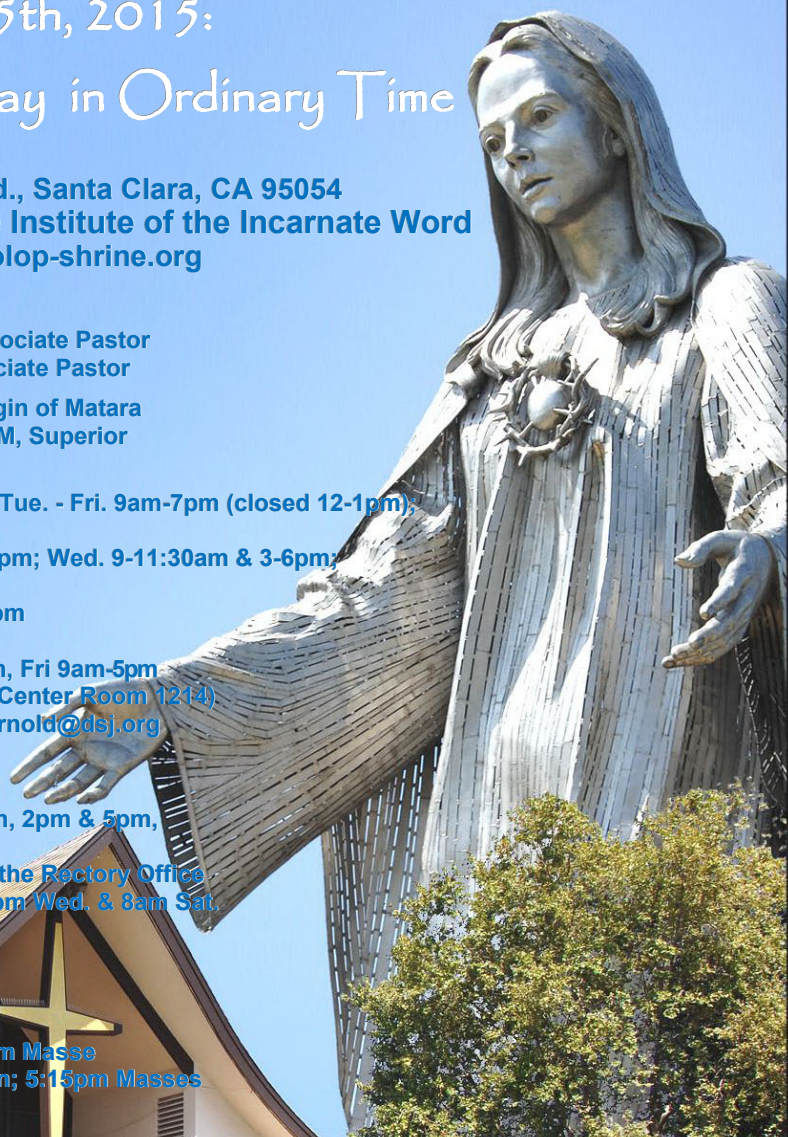

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

"It is very important to reaffirm the family, which remains the essential cell of society."

(Pope Francis, *World Youth Day*, July 2013)

Our parish is very blessed to count among its members beautiful families who Sunday after Sunday come to pray with the most beautiful fruit of their love: their children. Therefore, during these months of summer I'd like to dedicate this space to share some reflections and commentaries on John Paul II's Apostolic Exhortation *Familiaris Consortio*. And I do so, as a way to show my love, concern and support to all the families, especially those tried by hardships of any kind and those families who in spite of many trials give a great testimony of faith. It is my desire that our families will be ever strong and true cradles of faith and love.

Written in 1981 to address the question of the human family and marriage, *Familiaris Consortio* (The Role of the Christian Family in the Modern World) serves as a summary of the Church's teachings on the nature and role of the Christian family and the sacrament of marriage. Its publication marks one of the most significant episodes in the Church's teaching on marriage and family and can serve as the central source of insight and growth for all of us today. The whole papal letter is composed of an introduction and four main parts.

The introduction states the purpose intended by the Church with the publication of this Apostolic Exhortation: "to speak and offer her help to those who are already aware of the value of marriage and the family and seek to live it faithfully, to those who are uncertain and anxious and searching for the truth, and to those who are unjustly impeded from living freely their family lives." "Knowing that marriage and the family constitute one of the most precious of human values," and "at a moment of history in which the family is the object of numerous forces that seek to destroy it or in some way to deform it, and aware that the well-being of society and her own good are intimately tied to the good of the family, the Church perceives in a more urgent and compelling way her mission of proclaiming to all people the *plan of God for marriage and the family*, ensuring their full vitality and human and Christian development, and thus contributing to the renewal of society and of the People of God." In the first section, "Bright Spots and Shadows for the Family Today," the Apostolic Exhortation addresses the need to take up the question of marriage in the light of the Church's teaching, especially as our contemporary culture poses so many difficult questions to the modern Christian.

Looking at the cultural dimension of the context there are both good and bad factors to note. Positive aspects include a greater attention to the dignity of women, to the quality of interpersonal relationship in marriage and to responsible procreation and education of children. Negative aspects include lack of spousal interdependence, problems between parents and children, divorce, purely civil marriages, abortion, sterilization and a "truly contraceptive mentality." (Cf. 6)

"At the root of these negative phenomena there frequently lies a corruption of the idea and the experience of freedom, conceived not as a capacity for realizing the truth of God's plan for marriage and the family, but as an autonomous power of self-affirmation, often against others, for one's own selfish well-being." (6)

How do we have to respond to that? "We must all set ourselves in opposition through a conversion of mind and heart, following Christ Crucified by denying our own selfishness." [...] "What is needed is a continuous, permanent conversion which, while requiring an interior detachment from every evil and an adherence to good in its fullness, is brought about concretely in steps which lead us ever forward." (9)

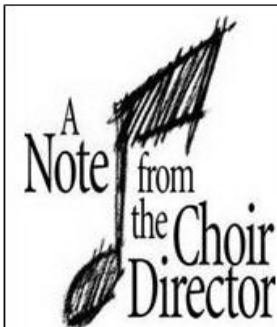

What are the characteristics of sacred music?

On the centenary of its promulgation, John Paul II urged us to revisit and learn from St. Pius X's letter *motu proprio* on Sacred Music, *Tra le sollecitudini* (1903). Pope Pius distinguished three characteristics of sacred music: "it must possess holiness and beauty of form: from these two qualities a third will spontaneously arise — universality" (§2).

Sacred music must be *true art*, says Pope Pius, "otherwise it will be impossible for it to exercise on the minds of those who listen to it that efficacy which the Church aims at obtaining in admitting into her liturgy the art of musical sounds." Beauty is what holds truth and goodness to their task. To paraphrase Hans Urs von Balthasar, without beauty, the truth does not persuade, goodness does not compel (*The Glory of the Lord: A Theological Aesthetics*, I: 19). Beauty, as expressed in the Church's liturgy, synthesizes diverse elements into a unified whole: truth, goodness, and the human impulse to worship. <http://musicasacra.com/about-cmaa/jaq/>
