FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

After explaining the tasks and role of the family, *Familiaris Consortio* goes on into describing each one of the members of the family. This Sunday, I'd like to dedicate this space to speak to the fathers.

"The man is called upon to live his gift and role as husband and father." (25)

"Love for his wife as mother of their children and love for the children themselves are for the man the natural way of understanding and fulfilling his own fatherhood." And – continued the Holy Father: "efforts must be made to restore socially the conviction that the place and task of the father in and for the family is of **unique and irreplaceable importance.**"

"The absence of a father," continues the Apostolic Exhortation, "causes psychological and moral imbalance and notable difficulties in family relationships, as does, in contrary circumstances, the oppressive presence of a father, especially where there still prevails the phenomenon of 'machismo,' or a wrong superiority of male prerogatives which humiliates women and inhibits the development of healthy family relationships" (25)

Precisely at the beginning of this year, Pope Francis explained that, saying: "the absence of the paternal figure in the life of little ones and young people produces gaps and wounds, which can also be very grave. [...] The sense of orphanhood that so many young people live is deeper than we think." (*General Audience*, 01/29/2015)

We have gone, says the Holy Father, "from one extreme to another," from "authoritarianism" and, in some cases, "even oppression" by fathers-masters, who did not meet "the needs of personal growth" of their children, because they did not help them "to enter into their path with freedom," to today's fathers. Now, the problem is rather their "absence" or "lack of action." (*General Audience*, 01/29/2015)

Therefore, he said: "The father present, always!" (*General Audience*, 02/05/2015)

"This is the first need: the father must be present in the family. He must be close to his wife, to share everything: joys and sorrows, hopes and labors. Likewise, he must be close to the children as they grow: when they play and work, when they are carefree and when they are distressed, when they express themselves and when they are silent, when they are daring and when they are afraid, when they make a wrong step and when they find their way." "Saying that he is present – Pope Francis emphasized– doesn't mean that he should be a controller: fathers who 'control' excessively hamper their children and don't let them grow up."

"A father" –the Pope continued– "knows just how much it costs to pass on this inheritance: how much closeness, how much tenderness, and how much strength. Yet, what consolation and what recompense he receives when his children honor this inheritance! It's a joy worth every struggle, which surpasses all misunderstanding and heals all wounds." "Fathers have to be patient," concluded the Pope, still speaking off the cuff: "So often there's nothing else to do but wait, with patience, kindness, generosity and mercy."

The concluding paragraph on this section *Familiaris Consortio* states: "In revealing and in reliving on earth the very fatherhood of God, a man is called upon to ensure the harmonious and united development of all the members of the family: he will perform this task by exercising generous responsibility for the life conceived under the heart of the mother, by a more solicitous commitment to education, a task he shares with his wife, by work which is never a cause of division in the family but promotes its unity and stability, and by means of the witness he gives of an adult Christian life which effectively introduces the children into the living experience of Christ and the Church."

Today, let us offer our special prayers for all fathers, may our Lord who knows their aspirations, hardships, and hopes fill their souls with peace and deep joy. May our Blessed Mother assure them that they do not labor alone.

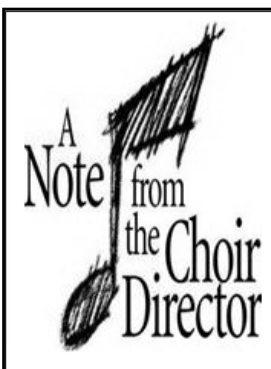

What are the sung Propers?

The Propers refer to the parts of the Mass that change from liturgy to liturgy. There are five sung Propers: Introit, Gradual, Alleluia, Offertory, and Communion. These chants can be found in the *Graduale Romanum* and *Gregorian Missal*, both published by the Abbey of Saint-Pierre de Solesmes, the center for chant restoration in the 10th and 20th centuries.

The Introit chant is the normative ideal for what is commonly known as the processional hymn. The Gradual, which follows the first reading, is now almost always replaced by the Responsorial Psalm from the Lectionary. The Alleluia, with its verse immediately precedes the Gospel reading; it is replaced by the Tract in the penitential season of Lent. The Offertory is not just the act of presenting and preparing the gifts, but is a chant prescribed for the Mass of the Day, even though the text is not given in the Roman Missal. The Communion chant is likewise prescribed for the Mass of the day. Singing the full chant Propers requires careful planning and patient rehearsal over the course of many years.
