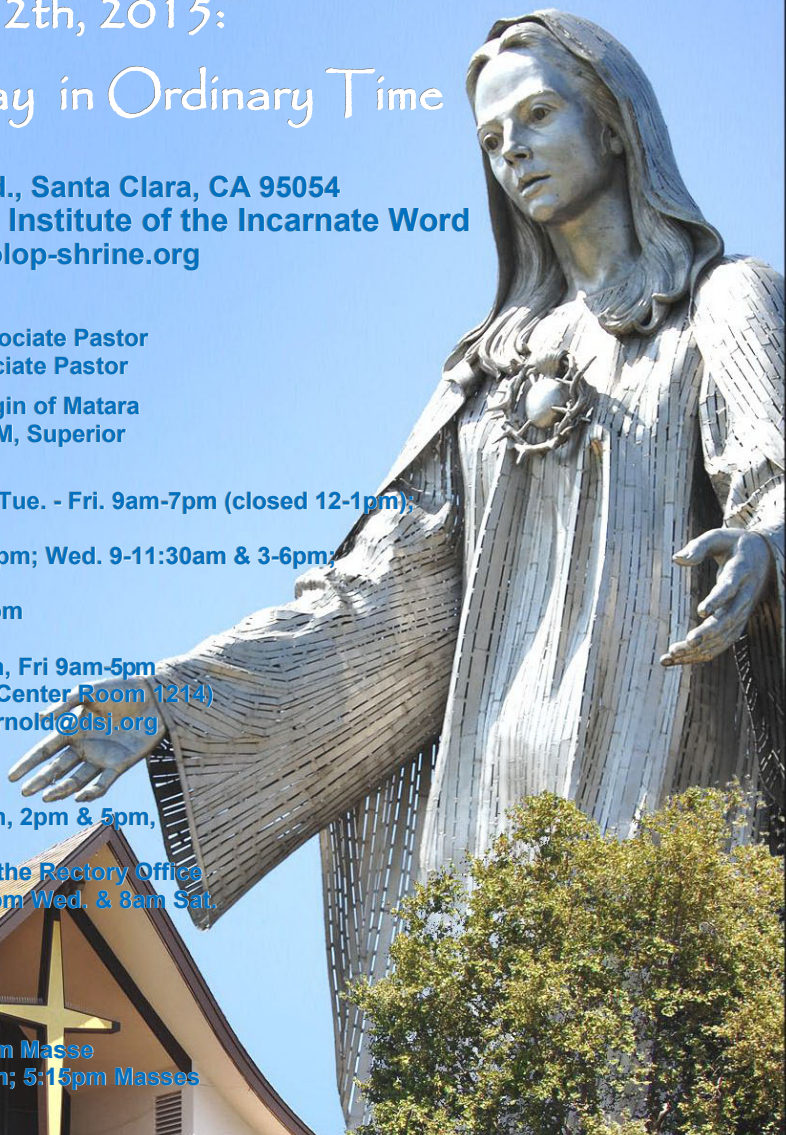

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

In the second part of his Apostolic Exhortation *Familiaris Consortio*, St. John Paul II discusses "The plan of God for marriage and the family" and starts out with these powerful words: "God inscribed in the humanity of man and woman the vocation, and thus the capacity and responsibility, of love and communion. Love is therefore the fundamental and innate vocation of every human being."

This vocation can be fulfilled in two specific ways: through marriage and through virginity or celibacy. Both, therefore, are an actuation, each in its own way, of the most profound truth of man and of his being created in the image of God (cf. 11)

"Consequently," explains the Pope, "sexuality, by means of which man and woman give themselves to one another through the acts which are proper and exclusive to spouses, is by no means something purely biological, but concerns the innermost being of the human person as such."

Later on, in his Letter to Families, the Holy Pontiff will go on explaining that "the family originates in a marital communion described as a covenant, in which man and woman give themselves to each other and accept each other." (7)

We cannot consider marriage and the family as a mere product of historical circumstances or a superstructure imposed from outside on human love. On the contrary, they are *an inner need of this love* to fulfil itself in its own truth and in the fullness of the reciprocal gift of self.

Accordingly, even those features of spousal union that today are all too often misunderstood or rejected, such as unity, indissolubility and openness to life, are instead requests for the authenticity of the covenant of love. It is in this very way that the bond which unites the spouses becomes an image and symbol of the covenant between God and his People, which finds its definitive fulfilment in Jesus Christ. Therefore, among the baptized marriage is a sacrament, an effective sign of grace and salvation. (Cf. *Address*, 02/26/14)

One of the key phrases of this section, I think is this one: "The only 'place' in which this self-giving in its whole truth is made possible is marriage, the covenant of conjugal love freely and consciously chosen, whereby man and woman accept the intimate community of life and love willed by God Himself which only in this light manifests its true meaning."

Unfortunately, many Catholics often times fall into the trap of thinking about the sacrament of marriage as something outwardly imposed. However, St. John Paul II says: "The institution of marriage is not an undue interference by society or authority, nor the extrinsic imposition of a form. Rather it is an *interior requirement* of the covenant of conjugal love which is publicly affirmed as unique and exclusive, in order to live in complete fidelity to the plan of God, the Creator. A person's freedom, far from being restricted by this fidelity, is secured against every form of subjectivism or relativism and is made a sharer in creative Wisdom." (11)

A couple of years ago, in 2013, our Holy Father Pope Francis, paraphrasing the teaching of his predecessor made the following remarks: "*The family is founded on marriage*. Through their free and faithful act of love, Christian spouses testify to the fact that marriage, insofar as it is a sacrament, is the foundation of the family and strengthens spousal union and the couple's mutual gift of self. (...) Spousal and familial love also clearly reveals the vocation of the person to love in a unique way and forever, and that the trials, sacrifices and crises of couples as well as of the family as a whole represent pathways for growth in goodness, truth and beauty. In marriage we give ourselves completely without calculation or reserve, sharing everything, gifts and hardship, trusting in God's Providence. (...) It is an experience of faith in God and of mutual trust, profound freedom and holiness, because holiness presumes giving oneself with fidelity and sacrifice every day of one's life!"

What are the characteristics of sacred music?

On the centenary of its promulgation, John Paul II urged us to revisit and learn from St. Pius X's letter motu proprio on Sacred Music, *Tra le sollecitudini* (1903). Pope Pius distinguished three characteristics of sacred music: "it must possess holiness and beauty of form: from these two qualities a third will spontaneously arise — universality" (§2).

Concerning *universality*, sacred music is supra-national, equally accessible to people of diverse cultures. The Church does admit local indigenous forms into her worship, but these must be subordinated to the general characteristics of the received tradition. By insisting on the continuous use of her musical treasures, especially chant, the Church ensures her members grow up hearing this sacred musical language and receive it naturally as a part of the liturgy. <http://musicasacra.com/about-cmaa/faq/>
