From Our Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Tomorrow we will celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. The Triumph of the Cross! The Cross –in the ancient Greco-Roman times terrified people. Think that people who were condemned to this kind of death were stripped of their clothes in order to humiliate them, then either tied or nailed to a cross and essentially left to die painfully upon the cross fully exposed to the glare of the public. The whole idea was that people will watch you as you died in this terribly painful way.

The Cross was terrible and it was meant to be terrible. The Cross was humiliating and it was meant to be humiliating. It was a public display of Roman power and it was meant to strike fear in people's heart. So terrible was the cross that for the first several centuries the Church never depicted the Crucified Jesus, the memory was too fresh and too terrible in people's mind.

So why are we celebrating the Cross' Triumph?

There is one possible explanation: the Resurrection of Jesus from the death.

If Jesus was simply a Victim of that terrible Cross and then, just simply fondly remembered by his followers, then we should all go home. It was only after the first Christians had taken in the experience of Resurrection of our Lord that they turned with captivated attention to that Cross.

Obviously people recoils in horror from the Cross. But once they had taken in the fact of the Resurrection they looked back to that Cross; convinced they will find something decisive in there. Somehow, they concluded that –in the strange Providence of God- the Cross was the key ingredient in the process by which God was saving the world. As the Gospel Acclamation of this feast says: *by your Cross you have redeemed the world.*

In the second reading St. Paul writes a beautiful hymn included in his Letter to the Philippians where he situates the Cross within the context of a compelling narrative of God's dealing with the human race: *though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross.*

The solution to human self-elevation is a divine self-emptying. Adam tried to assume the form of God; God assumed the form of a slave. There is a reversal of the momentum of sin, reversing it by his own self-abnegation. He came to save us. He is God reaching down. And that is why that terrible instrument of torture and death is the means by which God was reconciling the world to Himself.

That is why we the Christians read the Cross not as senseless tragedy, not as the triumph of human cruelty and oppression, but precisely as God's triumph over sin. That is why we celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.

I'd like to conclude with the words of Ven. Archbishop Fulton Sheen who wrote: "Once our Lord, Who is Love Itself, mounts the cross, He reveals how pain can be transformed through love into a joyful sacrifice, how those who sow in tears may reap in joy, how those who mourn may be comforted, how those who suffer with Him may reign with Him, and how those who take up a cross for a brief Good Friday will possess happiness for an eternal Easter Sunday. Love is, as it were, the joint where the horizontal bar of death and the vertical bar of life become reconciled in the doctrine that all life is through death." (*The Eternal Galilean*)

Today also, I'd like to congratulate our Sisters in the main feast of their Institute and ask you to join us in prayer in thanksgiving for their consecration and asking the Incarnate Word for the grace "to love the cross because it is on the cross that we learn to better follow and imitate our Lord." (Fr. Buela, IVE Founder, *Ars Participandi*).

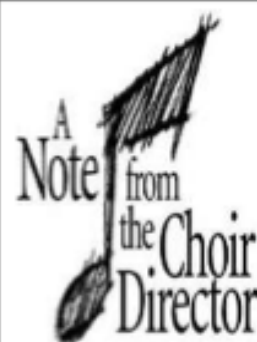

120. In the Latin Church the pipe organ is to be held in high esteem, for it is the traditional musical instrument which adds a wonderful splendor to the Church's ceremonies and powerfully lifts up man's mind to God and to higher things.

121. Composers, filled with the Christian spirit, should feel that their vocation is to cultivate sacred music and increase its store of treasures. Let them produce compositions which have the qualities proper to genuine sacred music, not confining themselves to works which can be sung only by large choirs, but providing also for the needs of small choirs and for the active participation of the entire assembly of the faithful.

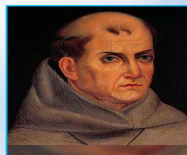

WITH THE NATIONAL PILGRIMAGE VIRGIN STATUE



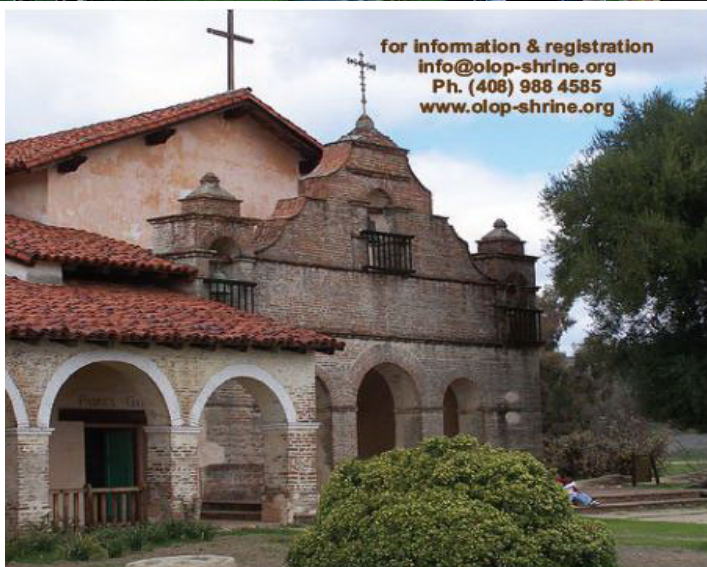

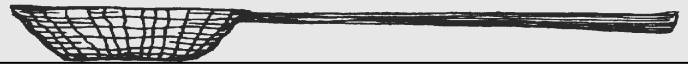
