From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

In less than ten days –on December 8, 2015 which marks the fiftieth anniversary of the closing of the Second Vatican Council- the **Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy** will begin. Therefore, I wish to dedicate this space to consider some catechetical aspects and information that –I pray- will help us draw more fruits of this holy year.

On May 5, 2015, Archbishop Salvatore Fisichella, *President of the Pontifical Council for the Promotion of the New Evangelization* and Msgr. Graham Bell, Undersecretary of the Pontifical Council held a press conference explaining some elements that make this Jubilee Year unique. Here is an excerpt of what they said:

- “The Apostolic Exhortation *Evangelii Gaudium*... offers a meaningful expression of the very essence of the Extraordinary Jubilee announced on April 11: ‘Such a community [the Church] has an endless desire to show mercy, the fruit of its own experience of the power of the Father’s infinite mercy. Let us try a little harder to take the first step and to become involved’ (EG 24). It is with this desire in mind that we should re-read the *Bull of Indiction of the Jubilee, Misericordiae vultus*, in which Pope Francis details the aims of the Holy Year. As you know, the two dates already marked out are **December 8**, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception – the day of the opening of the Holy Door of Saint Peter’s Basilica – and **November 20, 2016**, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, which will conclude the Holy Year.”

- “This Jubilee of Mercy is not and does not intend to be the Great Jubilee Year of 2000. Therefore, any comparisons lack validity, for every Holy Year possesses its own unique nature and aims. It is the Pope’s desire that this Jubilee be celebrated in Rome as well as in the local Churches. For the first time in the history of the Jubilee tradition, there will be an opportunity for individual dioceses to open a Holy Door – The Door of Mercy – either in the Cathedral or in a church of special meaning or a shrine of particular importance for pilgrimages” [**Our Lady of Peace Church is one of them**].

- “From the very beginning, however, the call to mercy breaks with the traditional pattern. The history of Jubilees has been marked by their occurrence every 50 or 25 years. The two Extraordinary Jubilees fell on anniversaries of Christ’s redemptive act (1933, 1983). This Jubilee, however, is based upon a theme. It will build upon the central content of the faith and intends to call the Church once again to its missionary priority of being a sign and witness in every aspect of its pastoral life.”

- “We must also not forget another original characteristic of this Jubilee, namely, the designation of Missionaries of Mercy. Pope Francis will give them their mandate on Ash Wednesday during the celebration in Saint Peter’s Basilica.”

- They also discussed the calendar of celebrations taking place during this Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy. You may read the complete listing of them all in this website: <http://www.iubilaeummisericordiae.va>

I’d like to conclude with the words of our Holy Father during his announcement of the Jubilee Year. He said: “I am confident that the whole Church, which is in such need of mercy for we are sinners, will be able to find in this Jubilee the joy of rediscovering and rendering fruitful God’s mercy, with which we are all called to give comfort to every man and every woman of our time. Do not forget that God forgives all, and God forgives always. Let us never tire of asking forgiveness. Let us henceforth entrust this Year to the Mother of Mercy, that she may turn her gaze upon us and watch over our journey: our penitential journey, our year-long journey with an open heart, to receive the indulgence of God, to receive the mercy of God.” (March 13, 2015)

“Let us live this Jubilee intensely, begging the Father to forgive our sins and to bathe us in his merciful ‘indulgence.’” (*Misericordiae Vultus*, 22) Let us not be indifferent to the call to experience mercy! Save the date: it begins on **December 8, 2015**.

HOLY DOORS OF MERCY open on Dec. 13th. Opportunity for Plenary Indulgence during Jubilee



As in other Holy Years, there will be an opportunity to receive Plenary Indulgence; a year of forgiveness of sins. It's also a year of reconciliation and an opportunity to deepen your faith.

HOLY DOORS

Holy doors are sealed shut from the inside and only opened during Jubilee years, during which pilgrims pass through the doors to gain a plenary indulgence. These holy doors will be open for the Jubilee Year of the Mercy on Dec. 8. Pope Francis has also deemed a holy door at each cathedral and designated shrines.

To obtain Plenary Indulgence, a person must do the following while on pilgrimage:

- Have the intention of gaining indulgence
- Receive the Sacrament of Penance
- Receive the Eucharist
- Pray the following: Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be for the intentions of the Holy Father
- Perform the prescribed action of Indulgence (ex: visiting Our Lady of Peace.)
- Be free from all attachment of Sin

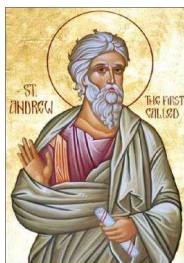
"An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints".

The Love in the Family

"What is the family? The family is a place where *two mysteries are enacted*: first, it is the area where the **unlovable are loved**, and second, it is the **environment in which love solves personality problems**."

"It is easy to love lovable children, but to love them **when they are unlovable is the unfailing sign of a family....** Once parents recognize that **God loves them** (all children) even when they are unlovable, **it inspires them to do the same for their children**."

"Parents love the children through their squabbles, tantrums and furies, and so **God loves us through ours**. As **He puts love where He does not find it**, so *parents put love where they do not find*, for the moment, anything lovable; but thus they become lovable."

"The second mark of **the true family spirit is to use love to solve personality problems**. The family then is a place where, **under the influence of love, we learn from mistakes** rather than a place where we are punished for them. Discipline, however, is not to be disowned...." (from *Children and parents*, Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen)
