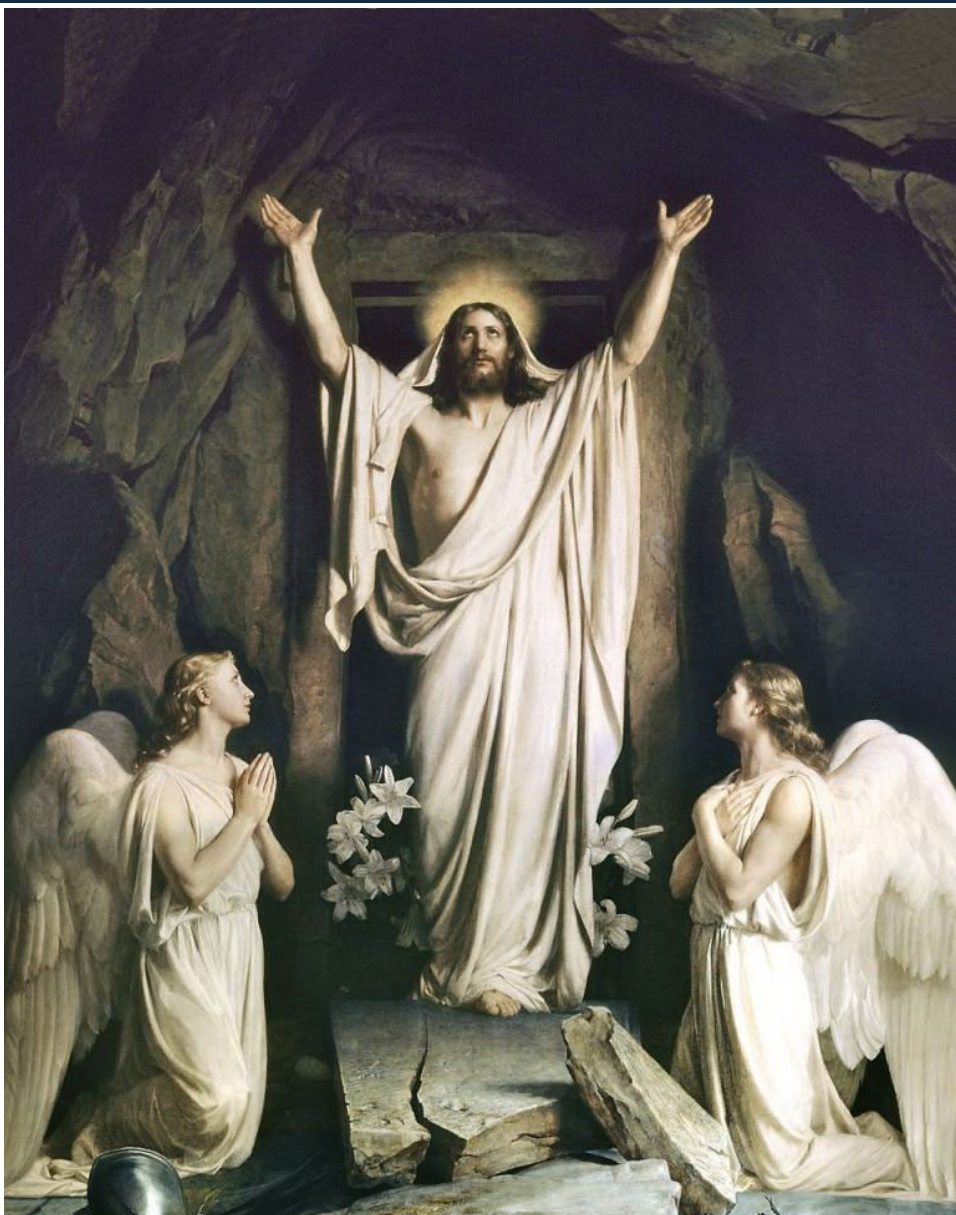

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

All the IVE Priests and Sisters serving at Our Lady of Peace Church and Shrine join in wishing you all a very happy and blessed Easter!

"We bring you the good news that what God promised to the fathers, this day he has fulfilled to us their children by raising Jesus. (Acts 13:32-33) The Resurrection of Jesus is the crowning truth of our faith in Christ, a faith believed and lived as the central truth by the first Christian community; handed on as fundamental by Tradition; established by the documents of the New Testament; and preached as an essential part of the Paschal mystery along with the cross.

The mystery of Christ's resurrection is a real event, with manifestations that were historically verified, as the New Testament bears witness. In about A.D. 56 St. Paul could already write to the Corinthians: I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the Twelve. . . (1 Cor 15:3-4) The Apostle speaks here of the living tradition of the Resurrection which he had learned after his conversion at the gates of Damascus.

Now, one of the striking elements of the resurrection of our Lord is the empty tomb. Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. (Lk 24:5-6) In itself it is not a direct proof of Resurrection; the absence of Christ's body from the tomb could be explained otherwise. Nonetheless the empty tomb was still an essential sign for all. Its discovery by the disciples was the first step toward recognizing the very fact of the Resurrection. This was the case, first with the holy women, and then with Peter. (Cf. Lk 24:3,12,22-23)

In today's gospel we read that the disciple whom Jesus loved affirmed that when he entered the empty tomb and discovered the linen cloths lying there, he saw and believed. (Jn 20:2, 6, 8) This suggests that he realized from the empty tomb's condition that the absence of Jesus' body could not have been of human doing and that Jesus had not simply returned to earthly life as had been the case with Lazarus.

