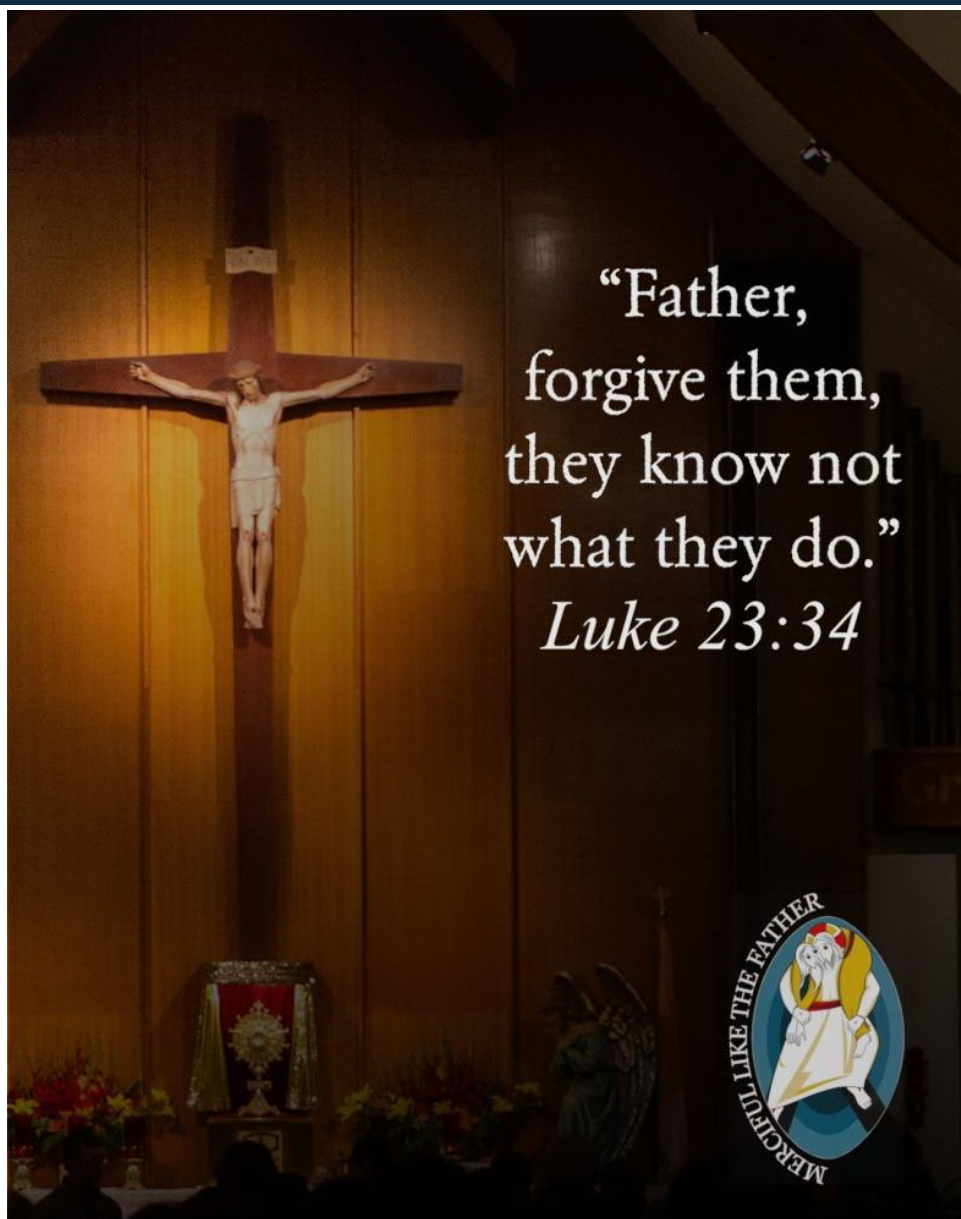

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

"Jesus' entry into Jerusalem manifested the coming of the kingdom that the King-Messiah was going to accomplish by the Passover of his Death and Resurrection. It is with the celebration of that entry on Palm Sunday that the Church's liturgy solemnly opens Holy Week." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 550. 2816)

This Palm Sunday in the Gospel that is read for the Procession of Palms we hear: Jesus proceeded on his journey up to Jerusalem (Lk 19:28) and twice in the reading of the Passion we are assured that our Lord underwent his passion in Jerusalem: first, when Pilate asked if the man was a Galilean; and upon learning that he was under Herod's jurisdiction, he sent him to Herod who was in Jerusalem at that time (Lk 23:7); and later on when in his way to Calvary our Lord spoke to the women: 'Daughters of Jerusalem do not weep for me; weep instead for yourselves and for your children.' (Lk 23:28)

Saint Thomas Aquinas in his Summa III Parts, question 46, article 10 asks the following question: Whether Christ suffered in a suitable place? And he poses the following objection: It would seem that Christ did not suffer in a suitable place. For Christ suffered according to His human nature, which was conceived in Nazareth and born in Bethlehem. Consequently, it seems that He ought not to have suffered in Jerusalem, but in Nazareth or Bethlehem.

To which he answers:

"According to the author of De Qq. Vet. et Nov. Test., qu. Iv, "the Savior did everything in its proper place and season," because, as all things are in His hands, so are all places: and consequently, since Christ suffered at a suitable time, so did He in a suitable place."

