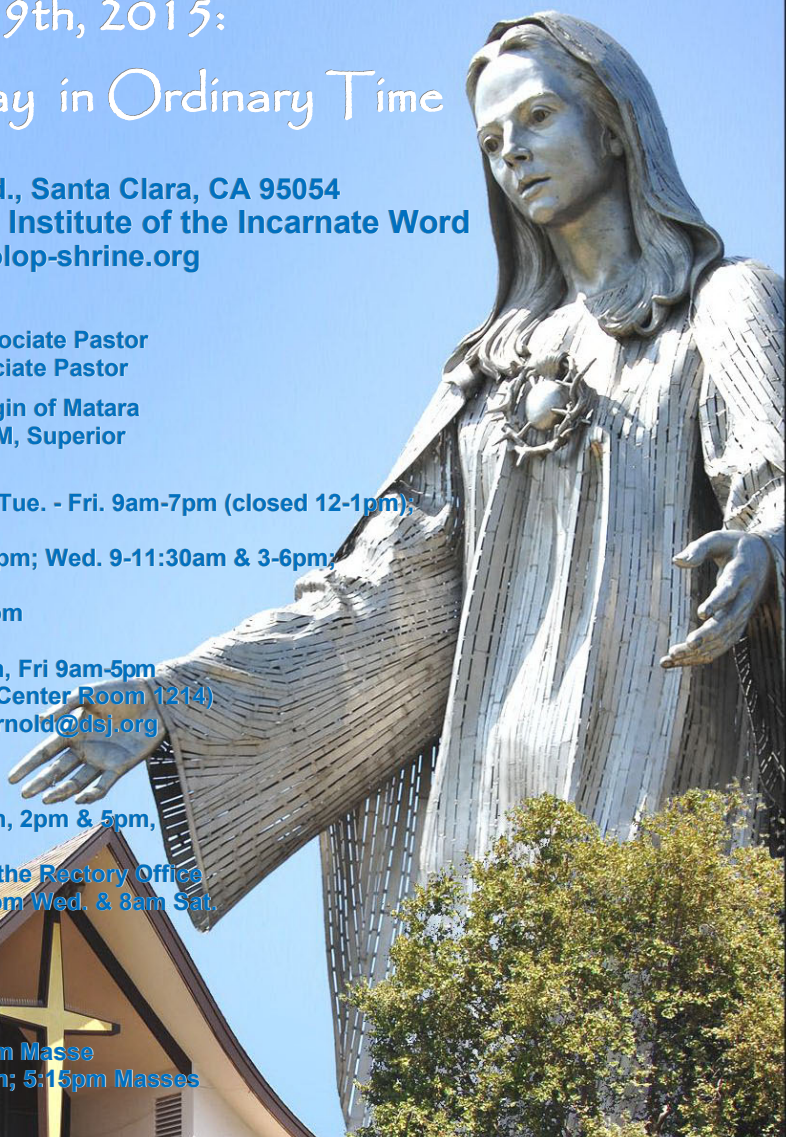

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Archbishop Fulton Sheen had this fantastic way of answering the question 'What is the Church?' He says: "The Church in the New Testament is described as the New Eve because [of] the continuation of the New Adam, Christ. Everywhere there is the idea of espousal, body, oneness, and we must get first things first. Remember, that the union of Our Lord and the Church is not like a human marriage; rather, a human marriage is like the union of Our Lord and the Church. When, therefore, the bride and groom stand at the altar and we read to them the marriage ceremony, we are informing them: "You, the bridegroom, stand for Christ. And you, the bride, stand for the Church."

I mentioned this because continuing with *Familiaris Consortio's* II Part, St. John Paul II discusses precisely that: Jesus Christ, Bridegroom of the Church, and the Sacrament of Matrimony. There are two words that continually show up when speaking about the spousal relationship between Christ and his Church: sacrifice and love.

JPII says: "The original truth of marriage, the truth of the *beginning*," is revealed in its "fullness in the **gift of love** which the Word of God makes to humanity in assuming a human nature, and in **the sacrifice** which Jesus Christ makes of Himself on the Cross for His bride, the Church." (Cf. 13)

Now, here it seems opportune to remember the teaching of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI: that "truth of the marriage" loses its existential importance if it is regarded as a mere social formalization of emotional ties. In this sense, St. John Paul II emphasizes that the indissolubility of marriage "does not derive from the definitive commitment of those who contract it but is *intrinsic* in the nature of the powerful bond established by the Creator." (*General Audience*, 11/21/1979)

Having clarified that, then the Holy Father reminds us of a simple truth: the Sacrament of Matrimony is one of the seven sacraments and "by virtue of the sacramentality of their marriage, spouses are bound to one another in the most profoundly indissoluble manner. Their belonging to each other is the real representation, by means of the sacramental sign, of the very relationship of Christ with the Church." (13)

"Spouses are therefore the permanent reminder to the Church of what happened on the Cross; they are for one another and for the children witnesses to the salvation in which the sacrament makes them sharers." And this implies sacrificial love.

"Conjugal love," continues the Holy Father, "involves a totality, in which all the elements of the person enter – appeal of the body and instinct, power of feeling and affectivity, aspiration of the spirit and of will. It aims at a deeply personal unity, the unity that, beyond union in one flesh, leads to forming one heart and soul; it demands indissolubility and faithfulness in definitive mutual giving; and it is open to fertility (cf. *Humanae Vitae*, 9). In a word it is a question of the normal characteristics of all natural conjugal love, but with a new significance which not only purifies and strengthens them, but raises them to the extent of making them the expression of specifically Christian values."

