Today We Celebrate the Most Holy Trinity Sunday

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Belief in the Trinity –one God who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit– is a distinctive mark of the Christian Faith. In this setting the liturgy gives us the opportunity to read the Letter of St. Paul to the Romans where he says: *For those who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you received a Spirit of adoption, through whom we cry, "Abba, Father!"* (Rom 8:14-17)

You see? We are taught to address God with the affectionate words that children use, calling Him: *Abba, Father*. Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI in one of his General Audiences (05/23/12) thoughtfully explained the implication of this.

First, he says, Jesus did the same thing and "even in the most dramatic moment of his earthly life He never lost his trust in the Father and always called on Him with the intimacy of the beloved Son." For instance in Gethsemane, Jesus' prayer was: *Abba, Father, all things are possible to you; remove this cup from me; yet not what I will, but what you will* (Mk 14:36).

Second, "the Church has taken up this invocation and made it her own, especially in the prayer of the Our Father, which we say every day," said the Pope.

Third, we find it twice in the Letters of St Paul. One is the one above mentioned and the other is his letter to the Galatians: *And because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, 'Abba! Father!'* (Gal 4:6).

And then, Pope Benedict powerfully states: "Christianity is not a religion of fear but of **trust** and of **love** for the Father who loves us. Both, the sending forth and the reception of the Holy Spirit, are a gift of the Risen One which makes us sons in Christ, and places us in a filial relationship with God, a relationship of **deep trust**, like that of children; a filial relationship like that of Jesus, even though its origin and quality are different. Jesus is the eternal Son of God who took flesh; we instead become sons in Him, in time, through **faith** and through the **sacraments** of Baptism and Confirmation. Thanks to these two sacraments we are immersed in the Paschal Mystery of Christ. The Holy Spirit is the precious and necessary gift that makes us children of God, that brings about that adoption as sons to which all human beings are called because, as the divine blessing in the Letter to the Ephesians explains, God, in Christ, *chose us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him. He destined us in love to be his [adopted] sons through Jesus Christ* (Eph 1:4)."

Let us notice then that in the Letter to the Galatians, St. Paul says that the Spirit cries: *Abba! Father!* in us, and that in the Letter to the Romans we are the ones who cry: *Abba! Father!* The Holy Father explained that "St. Paul wants to make us understand that Christian prayer is never one way, never happens in one direction from us to God, it is never merely 'an action of ours' but, rather, is the expression of a reciprocal relationship in which God is the first to act; it is the Holy Spirit who cries in us and we are able to cry because the impetus comes from the Holy Spirit."

And in doing so, I mean, as we pray addressing the Father in the silence and recollection of our inner room we are never alone. "Those who speak to God are not alone," said the Holy Father.

May today's celebration of the Mystery of God help us to savor in our prayers the beauty of being children of God, of being able to call on Him with the trust that a child has for the parents who love him. Bl. Elizabeth of the Trinity who lived this mystery so profoundly once wrote: "I confide to you a secret which has made my life on earth an anticipated Heaven: the belief that a Being Whose name is Love is dwelling within us at every moment of the day and night, and that He asks us to live in His company."

Pope Benedict XVI on Sacred Music ~ The Primacy of Singing

Development in Sacred Music

"An authentic updating of sacred music can take place only in the lineage of the great tradition of the past, of Gregorian chant and sacred polyphony." [Speaking in the Sistine Chapel following a tribute concert to Dominico Bartolucci, June 24, 2006.]

The singing of the Church comes ultimately out of love. It is the utter depth of love that produces the singing. "Cantare amantis est", says St. Augustine, singing is a lover's thing. In so saying, we come again to the trinitarian interpretation of Church music. The Holy Spirit is love, and it is he who produces the singing. He is the Spirit of Christ, the Spirit who draws us into love for Christ and so leads to the Father. [TSL, (SF, CA: Ignatius, 2000), p. 142]
