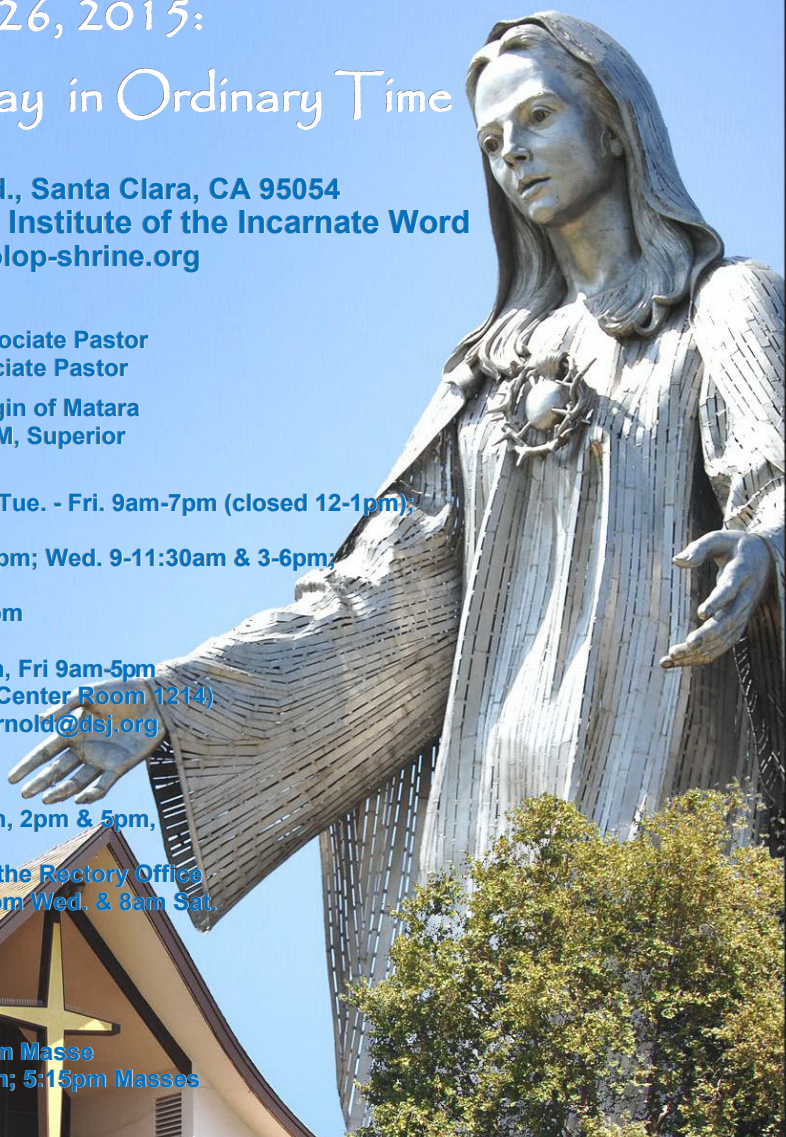

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

"The children are the joy of family and society. They are not problems of reproductive biology, or one of the many ways of self-realization. And they are even less a possession of their parents... No, no. Children are a gift; they are a present: Got it? Children are a gift." (Pope Francis, General Audience)

In the next two paragraphs, 14 & 15, Familiaris Consortio speaks about "Children, the Precious Gift of Marriage" and of "The Family, a Communion of Persons" respectively.