And concerning the objection, he says:

"Christ died most appropriately in Jerusalem. First of all, because Jerusalem was God's chosen place for the offering of sacrifices to Himself: and these figurative sacrifices foreshadowed Christ's Passion, which is a true sacrifice, according to Ephesians 5:2: He hath delivered Himself for us, an oblation and a sacrifice to God for an odor of sweetness. Hence Bede says in a Homily (xxiii): "When the Passion drew nigh, our Lord willed to draw nigh to the place of the Passion"—that is to say, to Jerusalem—whither He came five days before the Pasch; just as, according to the legal precept, the Paschal lamb was led to the place of immolation five days before the Pasch, which is the tenth day of the moon.

Secondly, because the virtue of His Passion was to be spread over the whole world, He wished to suffer in the center of the habitable world—that is, in Jerusalem. Accordingly, it is written (Psalm 73:12): But God is our King before ages: He hath wrought salvation in the midst of the earth—that is, in Jerusalem, which is called "the navel of the earth" [Cf. Jerome's comment on Ezekiel 5:5].

Thirdly, because it was specially in keeping with His humility: that, as He chose the most shameful manner of death, so likewise it was part of His humility that He did not refuse to suffer in so celebrated a place. Hence Pope Leo says (Serm. I in Epiph.): "He who had taken upon Himself the form of a servant chose Bethlehem for His nativity and Jerusalem for His Passion."

Fourthly, He willed to suffer in Jerusalem, where the chief priests dwelt, to show that the wickedness of His slayers arose from the chiefs of the Jewish people. Hence it is written (Acts 4:27): "There assembled together in this city against Thy holy child Jesus whom Thou hast anointed, Herod, and Pontius Pilate, with the Gentiles and the people of Israel."

Today, as we celebrate this Palm Sunday, let us spiritually follow the Incarnate Word who so much willed to deliver Himself up to save us and meditate more profoundly on all the details surrounding his Passion.

St. Gemma Galgani said: "Every day I make a meditation, but always on the Passion. If I did not do so, it would seem to me that Jesus would reprove me thus: 'See, My daughter, here I am on the Cross, through love, a victim for your many faults. Consider well My sufferings, and then deny Me, if you can, the tender compassion that I deserve.'"

I fervently pray and ask you to join me in prayer, for a spiritually fruitful Holy Week.

DIVINE MERCY MOVIE & FUNDRAISER FOR WYD2016 PILGRIMAGE



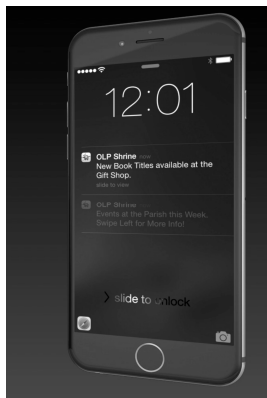

Teenage Sensitiveness

"IT IS TOO BAD THAT TEENAGERS cannot write good autobiographies so that their keen sensitiveness would be revealed. But this is asking too much, since such **writing requires standing off and viewing oneself from a distance and the perspective of time.** Furthermore, as one ages one develops more humility and with it the ability to laugh at one's mistakes. **We see others long before we see ourselves.**



Standards are built into the life of teenagers, and conformism is rigid. The dread of not being like others makes them fearful of using their own judgment, of listening to an inner voice or of ever making a self-appraisal apart from the mob. There is a market price that is fixed, and every teenager must sell himself at that figure.

But, at the same time, the teenager has another drive which is the opposite of conformism. It is a desire to be **an emerging personality**, not a rubber stamp. His conformism is in part aided by a **rebellion against being molded by elders**, but **his emerging individuality makes him sometimes wish he could be different.** The truth is, there is one sense in which **the self most discovers itself and that is: in serving and loving others.** When does a teenager become more conscious of his personality than after he has forgotten it by volunteering in a hospital, teaching dropouts, cleaning up slums and mowing the old widow's lawn? When his heart says, **"I want to be for others,"** that is the moment when his sense of dignity and worth is at its peak.

The happy teenager is the one who **balances this tendency to be absorbed in the lives of others, with the opposite drive to emerge as a unique person.** This happens when teenagers are open to insights which persons other than their peers may give them about themselves.

A teenager rarely gets any correction after childhood. If a parent does give it, the answer invariably is, "But look what you do! You are not so faultless," as if the fault in another canceled out the fault in self. Elders, too, may be to blame by concentrating on the fault: **"Look what you have done now," instead of inspiring confidence by saying, "What can we do now?"**

The reconciliation of this contradiction in teenagers, to surrender oneself to the mob as a drop of water in a glass of wine, and to want "to be me" with no regard for others, is that **Divine injunction: "Love your neighbor as yourself."** "As yourself" implies a degree of self-love, self-respect, but instead of crawling inside a shell of egotism, one is to **direct this personality outward, serving humanity and especially the poor.** No one appreciates a final spiritual liberation so much as the one who has long been imprisoned in defeat and despair, and then discovers his true freedom. 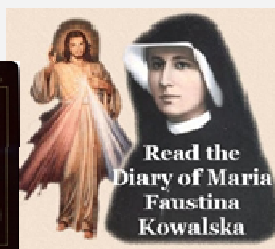

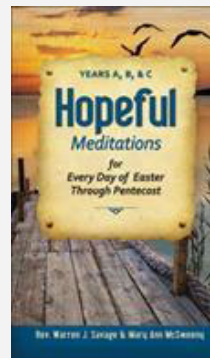