Last year, Pope Francis in his homily at the wedding celebration of twenty couples of Rome has said: "Marriage is a symbol of life, real life: it is not 'fiction'" and "the path is not always a smooth one, free of disagreements, otherwise it would not be human." Rather, "here we see the reciprocity of differences. It is a demanding journey, at times difficult, and at times turbulent, but such is life." With regard to conflicts, for the Pope, "it is normal for husband and wife to argue: it's normal. It always happens. But my advice is this: never let the day end without having first made peace. Never! A small gesture is sufficient. Thus the journey may continue."

We pray very specially for all our married parishioners, for the newlyweds and those who are preparing to embark in such journey. Let's always remember that love implies sacrifice and that "there will be crosses! But the Lord is always there to help us move forward!" (Pope Francis, 09/14/14)

What is polyphony and what makes it especially suited to liturgy?

Polyphony literally means *many voices*. Polyphonic music has two or more voice parts that move independently (or *contrapuntally*) to weave a musical fabric. The term generally applies to sacred vocal music from the late Middle Ages through the Renaissance. Polyphonic music occasionally sounds chordal (or *homophonic*), but the contrapuntal style is generally distinguished from the homophonic style in its approach to harmony. In homophony, chords are presupposed, and voice parts are written chiefly to fit into a chord. In counterpoint, voice parts are written more as individual melodies, with chords resulting from the simultaneous tones of the independent lines. This emphasis on the individual vocal lines shows the influence of chant, from which polyphony grew organically.

The "golden age" of sacred polyphony lasted from about 1400 until 1650, but composers of later eras continued to favor the contrapuntal style, especially when writing for the church.

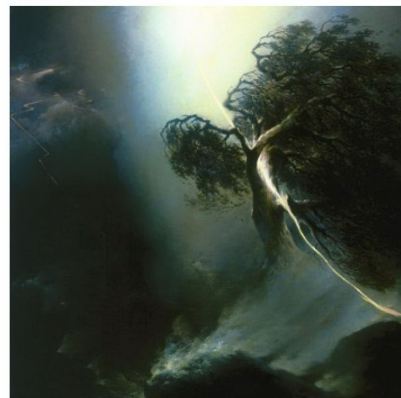

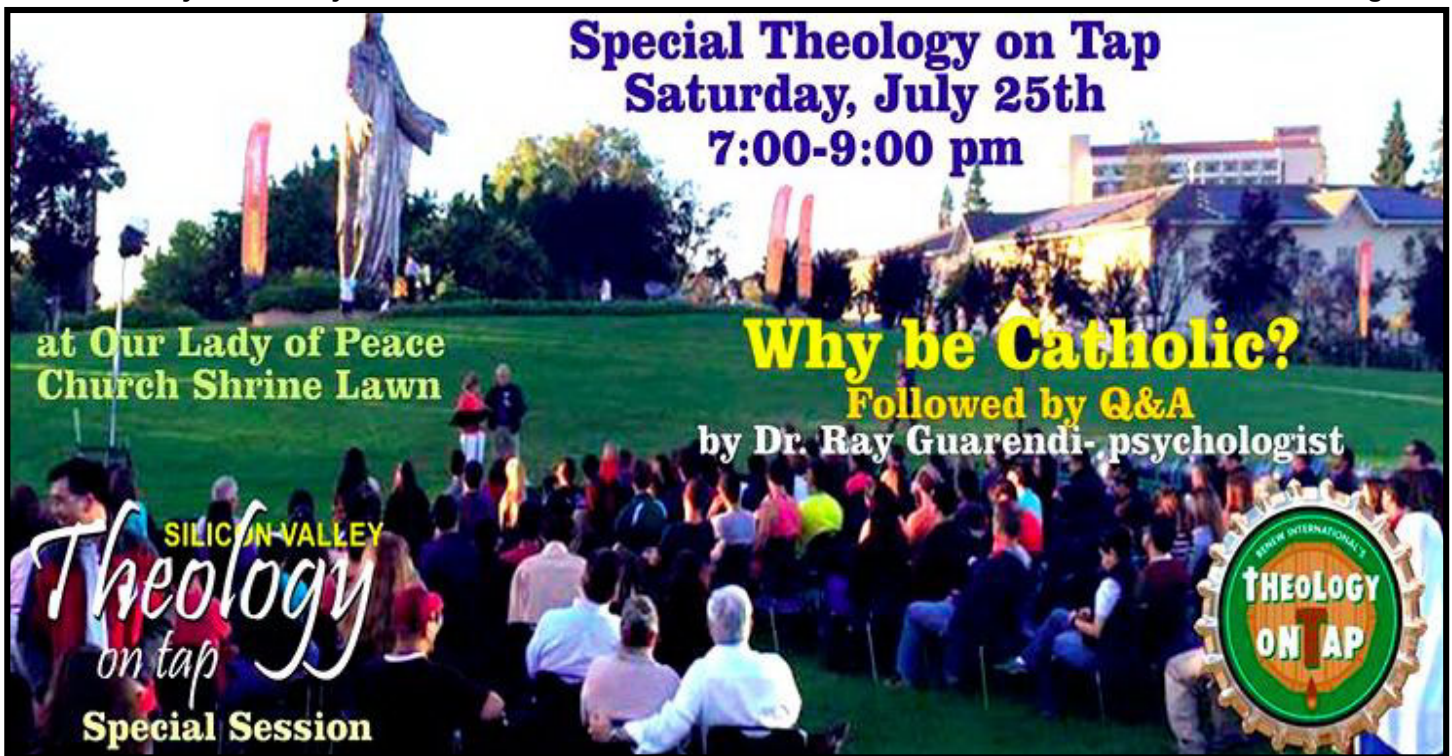
Taigi Vision is an entirely volunteer-based non-profit organization primarily dedicated to:
