From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the 'hierarchy of the truths of faith.' (GCD 43) The whole history of salvation is identical with the history of the way and the means by which the one true God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, reveals himself to men 'and reconciles and unites with himself those who turn away from sin.' (GCD 47)"

The Trinity is the distinctive, even peculiar Christian doctrine. Our belief in God separates us from Buddhists. Our belief in a personal God separates us from Hinduism and 'new-age mystics.' Our belief in the Trinity separates us from the Jewish, Muslims and Unitarians. It is the great defining doctrine of Christianity.

Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen delivered an address on March 16, 1930, where he skillfully explained the mystery of the Blessed Trinity. Later this address was compiled into a book called "The Divine Romance."

Here is an excerpt: "If God is the source of all life and truth and goodness in the world, He must have a will as well as an intellect, a love as well as a thought. It is a fact of nature that every being loves its own perfection. The perfection of the eye is color, and it loves the beauty of the sun setting in the flaming monstrosity of the west. The perfection of the ear is sound, and it loves the harmony of an overture of Beethoven or a sonata of Chopin.

Love has two terms: He who loves and he who is loved. In love the two are reciprocal. I love and I am loved. Between me and the one I love there is a bond. It is not my love, it is not his love, it is our love — the mysterious resultant of two affections, a bond, which enchains and an embrace wherein two hearts leap with but a single joy.

The Father loves the Son, the Image of His Perfection, and the Son loves the Father. Love is not only in the Father. Love is not only in the Son. There is something between them, as it were. The Father loves the Son, whom He engenders. The Son loves the Father, who engendered Him. They contemplate each other, love each other, unite in a love so powerful, so strong, and so perfect, that it forms between them a living bond. They give themselves in a love so infinite that, like the truth, which expresses itself only in the giving of a whole personality, their love can express itself in nothing less than a Person, who is Love.

Love at such a stage does not speak; does not cry; does not express itself by words, nor by canticles; it expresses itself as we do in some ineffable moments, by that which indicates the very exhaustion of our giving — namely, a sigh, or a breath. And that is why the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity is called the Holy Spirit or the Holy Ghost.

That breath of love is not a passing one like our own, but an eternal spirit. How all this is done, I know not; but I do believe on the testimony of the Word Incarnate that that Holy Spirit has been sent by God to rule His Church: But when he, the Spirit of truth is come, he will teach you all truth. And I believe that the continuous, unbroken succession of the truth communicated by Christ to His Church has survived to our own day; not because of the human organization of the Church, for that is carried on by frail vessels, but because of a profusion of the Spirit of Love over Christ's Vicar and all who belong to Christ's mystical body.

Three in one, Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; three persons in one God; one in essence, distinction of persons — such is the mystery of the Trinity, such is the inner life of God. Just as I am, I know, and I love and yet am one; just as the three angles of a triangle do not make three triangles but one; just as the heat, power, and light of the sun do not make three suns, but one; just as water, air, and steam are all manifestations of the one substance; just as the form, color, and perfume of the rose do not make three roses, but one; just as our soul, our intellect, and our will do not make three substances, but one; just as one times one times one times one, does not equal three, but one — so too in some much more mysterious way, there are three Persons in God and yet only one God."

The Family of Our Lady of Peace is embarking upon a journey that will help us shape the future of our Parish: Her House, Our Home: Planning the Future of Our Lady of Peace.

This journey is a visioning process focused on the future. What will be the church's needs? What facilities will we need to provide for these needs? What will be the defining character of these facilities, both buildings and outdoor spaces? How will we get there? This master planning and visioning create a roadmap to our future.

Thank you to the 450 people who took our survey last Fall, who participated in our parish meetings, and who welcomed the opportunity to build onto Monsignor Sweeny's vision for Our Lady of Peace Church. Since October 2015, the Boudreaux Group/HGA team have been researching and analyzing our campus, our church programs and ministries and, most importantly, listening to everyone's ideas and preferences. After summarizing data collected (full report available in the rectory), they are considering the potential of our church and campus to meet our growing space needs. In February, they met with a Core Team of parishioners and staff to review this information and understand the priorities born out of that research. In general, parishioners want to:

1st – Serve the Lord: New, Larger Church

The church is viewed fondly by all parishioners; however, there are challenges with the existing church that are beginning to impact the quality of the worship experience for many, specifically the need for more seating and more storage, while ensuring a holy, reverent atmosphere which is authentically Catholic, inspires the sacred and communicates that Christ is King, the Center.

2nd – Serve the Poor: New St. Vincent de Paul and Community Outreach Facility

Our parish wants to help those in need by having a facility that includes St. Vincent DePaul, a soup kitchen, counseling space, storage, clothing, classrooms, etc.

3rd – Serve the Children: Catholic School (CCD, K-8) and Expanded Education and Ministry Space for Youth, Young Adults and All Adults

Providing a traditional and affordable Catholic education is important to the parish and to the Santa Clara community. As Fr. Nieto stated, "How wonderful to hear the joyful sounds of children across the campus!" Nurturing the minds and souls of children is a calling to which the church is committed.

People want many more programs, ministries and events, which will require more classrooms and meeting space. Currently, we are limited on simultaneous events for adults and children due to a deficit in restrooms, lack of defined separation/required safety for children and lack of meeting rooms. In addition, the youth and young adults want space they can claim as their own, and parishioners want to be able to enjoy large meals together.

"The Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us." John 1:14



"Turning Off"

"Parents and teachers complain that as soon as they begin to talk about anything from cleanliness to morality their children **"turn me off."** College youths sometimes use the word "irrelevance" to give intellectual justification to rejection of courses which they do not wish to follow, e. g., "philosophy is irrelevant."

The Bible had another name for it; in relation to the Divine it was called **"hardening of the heart."** Hardening is not an open rejection of Divine claims, but a **trifling with conscience, until spiritual torpor sets in.**

Turning from Biblical language to psychology, "turning off has another name: it is **"repression"- that tendency to throw down into the subconscious mind impulses, thoughts and motivations that are unpleasant, or which run counter to our present way of life.** The subconscious mind then becomes like a wastebasket or an old closet, or even a cellar into which we toss rejected thoughts and impulses to get them out of the way. **Any repressed tendency which is thrust into a false oblivion actually continues to weigh on the mind, even though one may be unaware of it.** There is never self-expression without corresponding repression and vice versa. **The free expression of carnality of our day necessarily means repression of the spiritual. The flesh lusts against the spirit, and the spirit against the flesh. Religion, morality, self- discipline and decency have been driven underground into the subconscious in our present era. When the young "tune them out," they are actually pushing for the spiritual down into the lower depths of their minds.**

Today it is the fashion to poke fun at piety and the upholders of morality and order, but it is only a passing fancy. Pitirim A. Sorokin, the famous sociologist, has demonstrated that all societies revolve through a three-phase cycle: **sensuality, disintegration, and morality.** We are presently on the eve of the third."
