From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

The Catechism of the Catholic Church quoting St. Thomas Aquinas says: "That in the sacrament of the Eucharist are the true Body of Christ and his true Blood is something that 'cannot be apprehended by the senses but only by faith, which relies on divine authority.' (Cf. n. 1381) This is what we celebrate today!

Saint Peter Julian Eymard, the great apostle of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist once wrote: "This feast day of God, which the Church calls Festum sacratissimi Corporis Christi, (Feast of the Most Sacred Body of Christ), is the only day dedicated exclusively to the honor of His Adorable Person, of His living presence in our midst."

And he explains why: "The other feasts," he said, "commemorate some mystery of His past life; they are beautiful; they glorify God; and they are a rich source of graces for us. But after all they are only reminders, anniversaries of an already distant past, which relives only in our piety and devotion. Our Savior is no longer personally present in those mysteries; He accomplished them once for all and left only His grace in them. But Corpus Christi is an actual mystery; the object of this feast is our Lord's Person, living and present in our midst. That is why the celebration of it has a character all its own. No relics or symbols of the past are exposed, but the very object of the feast, which is living. In the countries where God is free, see how all the people proclaim His presence, how they prostrate themselves before Him! The impious themselves tremble and bow the head; God is there! How glorious for our Lord's presence is this feast, on which all men acknowledge His presence and adore Him!

Corpus Christi is also the most lovable of feast days. We were not present at all the mysteries of our Savior's life and death which we celebrate in the course of the year. We find joy in them because they are sources of grace. But on the feast of Corpus Christi we participate in the mystery itself, which takes place under our eyes. This mystery is for us." (The Real Presence)

And the saint continues saying: "Let this Feast therefore be one of joy, and let us expect from it the most abundant blessings. All the hymns and canticles of this solemnity express the thought that on this day our Lord will show Himself more gracious than ever." As many of you know, when the feast of Corpus Christi was added to the Church calendar in 1264, St. Thomas Aquinas wrote the liturgy for it. (The Tantum Ergo, O Salutaris Hostia, Panis Angelicus, etc. are some of the hymns he composed.)

One of the highlights of this Solemnity is the Corpus Christi procession.

Making reference to the Corpus Christi procession St. Peter Julian says: "People who have never set foot inside one of her churches think she [the Church] is widowed. They look upon her as a corpse, and upon her temples as places where only death and suffering are spoken of. But today the very ones who never attend her solemn festivals will see her in all her wealth and beauty, in a natural attractiveness which God, her Bridegroom, will enhance with His presence. What magnificence in the processions as they pass by! What reverence in the faithful as they kneel down! The Church shows to everyone her Bridegroom in the radiant monstrosity. Ah! Who today will presume to say she is widowed? Her friends are in adoration and her enemies tremble. Jesus shows Himself to all men; He gives His blessings to the good; He looks on sinners with compassion; He calls them and draws them to Himself. This Feast is also the triumph of the Church through her Divine Bridegroom."

Today, this is my prayer for all the members of the Family of Our Lady of Peace: "Let us believe, and believe firmly in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist! Jesus Christ is there! When we enter a church, a feeling of respect should come upon us, a respect of faith and love on meeting Jesus Christ in Person; for it is indeed He Whom we are meeting. Let that be our apostolate, and our preaching; since it is the most eloquent for all." (Cf. St. Peter Julian Eymard)

May we learn in the "school of Mary" to contemplate the face of Christ, and to contemplate it with Mary, as Pope John Paul II encouraged us to do, "for we are all called to abide in the presence of God."

CHURCH ETIQUETTE

An Instructive Reminder

- Remember to keep your Eucharistic fast by abstaining from food and beverages (water excluded) for an hour before Mass.
- Always dress modestly and appropriately. Arrive early to allow for personal prayer and/or read the readings of the day.
- Turn off all mobile devices while still in the vestibule. This is your time with God and His people.
- Use the restroom before or after Mass. Men remove hats or caps before the Lord.
- Deposit all trash in it's proper place... a trashcan.
- Make the sign of the cross with Holy Water upon entering.
- Genuflect with great reverence towards the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle before entering your pew. If unable to genuflect, a profound bow is respectful.
- Refrain from chit-chat which distracts others who are connecting with God through prayer before Mass.
- Join the singing. St. Augustine said that "singing is praying twice." Singing with others gives great praise to God, which is really why we are gathered here.
- Listen to the readings. God is speaking directly to you.

- Receive Communion with laser-like attention. We receive Communion, we do not take it. If choosing to receive the Body of Christ in the hand, place the hand you write with under the hand you will receive, in a way, creating a throne for the Lord. A simple bow of the head to the Eucharist is appropriate as a sign of reverence to Christ before receiving.
- Don't forget to make a prayer of thanksgiving after receiving Communion
- Remember that the point of being at Mass is not to see what we can get out of it, but what you can do to praise and worship the Almighty.
- And finally, leave church only after the procession has left the altar. Only one person left the Last Supper early.

"The Doubts of Youth"

"Doubt is either **healthy or unhealthy**. **Healthy doubt** is when one sees weaknesses as well as **strength in any position**. To love America and to believe in it is **not to be unmindful of the moral decline which is going on at the present time**, **not to be passive about arresting violence**. In religion, too, a **healthy doubt** is one which seeks to analyze and find proofs for a position. One of the healthiest doubts in the world is **to doubt oneself or the great inside truth of what you really are**. How wise am I? How learned? Do I allow prejudices to influence my thinking?

This brings us to **unhealthy doubt** by which we **destroy within ourselves the capacity to know truth, particularly religious truth**. **Faith, particularly in the young, is destroyed in two ways:**

1. A youth begins to doubt faith **when he develops his mind in secular subjects, but allows religious knowledge to remain at the level it was when he was ten years old**. A student who becomes proficient in physics, chemistry, and anthropology, but has allowed his Theology to remain the Sunday school mentality, will have **two disproportionate lobes in his brain**. One side grows to the size of the Empire State Building; the other is the size of a filling station. No wonder when the subject of faith comes up, looking down his nose at it, he dismisses it with a sneer: 'Oh, that belief is childish.'
2. A youth develops unhealthy doubt about religion **through immorality and an emphasis on sensate existence**. Excessive reading of romantic and pornographic literature also excites feelings to a point where one unconsciously forms a philosophy of life: "Anything is right if it gives me pleasure."

Grossness affects the practical intellect which makes judgments. Necessarily a youth will construct a philosophy of life to suit the way he lives. The youth who boldly claims he no longer accepts the Creed is nine times out of ten the one who rejected the Commandments. Unused muscles become atrophied; **unpracticed faith becomes doubt. We learn to walk by walking, we learn to write by writing, we learn to love by loving, we learn to believe by believing, **not in some abstraction, but in a Person. That is where the Christian Faith begins- with Christ.**"**
