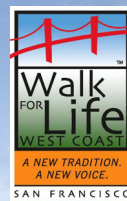

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

On January 31, the Roman Catholic Church honors the great Saint John Bosco, a 19th century Italian priest who reached out to young people to remedy their lack of education, opportunities, and faith. There are many great deeds, events in his life and teachings that make him an example for all. However, today I'd like recall Don Bosco's great devotion to our Lady, especially under the title of Mary Help of Christians.

He transmitted his tender and filial love to the Virgin Mary to all those he met, especially to the youth. He spoke to them with a burning heart: "Have faith in the Blessed Sacrament and Mary Help of Christians and you will see what miracles are." Or in another occasion referring to the many favors Mary, Help of Christians granted to people he said, "I am not aware that anyone prayed in vain. Spiritual and temporal favors, more or less extraordinary, always resulted from praying to our most merciful Mother, the mighty Help of Christians."

In several dreams, Mary Help of Christians asked Saint John Bosco to build a temple in her honor, and showed him the place and inside the temple, the inscription, "Here is my house, from here is my glory." Don Bosco, began the construction of the temple with all that he had, a few coins. Later on, he will say: "There is not one brick that may not be a sign of some grace." "She has done it all." On June 9th, 1868, the temple was consecrated and it is the current Basilica of Mary Help of Christians, in Turin, in which the St. John Bosco's remains are conserved.

He wrote: "Mary has been constituted by God as the Help of Christians."

"When the Blessed Virgin Mary came to visit her, Saint Elizabeth was so filled with the Holy Spirit, that she was inspired to prophesy: Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb. With these words, the Holy Spirit through the lips of Elizabeth extolled Mary as blessed and favored by God and chosen by Him to bring to men the blessing which was lost in Eve and for which mankind has been yearning for so many centuries.

To the congratulations of her kinswoman Mary, also inspired by God, replied: My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord. For he has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed.

Now, in order that Mary's glory might be extended to all generations, so that all might call her blessed, it was necessary that Mary should bestow upon every generation an extraordinary and lasting benefit so that the reason for gratitude and praise might be ever present. This continuous and marvelous benefit is none other than the help Mary gives to men—a help that is extended to all ages, places and people.

The title of 'Help of Christians' attributed to the august Mother of the Redeemer is not new in the Church of Christ, but in these latter times, it has been proclaimed of the Blessed Virgin Mary for a special reason. Not only for private favors is Mary being invoked, but especially because of the serious and imminent danger that threaten the faithful. Today the Catholic Church itself is attacked in its missions, in its institutions, in its head, in its doctrine, in its discipline. It is attacked as the Catholic Church, the pillar of truth and the teacher of all the faithful.

And it is precisely to obtain the special protection of heaven that we have recourse to Mary as the Mother of us all, the special helper of Catholics throughout the world and of their leaders. Hence we can truly say that Mary has been constituted by God as the Help of Christians and that in time of crisis she has shown herself to be the helper especially of those who suffer and fight for the faith.

May the Blessed Virgin help us to be faithful to the teachings of the faith, of which the Roman Pontiff, the Vicar of Jesus Christ, is the head, and obtain for us the grace of preserving in serving God on this earth, so as to join her one day in the kingdom of heavenly glory." Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 10th. See our Guidelines for Fasting



**ASH
WEDNESDAY**

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Work and Play

"There is a great difference between work and play. **Work is for a purpose. Play is not. Play is just for fun.**

The Dutch historian Johan Huizinga holds that "civilization arises and unfolds itself in play... **genuine pure play is one of the main bases of civilization.**"

Play is related to work, for if every day were the fourth of July, who would enjoy fireworks?

Cicero compared it **to sleep as well as work.** "It is indeed lawful to make use of play and fun, but in the same way as we have recourse to sleep and other kinds of rest, and then only when we have done our duty in grave and serious matters."

In Proverbs, these two elements of creation are combined. First, there is the formation of the world, the giving it purpose and meaning, but linked with it is the contrasting idea of play.

"I was by His side, a Master Craftsman Delighting Him day after day, Ever at play in His presence, at play everywhere in His world. Delighting to be with the sons of men."

But why is play associated with work? Why the lightness and the delight during the labor of creation? God was not forced to labor for six phases of evolution before He could rest. **No obligation ever forced love to go outside Himself.** Like play, creation was not forced. God was under no obligation to project His Love into hearts and His Truth to the minds and His Being into things.

While creation was full of serious purpose, it was as empty of necessity as love.

Cicero, so skilled in oratory, recommended this **interplay of work and play.** "When the audience is weary, it will be useful to the speaker to try **something novel or amusing, provided that it be not incompatible with the gravity of the subject.**" The **lighthearted and the serious, then, go together in life.** "I hold," writes Xenophon, the ancient Greek, "that the works of good and lovable men are worthy of memory, not only when they have been carried out in a serious vein, but also in the **spirit of play.**"

The real man is, therefore, the grave-merry man; he knows very well that there is a place for crying and laughing; for giving purpose to his work and still lightly doing the things that are unnecessary. As Francis de Sales wrote, "A sad saint is a sorry kind of saint." Life has a serious side: We have to work out our salvation; but it is also amusing and laughable because we take ourselves so seriously in other things that are not so important."
