From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Today's Gospel begins by saying: At that time, Jesus revealed himself again to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. (Jn 21:1)

On the occasion of a General Audience of 1998, St. John Paul II explained our belief that one day, our body will also share in the Resurrection of our Lord. He began quoting the Apostle St. Paul: "Our commonwealth is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will change our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power which enables him even to subject all things to himself. (Phil 3: 20-21). And then he continued saying: "The witness of the New Testament emphasizes first of all the realism of the Resurrection, corporal as well, of Jesus Christ. The Apostles explicitly attest to this when referring to their experience of the risen Lord's appearances: God raised him on the third day and made him manifest ... to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead (Acts 10:40-41). The fourth Gospel also stresses this realism when, for example, it recounts the episode in which the Apostle Thomas is invited by Jesus to put his finger in the mark of the nails and his hand in the Lord's pierced side (cf. Jn 20: 24-29). And in the appearance at the shore of the Sea of Tiberias," today's gospel, "the risen Jesus took the bread and gave it to them, and so with the fish. (Jn 21: 13).

The realism of these appearances -argues the Holy Father- testifies that Jesus rose with his body and lives with this body at the Father's side. However, it is a glorious body that is no longer subject to the laws of space and time, transformed in the glory of the Father. In the risen Christ we see revealed that eschatological state which all those who accept his Redemption are one day called to reach, preceded by the Blessed Virgin who, "when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory." (Pius XII, Apost. Const. Munificentissimus Deus, 1 Nov. 1950, DS 3903; cf. Lumen gentium, n. 59)"

Referring to the account of creation in the book of Genesis and interpreting Jesus' Resurrection as the "new creation," the Holy Father quoting the Apostle Paul: "The first man Adam became a living being; the last Adam became a life-giving spirit (1 Cor 15: 45) argued that "in a mysterious but real way, all who believe in Christ share in his glorified reality through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit."

"Thus, in Christ 'all will rise again with the bodies which they now bear' (Fourth Lateran Council, DS 801), but this body of ours will be changed into a glorious body (cf. Phil 3: 21), into a spiritual body (1 Cor 15: 44). When some ask Paul: 'How are the dead raised? With what kind of body do they come?', he answers them in the First Letter to the Corinthians, using the image of the seed which dies in order to open into new life: What you sow does not come to life unless it dies. And what you sow is not the body which is to be, but a bare kernel, perhaps of wheat or of some other grain.... So it is with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable, what is raised is imperishable. It is sown in dishonor; it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness; it is raised in power. It is sown in a physical body; it is raised in a spiritual body.... For this perishable nature must put on the imperishable, and this mortal nature must put on immortality (1 Cor 15: 36-37, 42-44, 53)."

Certainly, as the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains, "how" this will come about "exceeds our imagination and understanding; it is accessible only to faith. Yet our participation in the Eucharist already gives us a foretaste of Christ's transfiguration of our bodies" (n. 1000).

On this, Saint Irenaeus teaches: "Just as bread that comes from the earth, after God's blessing has been invoked upon it, is no longer ordinary bread, but Eucharist, formed of two things, the one earthly and the other heavenly: so too our bodies, which partake of the Eucharist, are no longer corruptible, but possess the hope of resurrection."

Thus, St. John Paul II stated that "through the Eucharist Jesus gives us, under the appearances of bread and wine, his flesh which is enlivened by the Holy Spirit and gives life to our flesh, so that we can share in his Resurrection and state of glory with all our being, spirit and body."

May our Lady, Mother of the Risen Christ, grant us from our Lord the grace to answer as the Apostle Peter in today's Gospel: Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you, and to hear our Lord saying to us: Follow me.

Setting the Record Straight: Diocese of San Jose's property in Morgan Hill

On March 10, the **San Jose Mercury News** printed an editorial that was critical of future development of land in the southeast quadrant of Morgan Hill. The Diocese of San Jose owns 40 acres that has been purchased for the future Saint John XXIII College Preparatory High School. In stating its editorial opinion, the Mercury erroneously reported that the Diocese had previously purchased and sold another piece of land in Morgan Hill, implying that the Diocese would likely do the same with the 40 acres. In fact, the Diocese never owned that land, only the 40 acres in the south-east.

