From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

At the end of today's Gospel reading we hear the Incarnate Word saying: The Father and I are one. (Jn 10:30)

In his General Audience on March 1999, St. John Paul II commenting on this Gospel, explained: "Jesus enjoys a very special relationship with "his" Father through his words and actions. John's Gospel stresses that what he communicates to men is the fruit of this intimate and extraordinary union: The Father and I are one (Jn 10:30). And again: All that the Father has is mine. (Jn 16:15) There is a reciprocity between the Father and the Son in what they know of each other (cf. Jn 10:15), in what they are (cf. Jn 14:10), in what they do (cf. Jn 5:19; 10:38) and in what they possess: Everything of mine is yours, and everything of yours is mine. (Jn 17:10). It is a reciprocal exchange which finds full expression in the glory Jesus receives from the Father in the supreme mystery of his Death and Resurrection, after he himself had given it to the Father during his earthly life: Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son that the Son may glorify you.... I glorified you on earth ... and now Father, glorify me in your own presence ... (Jn 1:1, 4f.).

"This essential union with the Father" -continues the Holy Father- "not only accompanies Jesus' activity, but defines his whole being. "The Incarnation of God's Son reveals that God is the eternal Father and that the Son is consubstantial with the Father, which means that, in the Father and with the Father, the Son is one and the same God." (CCC, 262) As you know, it is precisely to this divine claim that the religious leaders of the people react, for they cannot tolerate Jesus saying that God is his Father and therefore making himself equal to God.

[...] "It is the Father who is the absolute principle in Trinitarian life," says John Paul II, "the one who has no origin and from whom the divine life flows. The unity of the three Persons is a sharing in the one divine essence, but in the dynamism of reciprocal relations that have their source and foundation in the Father. "It is the Father who generates, the Son who is begotten, and the Holy Spirit who proceeds." (Fourth Lateran Council: DS 804)

Now, we've read St. John's first Letter where he proclaims: God is love (1 Jn 4:8). "This summit of revelation indicates that God is agape, that is, the gratuitous and total gift of self which Christ proved to us, especially by his death on the Cross. The Father's infinite love for the world is revealed in Christ's sacrifice (cf. Jn 3:16; Rom 5:8). The capacity to love infinitely, to give oneself without reserve or measure, belongs to God. By virtue of his being Love, even before his free creation of the world he is Father in the divine life itself: a loving Father who generates the beloved Son and gives rise with him to the Holy Spirit, the Person- Love, the reciprocal bond of communion."

On this basis we understand the equality of the three Divine Persons: "The Son and the Spirit are equal to the Father, not as autonomous principles, as though they were three gods, but because they receive the whole divine life from the Father, and are distinct from him and from one another only in the diversity of their relations." (cf. CCC, 254)

In front of this mystery, the Holy Pontiff exclaims: "A great mystery, a mystery of love, an ineffable mystery, before which words must give way to the silence of wonder and worship. A divine mystery that challenges and involves us, because a share in the Trinitarian life was given to us through grace, through the redemptive Incarnation of the Word and the gift of the Holy Spirit: Anyone who loves me will be true to my word, and my Father will love him; we will come to him and make our dwelling-place with him. (Jn 14:23)"

"For us believers," concludes the Holy Father, "the reciprocity between the Father and the Son thus becomes a principle of new life which enables us to participate in the very fullness of the divine life: Whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God, God abides in him, and he in God. (1 Jn 4:15)"

Let us pray to our Blessed Mother, Temple of the Most Holy Trinity, that we may grow each day in communion with the Divine Persons and that we may remain faithful to God's grace, so that we may always follow the Lamb who will lead us to springs of life-giving water. (Rev 7:17)

Teenage Love

"Here are some questions teenagers must ask themselves to sharpen their understanding:

1) **"Am I in love with a person, or am I in love with love?"** There are certain experiences which are absolutely new to youth. Because they are associated with the glands, the blood cells and generally with what are called **passions, they force themselves upon youth with a violence and intensity which are apt to destroy reason and judgment.**

2) **"Do I realize that sex is replaceable, but love is not?"** The mere enjoyment of passion as such can be indifferent to persons in its grip, but love can never be indifferent. No one can ever take the place of a mother, a father or a best friend. When they are gone, the niches empty for the rest of life. **If a person is loved, rather than the emotion,**

then that person is loved without change or alteration "until death do us part!"

3) **"Do I think that the passion and the romantic feeling I have for a 'steady' now will endure with ever-increasing depth and intensity?"** If this be true, why don't the parents of teenagers act toward one another like teenagers act toward one another? It is doubtful that the teenager has a power which no adult ever possessed. But the teenager assumes that passion is something that will enrich the organism through life, will fill it with endless transports, ever more intense and gratifying. Therefore, **one has to make sure that it is a person and not a "thrill" that one loves.**

4) **"If I fall in love with an 'ideal,' will I marry a 'fact'?"** The ideal has the nature of the infinite about it; because it is a dream, it surrounds itself with the dimension of eternity and unending bliss. Nothing sets a limit to a dream. **But I marriage, the ideal begins to be a fact; what was the ideal becomes "cabined and cribbed and confined."** The great luminous desire is now reduced to a concrete image. The fog has lifted.

In other words, every woman promises a man that which God alone can give; every man promises a woman that which God alone can give. **They are right in having the ideal; they are wrong in thinking that the other partner can give what heaven reserves for itself alone. The best of human love is only a spark which fell from the great Flame of Love, which is God.** Marriage is not an experience in which there is an exchange of mutual egotisms, and in which the bond lasts only as long as the other gives a thrill; rather it is a **symbol of a great mystery—the mystery of God Who fell in love with man and took upon Himself a human nature-forever. Marriage representing that eternal union, therefore lasts "until death do us part."**