The Apostolic Exhortation says: "According to the plan of God, marriage is the foundation of the wider community of the family, since the very institution of marriage and conjugal love are ordained to the procreation and education of children, in whom they find their crowning." (14)

"Thus the couple, while giving themselves to one another, give not just themselves but also the reality of children, who are a living reflection of their love, a permanent sign of conjugal unity and a living and inseparable synthesis of their being a father and a mother." (14)

When spouses become parents they "receive from God the gift of a new responsibility. Their parental love is called to become for the children the visible sign of the very love of God." (Cf. 14)

Speaking of this responsibility, our Holy Father Pope Francis, has said: "sometimes [parents] are so centered on themselves and on their work or on their personal accomplishments that they even forget the family. And so, they leave the small children and the young alone." The Pope called these children "orphans in the family." And speaking particularly to fathers (but can sometimes be applied to mothers as well) he said: "fathers do not know well what place to occupy in the family and how to educate the children. And then, in doubt, they abstain; they withdraw and neglect their responsibility, perhaps taking refuge in an improbable relation of companionship with their children. However, while it is true that you must be a companion to your child, you must not forget that you are the father. However, if you only behave as a companion on an equal basis with your child, you will not do to him any good." (General Audience, 01/28/15)

Now, n. 15 speaks of the family as a communion of persons: "for in the family the human person is not only brought into being and progressively introduced by means of education into the human community, but by means of the rebirth of baptism and education in the faith the child is also introduced into God's family, which is the Church."

Pope Francis explicitly quoting St. John Paul II's Familiaris Consortio, says: "the family is a community of life which has its own autonomous consistency. (...) [The family] is not merely the sum of persons belonging to it, but a "community of persons" (cf. FC, nn. 17-18). And a community is more than the sum total of persons that belong to it. It is the place where one learns to love; it is the natural center of human life. It is made up of faces, of people who love, dialogue, make self-sacrifices for one another and defend life, especially of the most vulnerable and the weakest. One could say, without exaggeration, that the family is the driving force of the world and of history. Our personality develops in the family, by growing up with our mom and dad, our brothers and sisters, by breathing in the warmth of the home. The family is the place where we receive our name; it is the place of affection, the space of intimacy, where one acquires the art of dialogue and interpersonal communication. In the family the person becomes aware of his or her own dignity and, especially if their upbringing is Christian, each one recognizes the dignity of every single person, in a particular way the sick, the weak and the marginalized." (Address to Participants of the Pontifical Council for the Family, 10/25/13)

May our Blessed Mother, protect all our families and dispose our souls to receive the Great Gift of her beloved Son, in the Eucharist Sunday after Sunday.

Who are some of the most important composers of polyphony?

The earliest known composers were Leonin (c. 1163–1201), Perotin (fl. c. 1200), and Guillaume de Machaut (c. 1300–1377), but the most representative and well-known composers of sacred polyphony include Josquin Desprez (c. 1450–1521), Cristóbal de Morales (c. 1500–1553), Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina (1525–1594), Tomás Luis de Victoria (1548–1611), Thomas Tallis (c. 1505–1585), William Byrd (1543–1623), Orlando di Lasso (1532–1594), Francisco Guerrero (1528–1599), Carlo Gesualdo (1561–1613), and Claudio Monteverdi (1567–1643). Many later composers were inspired by these Renaissance masters of polyphony.

The “golden age” of sacred polyphony lasted from about 1400 until 1650, but composers of later eras continued to favor the contrapuntal style, especially when writing for the church.

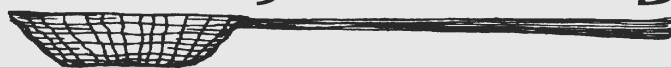

Volunteer for the Covenant of Love Marriage Ministry



Sadly, many couples married in the Church are unaware of God's design for marriage. Many lack solid formation, and others have lost sight of the design due to distractions in our secular culture. As a result, seemingly insurmountable difficulties in their marriages can lead them away from the beautiful goal that marriage is intended to reach.

At Our Lady of Peace, we have a good marriage preparation class to help place God's design for marriage in the spotlight. Some couples may not have had this introduction. And even those who have can lose focus in the hectic daily events of married life. A ministry for married couples is truly needed.

Work is underway at Our Lady of Peace to start a local chapter of the national ministry for marriage known as The Alexander House – Covenant of Love. In this program, couples come together once a month for prayer, formation, fellowship, and most importantly, one-on-one time to strengthen their marriage through intimate discussion on the Church's teachings regarding marriage. The formation is designed to help couples apply these teachings in practice within their marriages.
