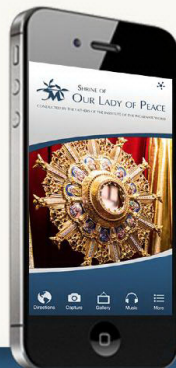

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Tomorrow we will celebrate the Feast of the Chair of Saint Peter and the Gospel of Matthew will be read:

He [Jesus] said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter said in reply, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus said to him in reply, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father. And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. (16: 15-18)

Saint John Paul II, reflecting of this mystery said: "These words on Peter's lips come from the depths of God's mystery. They reveal the intimate truth, the very life of God. And Peter, under the action of the divine Spirit, becomes a witness and confessor of this superhuman truth. His profession of faith thus forms the firm basis of the Church's faith: On this rock I will build my Church (Mt 16:18). The Church of Christ is built on Peter's faith and fidelity.

The first Christian community was very conscious of this. As the Acts of the Apostles recount, when Peter was in prison it gathered to raise an earnest prayer to God for him (cf. Acts 12:5). It was heard, because Peter's presence was still necessary for the community as it took its first steps: the Lord sent his angel to free him from the hands of his persecutors (cf. ibid., 12:7-11). It was written in God's plan that Peter, after long strengthening his brothers in faith, would undergo martyrdom here in Rome." (Homily, June 29, 2009)

"To celebrate the Chair of Peter means, therefore, to attribute to it a strong spiritual significance and to recognize in it a privileged sign of the love of God, good and eternal Shepherd, who wants to gather the whole of his Church and guide her along the way of salvation," said Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI.

Ven. Archbishop Fulton Sheen in his book "You" wrote a beautiful chapter entitled: 'Is Religion Purely Individual?' where he speaks about the Petrine Ministry. He says recalling the Gospel passage we quoted above mentioned: "And on that day at Caesarea Philippi, when the Rock confessed that Christ was the Son of the Living God, the Divine Master said to him: 'You are the Rock and upon this Rock, I will build my ecclesia, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.' From now on God's ecclesia would be built upon the Rock and it would be to the whole world God's chosen community for the communication of His Divine Life, as Israel before had been the community for the giving of that promise. And through his new ecclesia or body Christ still teaches as He once taught through His own individual human nature. Therefore, the ecclesia must be infallible or free from error. It cannot be otherwise, for Christ is still teaching through His body: 'He who hears you,' He said, 'hears me.' Through this ecclesia or body, Christ still governs. Therefore, disobedience to His ecclesia would be a disobedience to Him, just as an insult to your body is an insult to your person.

Through this ecclesia He still forgives sins. Therefore, the publicans and the woman taken in sin have no advantage over you and me who live in this very hour. And though this Truth and Power and Holiness are communicated through poor weak human natures in His ecclesia, that Truth and Power and Holiness cannot be spoiled any more than sunshine is polluted when it shines through a dirty window. Human nature in the ecclesia is only the instrument of the forgiveness and the truth. It is not the cause."

I'd like to conclude the well-known words of St. Luigi Orione about the Pope: "The Pope is our creed, our moral standard, he in our love, our heart, our reason for living. For us the Pope is Jesus Christ, and to love the Pope and to love Jesus are one and the same. Listening to and following the Pope signifies listening to and following Jesus Christ, just as serving the Pope and giving one's life for him are the same as serving and giving one's life for Jesus Christ."

Tirelessly our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has asked us to "pray for him." On this solemnity we remember him most especially and his intentions for this month.

The celebration of the Jubilee Year is not only an extraordinary occasion for benefiting from the great gift of indulgences which the Lord gives us through the Church, but it is also a fitting opportunity to recall the catechesis on indulgences to the attention of the faithful. While in Quebec we can receive Plenary indulgence by passing through Holy Door of Notre Dame de Quebec Basilica which is one of only seven Holy Doors in the world outside of the Jubilee Year: Four are in Rome, in each of the papal basilicas; one in France at the Shrine of Saint John Vianney, the Curé of Ars; and one at the Shrine of Saint James in Compostela, Spain. The Holy Door in Quebec City, which first opened December 8, 2013, was a gift of the Holy See and is the only one outside Europe."



Visit the St. Joseph Oratory. Saint Joseph's Oratory of Mount Royal is recognized as one of the great temples of the world. Like many sacred places in various countries, the Oratory, which has room for 10,000 people, attracts visitors who seek a haven of peace and a spiritual encounter. There are several such temples in the Christian world of the Occident. Only three are found at the heart of important cities: Saint Peter's Basilica in Rome, the Sanctuary of Montmartre in Paris, and Saint Joseph's Oratory in Montreal.

Visit one of Quebec's natural treasures, Montmorency Falls, located east of Quebec City at the mouth of the Rivi re Montmorency. The falls are the highest in the province and higher than Niagara Falls."



