FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

A very important integral component of the family is the figure of the grandparents, because "they carry out the important mission of being a witness to the past and [they are] a source of wisdom for the young and for the future." (*Familiaris Consortio*, 27)

However, in many cultures the elderly have been set aside "in unacceptable ways," and this of course, "causes acute suffering to them and spiritually impoverishes many families." (Cf. 27) In tune with this, the Holy Father, Pope Francis, tells that "grandparents, who have received the blessing to see their children's children (cf. Ps 128: 6), are entrusted with a great responsibility: to transmit their life experience, their family history, the history of a community, of a people; to share wisdom with simplicity, and the faith itself—the most precious heritage! Happy is the family who has grandparents close by! A grandfather is a father twice over and a grandmother is a mother twice over." (*Address*, 09/28/14)

And then the Pope Francis goes on to denounce once again what *Familiaris Consortio* had already deplored in 1981. He says: "The reality is that elderly people are being abandoned: the elderly are so often discarded with an attitude of abandonment, which is actually real and hidden euthanasia! It is the result of a throw away culture which is so harmful to our world. Children are thrown away, young people are thrown away, because they have no work, and the elderly are thrown away with the pretense of maintaining a 'balanced' economy, which has at its center not the human person but money. We are all called to oppose this poisonous, throw away culture!" (*Address*, 09/28/14)

We know that very unfortunately not every older person, grandfather, grandmother, has a family who can take him or her in, and so they are taken to institutions. Therefore, the Pope prayerfully exclaims, "May they be real homes and not prisons! ... They must not be institutions where the elderly live forgotten, hidden and neglected...Homes for the elderly should be the 'lungs' of humanity in a town, a neighborhood or a parish. They should be the 'sanctuaries' of humanity where one who is old and weak is cared for and protected like a big brother or sister."

Then, the Apostolic Exhortation continues asserting: "The elderly often have the charism to bridge generation gaps before they are made: how many children have found understanding and love in the eyes and words and caresses of the aging! And how many old people have willingly subscribed to the inspired word that the *crown of the aged is their children's children!* (Prov 17:6)." (27) It is in this sense that Pope Francis said: "The elderly, grandparents have the ability to understand the most difficult of situations: a great ability! And when they pray for these situations, their prayer is strong; it is powerful!"

So to all my dear parishioners who are grandparents, I'd like to express my spiritual closeness and admiration.

And to all those who still have the great grace of having their grandparents around, always remember that "truly Christian families are known by their fidelity, their patience, their openness to life, and by their respect for the elderly... the secret to this is the presence of Jesus in the family." (Pope Francis, *Address*, 10/25/2013)

And I invite you to say this prayer for the elderly written by our dear Saint John Paul II in 1999: "Grant, O Lord of life, that we may savor every season of our lives as a gift filled with promise for the future. Grant that we may lovingly accept your will, and place ourselves each day in your merciful hands. And when the moment of our definitive "passage" comes, grant that we may face it with serenity, without regret for what we shall leave behind. For in meeting you, after having sought you for so long, we shall find once more every authentic good which we have known here on earth, in the company of all who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith and hope. Mary, Mother of pilgrim humanity, pray for us "now and at the hour of our death." Keep us ever close to Jesus, your beloved Son and our bother, the Lord of life and glory. Amen!"

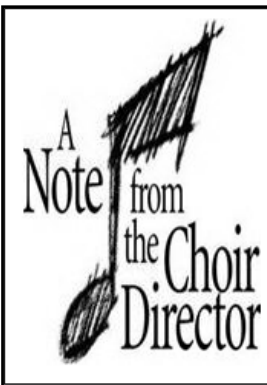

What's so great about the organ?

Since gaining acceptance for liturgical use in the Middle Ages, the organ has been esteemed for its contribution to sacred music. Its method of producing sound recalls the human voice itself, which the Church has given primacy in her worship. Its use over the centuries in a solo and supportive role has given the organ a unique status above all other instruments.

In 2006, when he blessed the new instrument at the Alte Kapelle in Regensburg, Pope Benedict XVI remarked, "The organ has always been considered, and rightly so, the king of musical instruments, because it takes up all the sounds of creation... and gives resonance to the fullness of human sentiments, from joy to sadness, from praise to lamentation. By transcending the merely human sphere, as all music of quality does, it evokes the divine. The organ's great range of timbre, from *piano* through to a thundering *fortissimo*, makes it an instrument superior to all others. It is capable of echoing and expressing all the experiences of human life. The manifold possibilities of the organ in some way remind us of the immensity and the magnificence of God." <http://musicasacra.com/about-cmaa/jaq/>

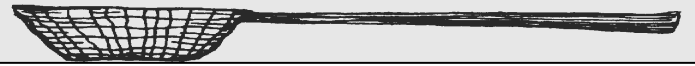

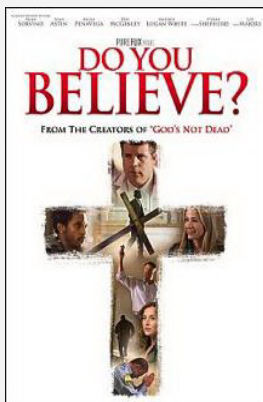

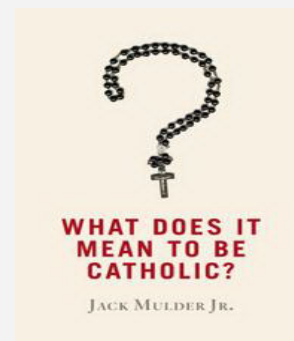
