FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

As we come to the closing day of our Parish Mission 2015 I am overjoyed for having been a witness of so many graces which the Lord has deigned to bestow upon the Family of Our Lady of Peace during these days. Graces which I have seen reflected in the countless sacraments administered, in the overflowing joy of the faces of so many of you and by the great participation we've had.

Although my words may fall short, I must express my deepest and sincere gratitude to all the IVE missionaries, lay missionaries, and volunteers who served in various missionary tasks with great sacrifice and enthusiasm. And of course, I *Thank You!* For coming each day, for bringing others along with you, for being the channel that allowed so many to receive God's grace and share in the very life of Christ, and for all your prayers and work behind the scenes that so many times goes unnoticed.

To all of you I offer the consoling words of the Gospel: *whoever brings back a sinner from the error of his way will save his soul from death and will cover a multitude of sins* (James 5:20); and *truly I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren you did it to me* (Mt 25:40). May our Blessed Lord reward and bless you all!

Now, as we continue to pray for the ongoing fruits of our first parish mission, this coming Wednesday (June 24) we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, a great missionary too.

John the Baptist began his preaching under the Emperor Tiberius in about 27-28 A.D., and the unambiguous invitation he addressed to the people, who flocked to listen to him, was to prepare the way to welcome the Lord, to straighten the crooked paths of their lives through a radical conversion of heart (cf. Lk 3:4).

However, —Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI points out— “John the Baptist did not limit himself to teaching repentance or conversion. Instead, in recognizing Jesus as the *Lamb of God* who came to *take away the sin of the world* (Jn 1:29), he had the profound humility to hold up Jesus as the One sent by God, drawing back so that He might take the lead, and be heard and followed.” To the point that in the last act of his life the Baptist witnessed with his blood to faithfulness to God's commandments, without giving in or withdrawing, carrying out his mission to the very end.

Contemplating his figure, we must wonder: what gave birth to this life, to this interiority so strong, so upright, so consistent, spent so totally for God in preparing the way for Jesus? The answer is simple: it was born from the relationship with God, from prayer, which was the thread that guided him throughout his existence.

John was the divine gift for which his parents Zechariah and Elizabeth had been praying for so many years; a great gift, humanly impossible to hope for, because they were both advanced in years and Elizabeth was barren; yet nothing is impossible to God. The announcement of this birth happened precisely in the place of prayer, in the temple of Jerusalem, indeed it happened when Zechariah had the great privilege of entering the holiest place in the temple to offer incense to the Lord (cf. Lk 1:8-20). John the Baptist's birth was also marked by prayer: the *Benedictus*, the hymn of joy, praise and thanksgiving which Zechariah raises to the Lord and which we recite every morning in Lauds, exalts God's action in history and prophetically indicates the mission of their son John: to go before the Son of God made flesh to prepare his ways. (Cf. Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, 2012)

Today, in which we celebrate Father's Day, you fathers know too well how challenging and demanding fatherhood can be, how much tenderness, and how much strength is needed. Therefore, within the framework of preparation for the Nativity of St. John the Baptist I'd like to offer you the following thought: Prayer is not time wasted, it does not take away time from our activities, even apostolic activities, but exactly the opposite is true: only if we are able to have a faithful, constant and trusting life of prayer will God himself give us the ability and strength to live happily and serenely, to surmount difficulties and to witness courageously to Him.

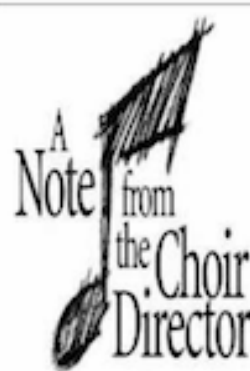

What are the characteristics of sacred music?

On the centenary of its promulgation, John Paul II urged us to revisit and learn from St. Pius X's letter motu proprio on Sacred Music, *Tra le sollecitudini* (1903). Pope Pius distinguished three characteristics of sacred music: "it must possess holiness and beauty of form: from these two qualities a third will spontaneously arise — universality" (§2).