Your \$2,659 includes round trip airfare from San Francisco, 7 nights accommodations, daily breakfast & dinner, 2 lunches, all land travel by air-conditioned motor coach with a Tour Escort, and Daily Mass with an IVE Priest. Even admission fees are covered.

Visit national shrine of Ste-Anne-de-Beaupr , and learn its fascinating history through artistic masterpieces such as its mosaics, stained-glass windows, stone and wood sculptures and its numerous chapels. Visit of St. Anne museum. Enjoy free time to explore the shrine: Old stoned church, outdoor tour of the way of the cross, Scala Santa. Mass followed with a

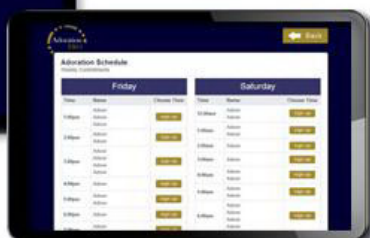
Sign up for an Hour of Adoration at Our Lady of Peace

Getting to Adoration Pro™ on your Mobile Device

Tap your finger on the OLP Shrine App icon on your Home Screen. This will launch the *Shrine of Our Lady of Peace* Mobile App. The app will then take a couple seconds to load. Once you've arrived at the Mobile App Home Screen, you will notice a Monstrance icon on the bottom of your screen with "Adoration" written below it." Tap your finger on the icon. 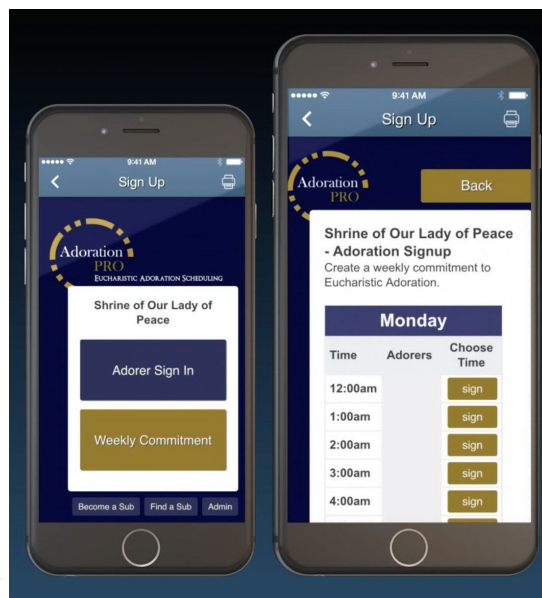
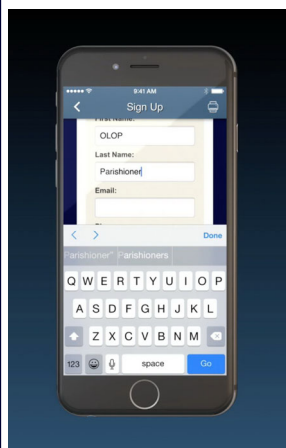
Browse within Adoration Pro™ and Select a Time

Lenten Fact: During Bach's day, often the organ and choirs were silent during Lent.

