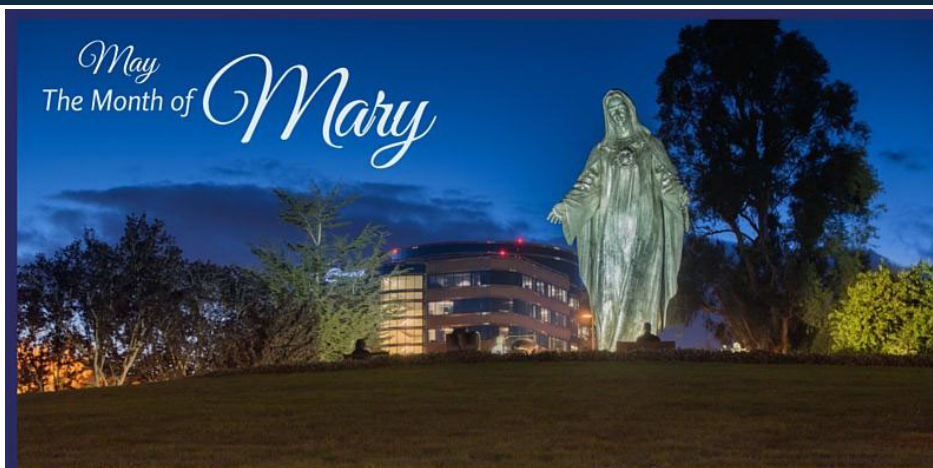

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

On this the Sixth Sunday of Easter we hear this consoling words from the lips of our Blessed Lord: Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid. (Jn 14:27)

Continuing with the teachings of St. John Paul II, I'd like to share with you some paragraphs of one of the Holy Father's homilies. This time, it's from one he delivered in Singapore, on November 20, 1996 whose message still radiates the light and warmth of this "servant of love and peace" as he introduces himself to the audience.

He said: "In today's Gospel, Jesus offers us this message of love and peace: If anyone loves me he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him and make our home with him. He goes on to say: My own peace I give you, a peace the world cannot give, this is my gift to you.

With these words, Jesus indicates once more that love constitutes the very heart of his mission from the Father: He, the Son, comes bringing love.

Love, then, is the most profound truth about God himself, because God is love. [...] Love constitutes the very essence of the teaching of Christ, for it is the greatest commandment. Life - the lives of all of us - must be based on love. Saint Paul demonstrates this to us in a practical way in the instructions contained in today's second reading taken from the Letter to the Romans: Let love be sincere, he says, hate what is evil, hold on to what is good; Love each other as much as brothers should, and have a profound respect for each other. Genuine human love is a faithful reflection of God's love. Therefore, love is characterized by a deep respect for all people, regardless of their race, belief or whatever makes them different from ourselves. Love responds generously to the needs of the poor, and it is marked by compassion for those in sorrow. Love is quick to offer hospitality and is persevering in times of trial. It is always ready to forgive, to hope and to return a blessing for a curse. Love does not come to an end."

[...] "Immediately after speaking of the Holy Spirit, Jesus says to his disciples: Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid.

Peace is the fruit of love. Peace is the fruit of the action of the Holy Spirit.

This peace is given - as a gift - in the Paschal Mystery of Christ.

Peacemaking is a task that is never finished, but always in progress, always in need of being confirmed and strengthened. We must constantly work for peace.

True peace begins in the mind and heart, in the will and soul of the human person, for it proceeds from genuine love of others. Indeed, it is true to say that peace is the product of love, when people consciously decide to improve their relationship with others, to make every effort to overcome divisions and misunderstandings, and if possible even to become friends.

As Christian, we know that we can love other only because God has first loved us. We find inspiration and strength in the words from the Prophet Jeremiah, where God says to us: I have loved you with an everlasting love, so I am constant in my affection for you. The everlasting love of God spurs us on in our efforts at peacemaking.

Peace requires justice, an attitude which recognizes the dignity and a firm commitment to strive to secure and protect the basic human rights of all. Where there is no justice there can be no peace. Peace is possible only where there is a just order that ensures the rights of everyone. ..."

May our Lady of Peace, graciously bring God's gift of peace to the conflicts of our lives and world. May her Son's mercy reign over us. May her consoling presence in our lives transform us into instruments of peace in our families and everywhere we go. Dear Brothers and Sisters, let love be sincere, hate what is evil, . . . Do all you can to live at peace with everyone.

Her House, Our Home: Planning the Future of Our Lady of Peace

The Family of Our Lady of Peace is embarking upon a journey that will help us shape the future of our Parish: Her House, Our Home: Planning the Future of Our Lady of Peace.

This journey is a visioning process focused on the future. What will be the church's needs? What facilities will we need to provide for these needs? What will be the defining character of these facilities, both buildings and outdoor spaces? How will we get there? This master planning and visioning create a roadmap to our future.

