From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

This coming Wednesday February 10 the holy season of Lent will begin. On that particular occasion the Gospel of Matthew will be read and these words of Christ will be addressed to each one of us at the beginning of the Lenten journey: Your Father who sees in secret will repay you (Matthew 6:4 and 6:18).

All throughout the world, the Catholic faithful will begin it with the Imposition of Ashes, an austere penitential gesture, which is meant to underline the awareness of ourselves as sinners before the majesty and holiness of God. And, at the same time, this penitential gesture is meant to manifest our willingness to accept and to translate into concrete choices our adherence to the Gospel.

The formulas that accompany it are very eloquent. The first, taken from the Book of Genesis: Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return (see 3:19), recalls our present human condition placed under the sign of brevity and limitation. The second takes up the evangelical words: Repent and believe in the Gospel (Mark 1:15), which are an urgent appeal to change our lives. Both formulas invite us to enter into Lent with an attitude of listening and sincere conversion.

Notice that the Gospel underlines that the Lord sees in secret, that is, He scrutinizes the heart. The external gestures of penance have value if they are expressions of an interior attitude, if they manifest the firm determination to turn away from evil and walk on the path of goodness. Here is the profound meaning of Christian asceticism.

Our Holy Mother Church has always indicated some useful means to advance on this path. First of all, humble and docile adherence to the will of God accompanied by incessant prayer; the penitential forms that are typical of the Christian tradition, such as abstinence, fasting, mortification and self-denial even of goods that are legitimate in themselves; concrete gestures of acceptance in relating to one's neighbor, which Wednesday's Gospel evokes with the word "alms." All this is proposed again with greater intensity during the Lenten period, which represents, in this connection, an "intense time" of spiritual training and of generous service to brothers.

In this sense, St. Leo the Great wrote: "Dear friends, what the Christian should be doing at all times should be done now with greater care and devotion, so that the Lenten fast enjoined by the apostles may be fulfilled, not simply by abstinence from food but above all by the renunciation of sin.

There is no more profitable practice as a companion to holy and spiritual fasting than that of almsgiving. This embraces under the single name of mercy many excellent works of devotion, so that the good intentions of all the faithful may be of equal value, even where their means are not. The love that we owe both God and man is always free from any obstacle that would prevent us from having a good intention. The angels sang: Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth. The person who shows love and compassion to those in any kind of affliction is blessed, not only with the virtue of good will but also with the gift of peace.

The works of mercy are innumerable. Their very variety brings this advantage to those who are true Christians, that in the matter of almsgiving not only the rich and affluent but also those of average means and the poor are able to play their part. Those who are unequal in their capacity to give can be equal in the love within their hearts." (Sermo 6 de Quadragesima, 1-2: PL 54, 285-287)

Therefore, during this Lenten season I invite you all to take advantage of the many opportunities we have in our Parish to enter deeply into the spirit of Lent, such as the extended hours of Confession, the praying of the Way of the Cross, etc. "May the message of mercy reach everyone, and may no one be indifferent to the call to experience mercy." (Pope Francis, Misericordia Vultus, 19)

I pray that our Lady, the Mother of Christ, may accompany us in this journey of prayer, penance, and authentic Christian asceticism. May her example and her intercession help us to proceed with joy toward Easter.

**ASH
WEDNESDAY**

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

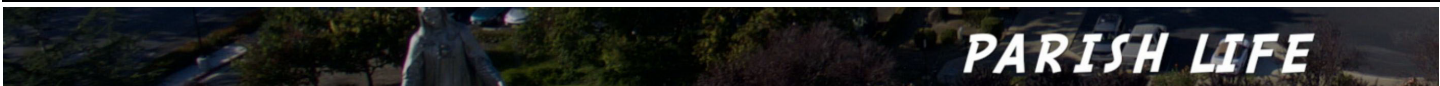

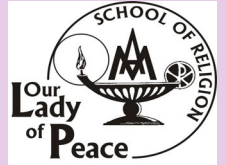

Children and Youth Religious Education Program News

"The Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us." John 1:14



Caring

"Some of the most tragic moments in life are those when we cannot find an audience, not just for good news or for secrets we burn to tell, but **especially for our wounds and hurts**. Somewhere and somehow there ought to be an "Open End" where **tears are understood and a heart beats for a common sorrow**.

In motherhood there is what might be called "**empathy**" or the power of relating oneself to another to such an extent as to have one's emotions and feelings qualified by the other. A delicate awareness, like a magnetic needle, makes the mother's heart vibrate in unison with the woes of the offspring.

What is more, the mother would, if she could, take the burns of her child onto her own flesh. But human flesh, while it is responsive to many touches, has a finite limit and impenetrability about it. The physical ailments of others we can "feel," but the flesh of one cannot take on the tatterings of flesh.

But **the transference through empathy is greater in the moral order than the physical**. Here **empathy is realistic**. In the case of a delinquent daughter, the mother may suffer more than the daughter, because the mother has a clear idea of the gravity of the daughter's conduct. So, in the moral order, **innocence understands sin better than sin itself**. **The one thing we never learn by experience is sin**. The onlooker on moral disorder suffers more than the victim unless he is one of those callous souls who say, "No, I do not allow these things to affect me."

Hostility can be intense for those who care; whether it be the daughter for the mother, the patient for the therapist, the delinquent for the counselor, or the fallen-away for the minister of God. But what is amazing is that despite all the poison exuded by the morally guilty, **a process of absorption goes on by the one who cares; the returning of love for hate, the open arms for those who would nail**. Always there is a **hand lifted in forgiveness and a heart ready to embrace, and lips offered to a blistering kiss of betrayal**. As James Hilton said, "If you forgive enough people, you belong to them and they to you, whether either person likes it or not... the squatter's rights of the heart." There is no space here to unravel the full mystery, but is there not an **"open end" in the Universe itself where Love cares when the unloving do not, and where Love suffers when a child falls and a man tumbles?"**