After He rose from the dead our Blessed Lord appeared to several witnesses. Mary Magdalene and the holy women who came to finish anointing the body of Jesus, which had been buried in haste because the Sabbath began on the evening of Good Friday, were the first to encounter the Risen One. (Mk 16:1; Lk 24:1; Jn 19:31,42) Thus the women were the first messengers of Christ's Resurrection for the apostles themselves. (Cf Lk 24:9-10; Mt 28:9-10; Jn 20:11-18) They were the next to whom Jesus appears: first Peter, then the Twelve. Peter had been called to strengthen the faith of his brothers, and so sees the Risen One before them; it is on the basis of his testimony that the community exclaims: The Lord has risen indeed, and has appeared to Simon! (Lk 24:34,36)

As witnesses of the Risen One, they remain the foundation stones of his Church. The faith of the first community of believers is based on the witness of concrete men known to the Christians and for the most part still living among them. Peter and the Twelve are the primary "witnesses to his Resurrection", but they are not the only ones -Paul speaks clearly of more than five hundred persons to whom Jesus appeared on a single occasion and also of James and of all the apostles. (1 Cor 15:4-8; cf. Acts 1:22)

Given all these testimonies, Christ's Resurrection cannot be interpreted as something outside the physical order, and it is impossible not to acknowledge it as an historical fact. It is clear from the facts that the disciples' faith was drastically put to the test by their master's Passion and death on the cross, which he had foretold. The shock provoked by the Passion was so great that at least some of the disciples did not at once believe in the news of the Resurrection. For they had not believed the holy women returning from the tomb and had regarded their words as an idle tale. (Lk 24:11; cf. Mk 16:11,13) When Jesus reveals himself to the Eleven on Easter evening, he upbraided them for their unbelief and hardness of heart, because they had not believed those who saw him after he had risen. (Mk 16:14)" (Cf. Catechism of the Catholic Church, 638-643)

Help for Teenagers

"Perhaps a few suggestions would help:

1. Note the **difference between what happens to you and the way you react to what happens**. A little pimple appears on the nose and you go into a tailspin. Your emotions are running away with your reason. The emotional response must always be in proportion to that which prompted it, but never in excess of it. Every night, give yourself a few moments of quiet and force petty worries out of your mind.
2. Study those in school who are the most popular and those who are the most unpopular. Then ask yourself why? You will discover that **the popular boy or girl is the one who is pleasant to everyone, who gives a helping hand to others and who never talks about himself**. The unpopular youth is the one who high-hats almost everyone except his few friends, is sarcastic, and laughs at others' mistakes. **If you want to be loved, stop loving yourself, or feeling sorry for yourself.**
3. **Do not fall in love with an experience, but only with a person**. This is difficult during teenage, because girls like boys and boys like girls. They enjoy the contrast of masculinity and femininity. Love is really love only when the object is a person. The trick is to distinguish between the person and the experience of feeling in love which the other engenders. Experiences are replaceable, but persons are not. No one can take the place of your father or your mother. You will often find that what makes you flip is a look, a kind word, a bit of attention or the touch of a hand.
4. Grow up as quickly as you can, so that you do not fall in love either with masculinity or femininity. You have often heard about pinup girls. These pictures are sold by the hundreds of thousands, and they are all of the same girls. There is **a world of difference between loving the general and loving the particular**.
5. There are **two kinds of love: need love and gift love**. Need love is something every heart possesses. Just as the eye needs light, the ear sound and the stomach food, **so every heart needs love**. But **gift love is that which we bestow even when it is not needed**. If you saw a little child on the street and in danger of traffic, your gift love would urge you to save the life of the child. Gift love does not help us directly; it helps others. **Gift love makes us happier than being satisfied with need love**. If you are ever generous enough to understand gift love, then you can understand why God came down into the muck and dirt of human life to teach us love — the love that goes on loving even when it is not returned.

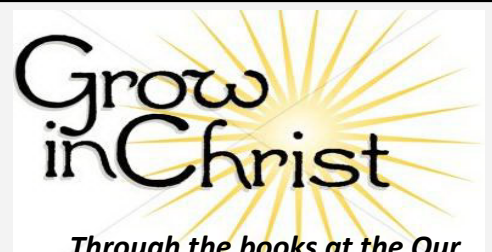
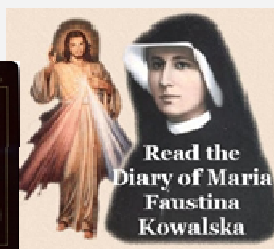


St. Faustina Prayer Book for the Holy Souls in Purgatory

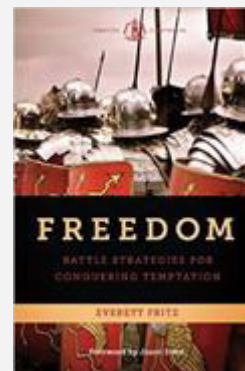
