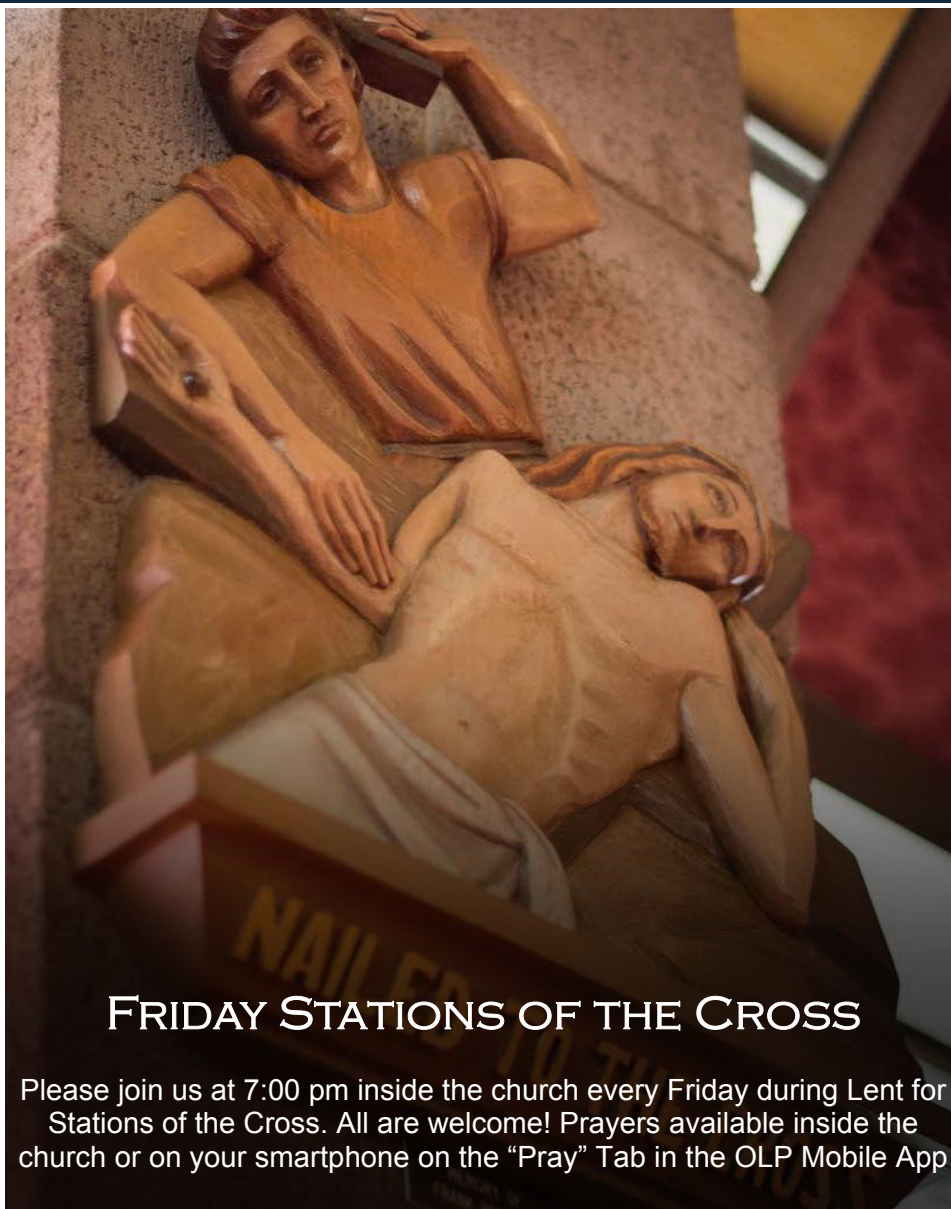

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

I desire mercy, and not sacrifice. These words from the Gospel of Matthew (9:13) introduce and provide the framework for Pope Francis Lenten Message for this year.

In three main points, he emphasizes the importance of the "works of mercy on the road of the Jubilee." Here is a brief excerpt of his Message whose full reading I encourage you to do on your own. There you might find some recommendations of what to do during Lent so that when the Gardener comes you are not found without fruits, as today Gospel suggests.

