercise on the minds of those who listen to it that efficacy which the Church aims at obtaining in admitting into her liturgy the art of musical sounds.

But it must, at the same time, be universal in the sense that while every nation is permitted to admit into its ecclesiastical compositions those special forms which may be said to constitute its native music, still these forms must be subordinated in such a manner to the general characteristics of sacred music that nobody of any nation may receive an impression other than good on hearing them. *To be continued next week....*

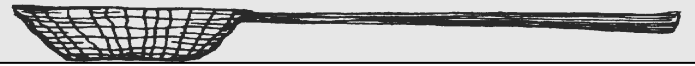

A Note from the Bishop

My Dear People,

We have received news today that one of our priests, Monsignor Hien Minh Nguyen, has been arrested on charges of bank fraud and tax evasion. The Diocese has been cooperating with an ongoing criminal investigation by the Internal Revenue Service into the conduct of Monsignor Hien since October of 2012.

Any facts in the matter are the part of the investigation, and only the IRS has the authority to make disclosures at a time of its choosing. We do not know when that might be. At the request of the IRS, we have had minimal direct communication with Monsignor Hien. He is on a personal leave of absence, which he requested.

I would be grateful if you would keep all involved in your prayers at this time.

"These (the monks) began to ask one another for what purpose Brother Barnaby could be indulging so persistently in retreat.

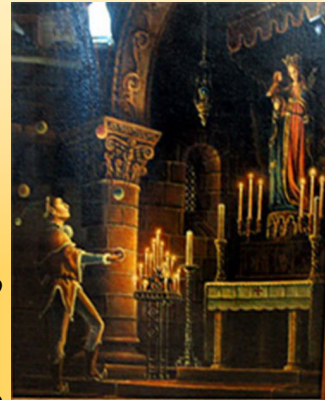
