From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Our second reading for today concludes saying: The One who sat on the throne said, 'Behold, I make all things new.' (Rev 21:5) What is the meaning of this "making all things new"?

On April 15, 2001, John Paul II marvelously explained in the meaning of St. John's statement in the Book of Revelation. He said: "On that tragic Friday of the Passion, which saw the Son of man become obedient unto death, even death on a cross (Phil 2:8), the earthly phase of the Redeemer's life came to a close. Now dead, he was hurriedly placed in the tomb, at the setting of the sun. A singular sunset! The ominous darkness of that hour signaled the end of the "first act" of creation, convulsed by sin. It seemed like the victory of death, the triumph of evil. Instead, while the tomb lay in cold silence, the plan of salvation was approaching its fulfillment, and the "new creation" was about to begin. Made obedient by love even to the extreme sacrifice, Jesus Christ is now "exalted" by God, who has bestowed on him the name which is above every name (Phil 2:9). In this name every human life recovers hope. In this name human beings are freed from the power of sin and death and restored to Life and to Love.

"On this day heaven and earth sing out the ineffable and sublime "name" of the Crucified One who has risen. Everything appears as before, but in fact nothing is the same as before. He, the Life that does not die, has redeemed every human life and reopened it to hope. The old has passed away, behold, the new has come (cf. 2 Cor 5:17). Every project and plan of this noble and frail creature that is man has a new "name" today in Christ risen from the dead, for "in him all creation rises to new life". The words of Genesis are fully fulfilled in this new creation: Then God said: 'Let us make man in our image, after our likeness' (Gen 1:26). At Easter, Christ, the new Adam, having become a life-giving spirit (1 Cor 15:45), ransoms the old Adam from the defeat of death."

"Men and women of the Third Millennium," continued the Holy Father, "the Easter gift of light that scatters the darkness of fear and sadness is meant for everyone; all are offered the gift of the peace of the Risen Christ, who breaks the chains of violence and hatred. Rediscover today with joy and wonder that the world is no longer a slave to the inevitable. This world of ours can change! [...] Men and women of every continent, draw from his tomb, empty now forever, the strength needed to defeat the powers of evil and death, and to place all research and all technical and social progress at the service of a better future for all."

Then, on another occasion the Holy Father referred to the central line of today's Gospel which we cannot overlook: I give you a new commandment: love one another (Jn 13:34), said our Lord. St. John Paul II said: "These words of Christ emanate great power. When he died on the Cross in his terrible Passion, humiliated and abandoned, he showed to the whole world the full meaning and depth of such trials. Watching Christ's agony, the disciples came to realize what it was he had called them to when he said: Love one another as I have loved you. In recording the event, Saint John would write in his Gospel: Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. (13:1) Christ loved us first of all, loved us despite our sinfulness and our human weakness. It was he who ensured that we became worthy of his love which knows no bounds and never ends. It is a love which is absolute and most perfect. Christ has in fact redeemed us with his Precious Blood.

To us too he has taught this love and to us he has entrusted it: "A new commandment I give you" (Jn 13:34). That means that this commandment is always pertinent. If we wish to respond to the love of Christ, we must respect its demands always, regardless of time and place: it must be for man a new way, a new seed which renews relations between people. This love makes us, who are disciples of Christ, new men, heirs of the divine promises. It ensures that we all become brothers and sisters in the Lord. It makes us of the new People of God, the Church in which we must love Christ and in him love each other in turn. This is the true love which shows itself in the Cross of Christ. We must all look to this Cross; towards it we must direct our desires and our efforts. In the Cross, we have the greatest of all models to imitate." (Homily, 06/10/1999)

May the Incarnate Word and his Most Blessed Mother sustain us in our dedication to building a more human world, a world soothed by the balm of Jesus' Love. May the Paschal Victim offered for our salvation grant that this commitment of ours will not falter.

Her House, Our Home: Planning the Future of Our Lady of Peace

The Family of Our Lady of Peace is embarking upon a journey that will help us shape the future of our Parish: Her House, Our Home: Planning the Future of Our Lady of Peace.

This journey is a visioning process focused on the future. What will be the church's needs? What facilities will we need to provide for these needs? What will be the defining character of these facilities, both buildings and outdoor spaces? How will we get there? This master planning and visioning create a roadmap to our future.

Thank you to the 450 people who took our survey last Fall, who participated in our parish meetings, and who welcomed the opportunity to build onto Monsignor Sweeny's vision for Our Lady of Peace Church. Since October 2015, the Boudreaux Group/HGA team have been researching and analyzing our campus, our church programs and ministries and, most importantly, listening to everyone's ideas and preferences. After summarizing data collected (full report available in the rectory), they are considering the potential of our church and campus to meet our growing space needs. In February, they met with a Core Team of parishioners and staff to review this information and understand the priorities born out of that research. In general, parishioners want to:

1st – Serve the Lord: New, Larger Church

The church is viewed fondly by all parishioners; however, there are challenges with the existing church that are beginning to impact the quality of the worship experience for many, specifically the need for more seating and more storage, while ensuring a holy, reverent atmosphere which is authentically Catholic, inspires the sacred and communicates that Christ is King, the Center.