The Pope begins invoking the presence of "Mary, the image of a Church which evangelizes because she is evangelized." He says: "I asked that 'the season of Lent in this Jubilee Year be lived more intensely as a privileged moment to celebrate and experience God's mercy (MV, 17) [...] I sought to stress the primacy of prayerful listening to God's word. [...] The mercy of God is a proclamation made to the world, a proclamation which each Christian is called to experience at first hand. For this reason, during the season of Lent I will send out Missionaries of Mercy as a concrete sign to everyone of God's closeness and forgiveness."

In the second point of his Lenten Message the Holy Father beautifully explains "God's covenant with humanity: a history of mercy." He wrote: "The mystery of divine mercy is revealed in the history of the covenant between God and his people Israel. God shows himself ever rich in mercy, ever ready to treat his people with deep tenderness and compassion, especially at those tragic moments when infidelity ruptures the bond of the covenant, which then needs to be ratified more firmly in justice and truth. Here is a true love story, in which God plays the role of the betrayed father and husband, while Israel plays the unfaithful child and bride."

"This love story," -says the Holy Father- "culminates in the incarnation of God's Son. In Christ, the Father pours forth his boundless mercy even to making him 'mercy incarnate' (MV, 8) [...] As the Son of God, he is the Bridegroom who does everything to win over the love of his bride, to whom he is bound by an unconditional love which becomes visible in the eternal wedding feast."

"Mercy," continues Pope Francis- "expresses God's way of reaching out to the sinner, offering him a new chance to look at himself, convert, and believe' (MV, 21), thus restoring his relationship with him. In Jesus crucified, God shows his desire to draw near to sinners, however far they may have strayed from him. In this way he hopes to soften the hardened heart of his Bride."

"The works of mercy" give title to the third point of his Lenten Message where he exhorts every Catholic to practice their faith with concrete everyday actions because "on such things will we be judged," he says. And he gives us the reason for it: because "the flesh of Christ 'becomes visible in the flesh of the tortured, the crushed, the scourged, the malnourished, and the exiled,' like an extension in time of the suffering of the Innocent Lamb, the burning bush of gratuitous love. "In light of this love, the real poor are revealed as those who refuse to see themselves as such. They consider themselves rich, but they are actually the poorest of the poor. This is because they are slaves to sin..."

"For all of us, then," the Pope says, "the season of Lent in this Jubilee Year is a favorable time to overcome our existential alienation by listening to God's word and by practicing works of mercy. [...] The corporal and spiritual works of mercy must never be separated. By touching the flesh of the crucified Jesus in the suffering, sinners can receive the gift of realizing that they too are poor and in need."

Pope Francis then, concludes saying: "Let us not waste this season of Lent, so favorable a time for conversion! We ask this through the maternal intercession of the Virgin Mary, who encountering the greatness of God's mercy freely bestowed upon her, was the first to acknowledge her lowliness (cf. Lk 1:48) and to call herself the Lord's humble servant (cf. Lk 1:38).

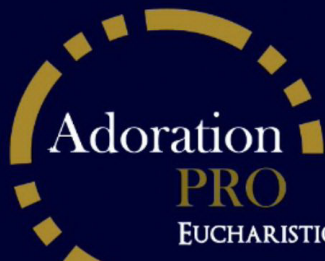

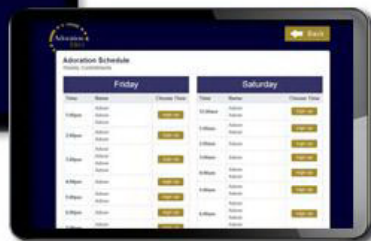
Sign up for an Hour of Adoration at Our Lady of Peace

Getting to Adoration Pro™ on your Mobile Device

Tap your finger on the OLP Shrine App icon on your Home Screen. This will launch the *Shrine of Our Lady of Peace* Mobile App. The app will then take a couple seconds to load. Once you've arrived at the Mobile App Home Screen, you will notice a Monstrance icon on the bottom of your screen with "Adoration" written below it." Tap your finger on the icon. This will send you to the next page where you press the tab that says "Sign up." Press on this tab to load Adoration Pro™ and the site will launch within the app.