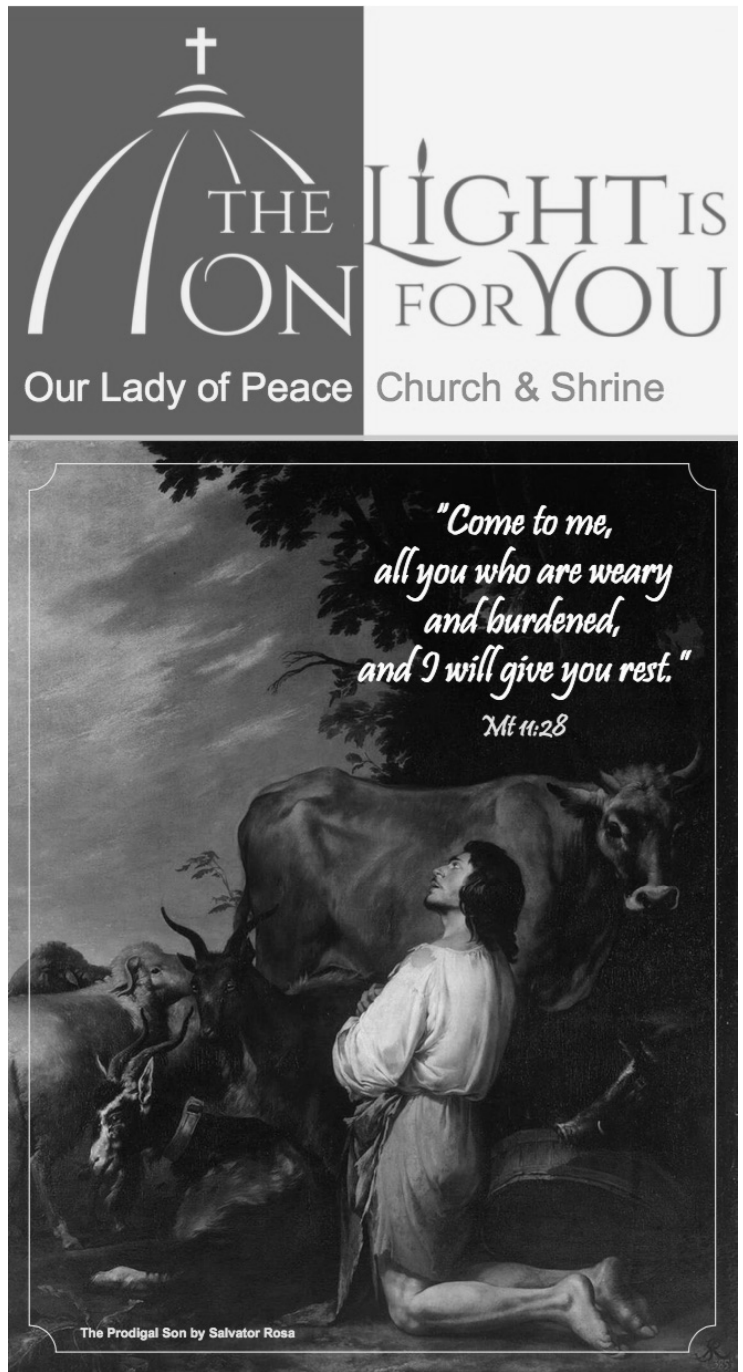
Lenten Action: Talk about today's scriptures with a friend after Mass.

Children and Youth Religious Education Program News

"The Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us." John 1:14



Adolescence

"ADOLESCENCE IS A COMA. It is a **period of suspension** between years of childhood when one is dependent on parents and an adult age when one is dependent on a boss, a wife, or public opinion. It used to be an age that listened to the voice of experience: today adolescents regard their elders as the voice of inexperience.

Adolescents are unhappy because they are constantly being pulled by opposite

site forces such as:

1. **The adolescent is on the one hand an imitator and on the other, a rebel.** He seeks to be like others in **his group**, wearing the same kind of clothes, listening to the same type of music, using the same jargon; but he is also pulled in the opposite direction, **seeking superiority** either by having a car, or a better car than his fellows, or living in a better house, or one that is on the right side of the tracks.
2. The adolescent is torn between **looking his worst and looking his best**. The young girl will affect flowing hair, pants, low heels, as if in rebellion against the adult social order and its conventions, or else to attract attention. But, in another mood, **she wants a new frock**, the privilege of putting her head in a steel trap to emerge with a different hairdo, and hopes the boy will give her a silver bracelet to go with her braces.
3. Another tension is that which develops between **cockiness and timidity**. The cocky feeling comes before one knows anything well, and the timid feeling from — well, that one knows nothing. The cockiness makes the adolescent refer to the father as "Oh, him," but timidity makes him say "Ahem" to the father a dozen times before he asks for the car.
4. **Silence and loquaciousness are other tensions.** The adolescent feels lonely at home and can find nothing to talk about. But on the telephone, the adolescent can talk for hours.
5. **The greatest tension of all is between two kinds of steadiness.** The boy wants a car, not a borrowed one, but his own, one with which he can go steady. The girl wants a boy with whom she can go steady. The boy has a prepossession for possession; the girl has a prepossession to be possessed. But the boy soon wants a new model and peculiarly enough that affects the girl.

Elders must not be too hard on the tensions of teenagers for they are for the most part biological. Elders have tensions too which, in their criticism of teenagers, they are apt to forget, namely **the tension between what they are and what they ought to be. It is for elders to teach youth that they have only one arrow in the quiver — that is the arrow of youth and it may be shot but once. Be sure that it hits the target — the Divinely appointed target — love of God, love of country, love of neighbor."**

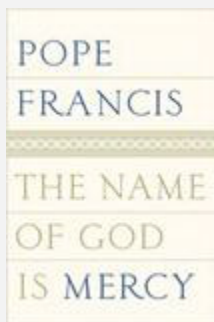

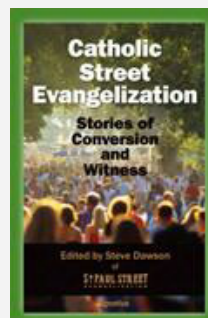

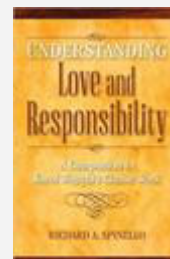