2nd – Serve the Poor: New St. Vincent de Paul and Community Outreach Facility

Our parish wants to help those in need by having a facility that includes St. Vincent DePaul, a soup kitchen, counseling space, storage, clothing, classrooms, etc.

3rd – Serve the Children: Catholic School (CCD, K-8) and Expanded Education and Ministry Space for Youth, Young Adults and All Adults

Providing a traditional and affordable Catholic educa

tion is important to the parish and to the Santa Clara community. As Fr. Nieto stated, "How wonderful to hear the joyful sounds of children across the campus!" Nurturing the minds and souls of children is a calling to which the church is committed.

People want many more programs, ministries and events, which will require more classrooms and meeting space. Currently, we are limited on simultaneous events for adults and children due to a deficit in restrooms, lack of defined separation/required safety for children and lack of meeting rooms. In addition, the youth and young adults want space they can claim as their own, and parishioners want to be able to enjoy large meals together.

- New (bigger) Convent
- Improved Parking
- Improved Way Finding/Signage
- Improved Security/Safety

The Boudreaux Group/HGA team will return this May to present vision concepts and receive your additional input and ideas—this is important ensure we continue the plans established by Monsignor Sweeny and that we will always be a church and shrine dedicated to the greater glory of God and the salvation of souls and that we will always be a peaceful place of prayer and pilgrimage.

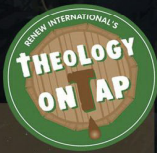

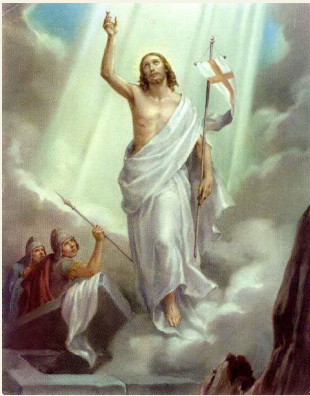
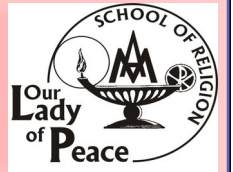

The Short Trip and the Long Haul

"How are we to find peace, release from tensions, surcease from an uneasy conscience and the sense of guilt and futility?

Two answers are possible to this problem of finding inner peace and happiness. One is through the **Short Trip**, the other the **Long Haul**. One is through the artificial destruction of reason and consciousness; the other is through a slow life process of self-denial and inner repose through union with the Ultimate.

The **Short Trip** strangely enough is usually taken by those who are **disgusted with life before they have even begun to live it**. They have refused to become adults... They carry plucked flowers because they cannot wait to plant or cultivate them.

Everything is plucked in that wild dash for immediacy. They cannot wait to finish college, so they become dropouts. Perpetual infants, they would break the lute to snare the music. Even passion becomes impulse, or "outlet seeking." The catharsis through self-abnegation which is essential for real expanded consciousness, is thwarted by a carping criticism of others. Pleading love for everyone, in their going around in "circles," they develop a hatred for "squares."

On the contrary, **happiness, peace and normal life come through the Long Haul**. The little spark of God that is in a man **requires a lot of blood, sweat and tears to fan into a flame**. The word "asceticism" is taken from the Greek word *askesis* which means **training**. It is just as vain to think one becomes a physical athlete artificially, as to believe that one becomes a spiritual athlete by any such lack of training. And above all, the **Long Haul demands reciprocity in love**. Unconscious love is not love. True mysticism has to indicate a tremendous amount of selflessness to be ready for that transcendental love the erring seek, but never find."

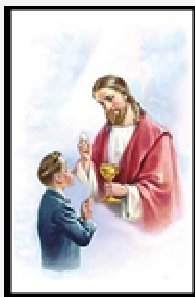

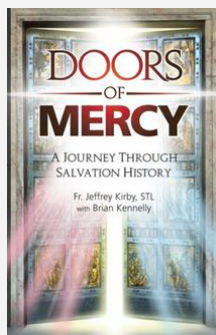

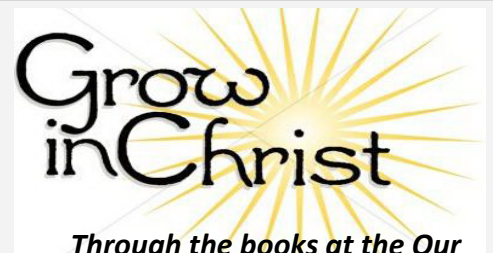