Concerning *holiness*, for music to be sacred means it is not the ordinary, not the every-day. It is set aside for the purpose of glorifying God and edifying and sanctifying the faithful. It must therefore exclude all that is not suitable for the temple — all that is ordinary, every-day or profane, not only in itself, but also in the manner in which it is performed. The sacred words of the Liturgy call for a sonic vesture that is equally sacred. Sacredness, then, is more than individual piety; it is an objective reality.

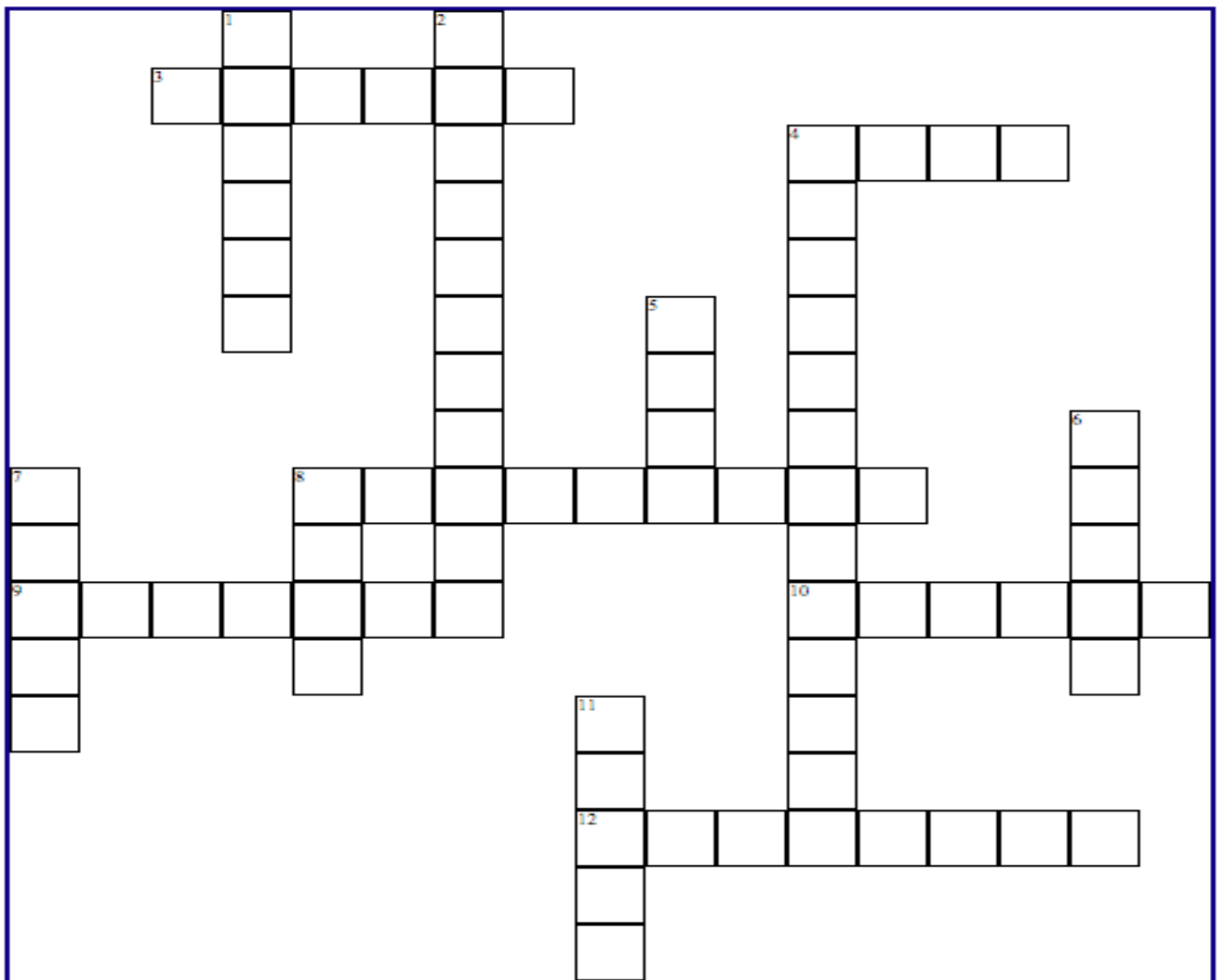