Thank you to the 450 people who took our survey last Fall, who participated in our parish meetings, and who welcomed the opportunity to build onto Monsignor Sweeny's vision for Our Lady of Peace Church. Since October 2015, the Boudreaux Group/HGA team have been researching and analyzing our campus, our church programs and ministries and, most importantly, listening to everyone's ideas and preferences. After summarizing data collected (full report available in the rectory), they are considering the potential of our church and campus to meet our growing space needs. In February, they met with a Core Team of parishioners and staff to review this information and understand the priorities born out of that research. In general, parishioners want to:

1st – Serve the Lord: New, Larger Church

The church is viewed fondly by all parishioners; however, there are challenges with the existing church that are beginning to impact the quality of the worship experience for many, specifically the need for more seating and more storage, while ensuring a holy, reverent atmosphere which is authentically Catholic, inspires the sacred and communicates that Christ is King, the Center.

2nd – Serve the Poor: New St. Vincent de Paul and Community Outreach Facility

Our parish wants to help those in need by having a facility that includes St. Vincent DePaul, a soup kitchen, counseling space, storage, clothing, classrooms, etc.

3rd – Serve the Children: Catholic School (CCD, K-8) and Expanded Education and Ministry Space for Youth, Young Adults and All Adults

Providing a traditional and affordable Catholic educa

tion is important to the parish and to the Santa Clara community. As Fr. Nieto stated, "How wonderful to hear the joyful sounds of children across the campus!" Nurturing the minds and souls of children is a calling to which the church is committed.

People want many more programs, ministries and events, which will require more classrooms and meeting space. Currently, we are limited on simultaneous events for adults and children due to a deficit in restrooms, lack of defined separation/required safety for children and lack of meeting rooms. In addition, the youth and young adults want space they can claim as their own, and parishioners want to be able to enjoy large meals together.

The Boudreaux Group/HGA team will return this May to present vision concepts and receive your additional input and ideas—this is important ensure we continue the plans established by Monsignor Sweeny and that we will always be a church and shrine dedicated to the greater glory of God and the salvation of souls and that we will always be a peaceful place of prayer and pilgrimage.

CHURCH ETIQUETTE

An Instructive Reminder

- Remember to keep your Eucharistic fast by abstaining from food and beverages (water excluded) for an hour before Mass.
- Always dress modestly and appropriately. Arrive early to allow for personal prayer and/or read the readings of the day.
- Turn off all mobile devices while still in the vestibule. This is your time with God and His people.
- Use the restroom before or after Mass. Men remove hats or caps before the Lord.
- Deposit all trash in it's proper place... a trashcan.
- Make the sign of the cross with Holy Water upon entering.
- Genuflect with great reverence towards the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle before entering your pew. If unable to genuflect, a profound bow is respectful.
- Refrain from chit-chat which distracts others who are connecting with God through prayer before Mass.
- Join the singing. St. Augustine said that "singing is praying twice." Singing with others gives great praise to God, which is really why we are gathered here.
- Listen to the readings. God is speaking directly to you.

- Receive Communion with laser-like attention. We receive Communion, we do not take it. If choosing to receive the Body of Christ in the hand, place the hand you write with under the hand you will receive, in a way, creating a throne for the Lord. A simple bow of the head to the Eucharist is appropriate as a sign of reverence to Christ before receiving.
- Don't forget to make a prayer of thanksgiving after receiving Communion
- Remember that the point of being at Mass is not to see what we can get out of it, but what you can do to praise and worship the Almighty.
- And finally, leave church only after the procession has left the altar. Only one person left the Last Supper early.

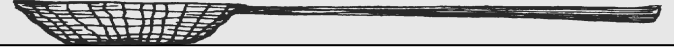

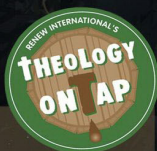

Youth and Their Contact Lenses

"I wonder if youth are not also having their view of the world distorted not just through teachers, but through their own neglect. Who is putting such distorting lenses on youth? What limits them to the present, the immediate? What narrows this vision so they see only their peers? What destroys their vision so that they cannot see the future? Where is life going? How is the morning greeted?"

In the absence of a target for the arrows of daily living, is there something which blinds them to the past? Revolutionary youth must realize that new things are not happening in the world; there are only the same old things happening to new people. There are only new labels attached to old ideas. The one course that every youth should take should be history, in order to know that the same mistakes were made in previous generations. Not to know what happened before one was born is to remain a child.

When everything is handed to a youth, there is danger that he will soon begin to believe that spiritual struggle is not necessary to build character. Only when he improves the development of his moral character does he begin to understand better the evil that is still left in him. But when a youth is declining morally, he understands his own badness less and less. We understand sleep only when we wake up. As C.S. Lewis says, *"Good people know about good and evil; bad people do not know about either."*

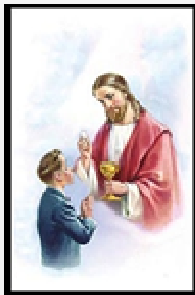

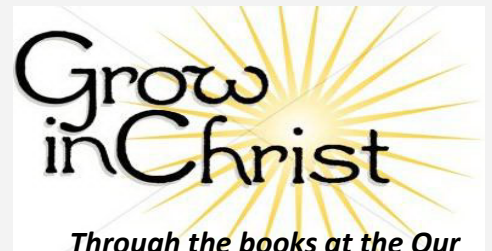

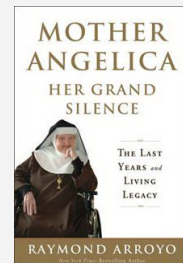
