From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Continuing with our reflections on Ecclesia de Eucharistia, this time I'll share some excerpts from its first chapter where Saint John Paul II writes about the Eucharist as the "Mystery of Faith."

"The Lord Jesus on the night he was betrayed (1 Cor 11:23) instituted the Eucharistic Sacrifice of his body and his blood." (11) The Pope reminds us that it was Jesus who instituted the Eucharist, which is the memorial of the Lord's death and Resurrection, and that each time the church celebrates the Eucharistic liturgy, the central event of our salvation becomes sacramentally but really present (cf. 11, 15).

The faith of the Church in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist goes back to the words of Jesus himself as recorded in the Gospel of Saint John. In the Eucharistic discourse after the multiplication of the loaves, our Lord contrasted ordinary bread with a bread that is not of this world, but which contains eternal life for those who eat it. He said, "I am the bread of life... I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world. (John 6:48, 51) "This is no metaphorical food: My flesh is food indeed, and my blood is drink indeed (Jn 6:55)," wrote the Holy Father.

The Holy Father, then, as if he cannot contain himself before such mystery pronounces his plea: "I wish once more to recall this truth and to join you, my dear brothers and sisters, in adoration before this mystery: a great mystery, a mystery of mercy. What more could Jesus have done for us? Truly, in the Eucharist, he shows us a love which goes to the end (cf. Jn 13:1), a love which knows no measure."

And he develops this aspect of the universal charity of the Eucharistic Sacrifice based on the words of Jesus himself. "In instituting it," wrote JP II, "He did not merely say: This is my body, this is my blood, but went on to add: which is given for you, which is poured out for you (Lk 22:19-20). Jesus did not simply state that what he was giving them to eat and drink was his body and his blood; he also expressed its sacrificial meaning and made sacramentally present his sacrifice which would soon be offered on the Cross for the salvation of all. 'The Mass is at the same time, and inseparably, the sacrificial memorial in which the sacrifice of the Cross is perpetuated and the sacred banquet of communion with the Lord's body and blood.'" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1382) Pope John Paul returns over and over again to this theme throughout each chapter of Ecclesia de Eucharistia.

Now, when we receive Holy Communion, we receive His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ. Thus, the Holy Pope says, "Christ also grants us his Spirit." And he quotes Saint Ephrem who wrote: "He called the bread his living body and he filled it with himself and his Spirit... He who eats it with faith, eats Fire and Spirit... Take and eat this, all of you, and eat with it the Holy Spirit. For it is truly my body and whoever eats it will have eternal life." (17)

The Church implores this divine Gift, the source of every other gift, in the Eucharistic epiclesis. For instance, "in the Roman Missal the celebrant prays: 'grant that we who are nourished by his body and blood may be filled with his Holy Spirit, and become one body, one spirit in Christ.' Thus by the gift of his body and blood Christ increases within us the gift of his Spirit, already poured out in Baptism and bestowed as a 'seal' in the sacrament of Confirmation." (Cf. 17) Something very important to consider as we prepare for Holy Mass and as we receive communion.

St. John Paul II also mentions that after consecration the assembly acclaims: "until you come in glory." Why? Because, he explains, "the Eucharist is a straining towards the goal, a foretaste of the fullness of joy promised by Christ (cf. Jn 15:11); it is in some way the anticipation of heaven, the 'pledge of future glory.'" (Cf. 18) Therefore, he said, "those who feed on Christ in the Eucharist need not wait until the hereafter to receive eternal life: they already possess it on earth... For in the Eucharist we also receive the pledge of our bodily resurrection at the end of the world: He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day (Jn 6:54)." (18)

LETTER FROM FR. NIETO, IVE

Dear friends,

Well, I guess time has arrived to say good-bye. But before we do that I just feel compelled to address you with a few words from my heart:

1. The first of them, as it cannot be otherwise, is: Thank you! Indeed. Thank you very much!

There is nothing more consoling for a Pastor than to see the people he serves draw closer to our Lord, to love our Blessed Mother so fervently as you do, to be daring to do great things for the sake of the Gospel, to see the little flock he has been entrusted build his spiritual life upon the solid foundation of our Lord in the Eucharist and our Lady and to give that tremendous witness of faith as you do. So, believe me, you have brought so much consolation to my priestly heart and have made my years among you very fruitful ones.