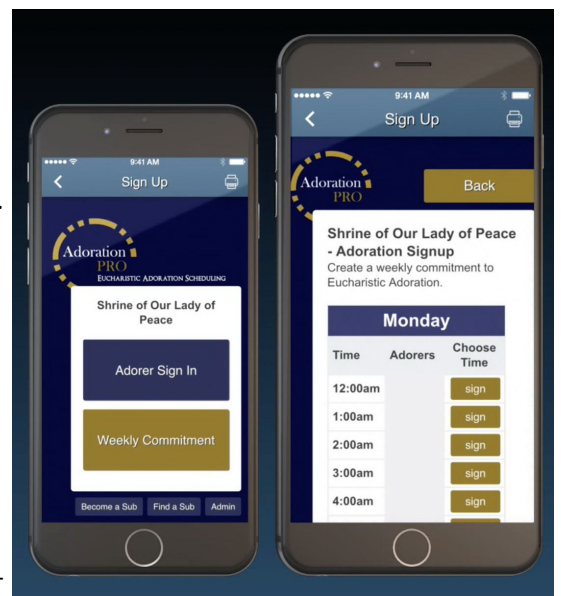
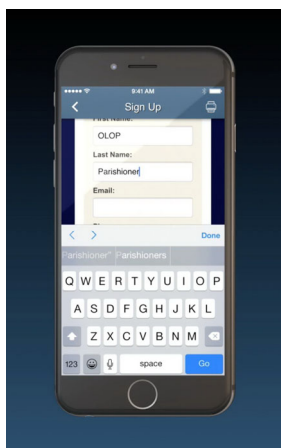
Browse within Adoration Pro™ and Select a Time

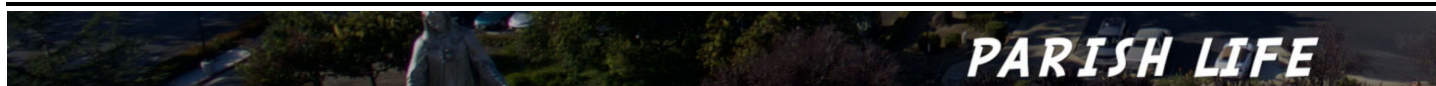

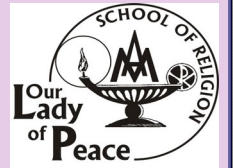
SEMS Take Home Trophy in Epic Clash

Teenagers

"THE TERM "TEENAGERS" IS NOT a particularly exact way to describe youth, because the span between thirteen and nineteen is too great. By seventeen generally the character of most youths is formed. (or should be formed) If one puts garbage into the stomachs of children, it will be easy to forecast their health; **if moral garbage is put into the minds of children, it is easy to predict how these ideas will become acts.**

Dr. Alexis Carrel says are the **two essential conditions for developing character: isolation and discipline.** Both of these come under the domain of **religion and morality.** As long as youths travel in herds with their eyes fixed on a one-octave banjo player, they are incapable of reconstructing themselves. As Dr. Carrel put it: **"A mode of life which imposes on everyone a constant effort, a psychological and moral discipline and privation, is necessary. An ascetic and mystical minority would rapidly acquire an irresistible power over the self-indulgent and spineless majority."** He goes on to say that **without this moral self-denial, the intelligence itself becomes anemic.** The problem then is not what to do with teenagers; it is **who will train them in the Ten Commandments and morality before they are sixteen and seventeen.**

Every adult forgets that he was once a teenager. Teenage is like death; you cannot thoroughly understand it until you have passed through it. It is **an age where one is torn between the desire to express one's own individuality, and yet to be identical with everyone in the group.** That is why teenagers dress alike, talk alike, love the same music and the same dances.

Teenage is a "change of life," **a climactic period in which the biological drives which die later are now born with a tumultuous physiological and mental backwash.** The teenager is right, to some extent, in acting the way he does. He would go mad in this world if he did not react against it by doing mad things; he would be frustrated and neurotic if he accepted the values of a modern civilization which his parents hold so dear — such as the value that life is for making money. Teenagers like money, but do not want to make it the main goal of life. They are protesters without programs, reformers without policy, engines without fly-wheels, full of resentment against **an older generation which gave them ships but no ports.**

The teenagers protest not only against the social and political injustices, but in a certain sense against the religious world as well. Religion generally does not touch them. In some instances this is due to their own want of morals which thrive in the dark and shrink from the light of betterment. But, in some cases, **is it not because those in religion give more precepts than they do examples? If religion gives a code, youth wants to see that code lived out in the one who gives it.** One cannot throw a book at teenagers. They see too often **disproportion between the nobility of what religion teaches and the mediocrity of the lives of the teachers; so they excuse themselves from becoming involved.**

No one will ever convince teenagers by argument that they should know God and their souls. But let them **go out and love the poor, the great unwashed, the sick, and they will find both God and their souls.**