On March 11, the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) voted to deny applications for development on # of acres, including the site of Saint John XXIII. In doing so, LAFCO effectively shut the door for this and any other development in the near future.

Although the Mercury printed a "correction" the following day, most readers were not aware of the error or that the newspaper had not done due diligence in establishing the facts.

As for the future, Bob Serventi Chief Financial Officer for the Diocese, affirms that the land will continue to be held for use for a Catholic high school.

The Council of Priests asked that a statement be developed to explain the latest development with the land that has been purchased for the future Saint John XXIII College Preparatory High School in Morgan Hill. Given Palm Sunday and Easter, it was not opportune for this statement to be released until now.

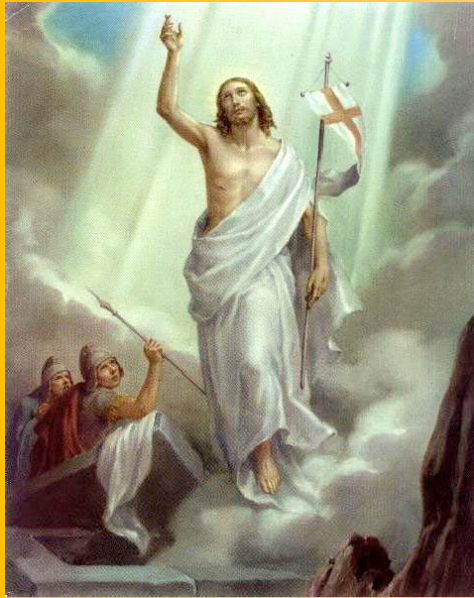

Teenage Respect

"SOME PARENTS COMPLAIN THAT their teenage children never obey them; other parents deny that they have any difficulties in this area. Why the difference? The difference is not always in the children, as is too often assumed; it may lie in the parents. The rebellion against the authority of the elders is not always because teenagers are opposed to authority, but rather because of those who administer authority. St. Thomas Aquinas, one of the greatest philosophers who ever lived, gave this rule in Latin which is worth quoting: "*Ex reverentia praecipientis procedere debet reverentia praecepti*" (The respect that one has for a rule flows from the respect that one has for the one who gives it).

Little children never have any difficulty in accepting the authority of their parents. "My daddy told me" is their final word on any subject. Later on, when the little boy becomes a teenager, there is not that same spontaneous acceptance of parental authority; there must be added another reason for parental respect, and that is the moral worth of the one who gives it. Where there is love, because of the nobility of the character of the parents, there is obedience.

Our Blessed Lord based obedience to His Commandments upon love: "If you love Me, you will keep My Commandments." Before He gave Peter the authority to rule over His lambs and sheep, He asked him three times, "Do you love Me?" Once there was a love admitted for Christ on the basis of His conquest over evil, then there would be no question whatever of obedience to His commands.

When a teacher lacks that moral and intellectual value which commands respect, disobedience results. The rise of juvenile delinquency is in direct proportion to the decline of moral values among the parents. If the parents of teenagers are intemperate, given to alcoholism, infidelity, quarreling, and fighting, what can be expected of the children? If parents have made second marriages, with first spouses still living, it is impossible for these parents to say to their children, "You must keep your word and never break it"; the children know they have already broken a word concerning loving unto death. It will not do for alcoholic parents to say, "You must not drink," if the children have seen either of the parents drunk.

On the contrary, when parents set a worthy example for their children, obedience is not rendered by the children because of a fear of punishment, but rather because they would not hurt those whom they love. The commandment of God: "Thou shalt honor thy father and thy mother," implies honor in the parents. Honor is a recognition of the excellence of someone.

It would be quite wrong always to blame the children for failure to honor their parents. Honor and dishonor, love and aversion, respect and disgust are born in them according to what they see in their parents. To parents who have not given good example, the teenagers must be given this counsel: The last generation has failed you; but you must not fail the next generation."