I felt that I was always able to count with you, that for anything we wanted to do, for any project I will always count with your support. You don't know what an invaluable help it is for a priest when the flock he shepherds walks with him.

Thanks to the IVE Sisters for their continuous support and generous self-giving in their service. Thanks to all the different parish groups -I won't mention them all, because surely I will forget some-; to all the beautiful families and their children that so much embellish our parish: Thank you so much!

Thanks to all those who are here today.

I'd like also to remember specially the members of our parish who are sick and home-bound. Please, assure them of my heartfelt thanks for their prayers and the sacrifices they offer and tell them that I keep them close to my heart.

Thank you once again! ...And I won't hide it: I will really miss being here!

2. Only God knows the sacrifice that this implies for me. But then I read the episode when our Lord called two of his disciples. You all remember it: As Jesus walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea – for they were fishermen. And he said to them, 'Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men.' And so, the apostles had the choice: to continue mending their nets or follow Him. But the Gospel continues: Immediately, they left their nets and followed him.

Perhaps the fishermen of Galilee would have preferred to stay there, on the shores of the Sea of Galilee, with their boat and their nets. But guided by the Lord, obedient to his inspiration, they went!

In my new role as General Superior it will be my task to care for and accompany closely our missionaries, especially those who are in difficult places. So I ask you earnestly to pray for me so that I too may be faithful and serve our Lord firmly in spirit of truth and holiness of life. Remember me today and always in your prayers! And please, continue to pray for and support our missions -and this mission- as you have always done, so generously. I count with you! ... And I know I won't be disappointed.

3. The precious family of Our Lady of Peace not only has a glorious history and legacy to pass on, but also a great history still to be accomplished! So in all these events -like in every event of our lives- we have to see the Providentially Merciful hand of God where everything works for the good of those who love him. (Rom 8:28) Therefore, I encourage you to look to the future, and with confidence let yourselves be guided by our Blessed Mother and the Incarnate Word, then, you will do even greater things. I am sure that you will continue to work with the same dedication and an ever greater zeal, side by side with the IVE priest who will succeed me, and my other brother priests. Take care of them as you took so good care of me!

My dear Family of our Lady of Peace, as Jesus says this Sunday's gospel: Do not be afraid for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom. (Cf. Lk 12:32) So walk steadfastly with an unshakable confidence in our Lord and our Blessed Mother. That is my final message to you all: strive to nourish and preserve a serene confidence in our Lord and our Lady. Always firm in your faith to Christ, the Incarnate Word, and faithful to his Church. Promised? ... I trust you.

In few weeks I leave the parish but I leave you with the tremendous gift of our Lady who with her outstretched arms is always offering repose and tenderness for our trouble lives, and to Her I have asked to wipe away the tears of your faces, to give you the word of reassurance you might need, to help you always to go forward keep you always close to her Heart. And I also leave with you the most outstanding gift of all: that of our Blessed Lord in the Eucharist where I will always like to find you gazing upon and where we will always be united.

Again I thank you wholeheartedly. Receive my most sincere appreciation for you having wished to attend this Mass. Please, know that I hold you very dear to my heart and that I will carry with me always the beautiful moments we've shared, and the beautiful smiles I'd like to see on your faces as I leave.

What else can I say? If everything that I could say would fade into insignificance compared with what my heart feels.

So let us leave aside words. Let there remain just a great silence before God, and let this silence become prayer, a prayer for each other and for all the members of this beloved parish.

I wish you the best Our Lady of Peace! May God bless you!

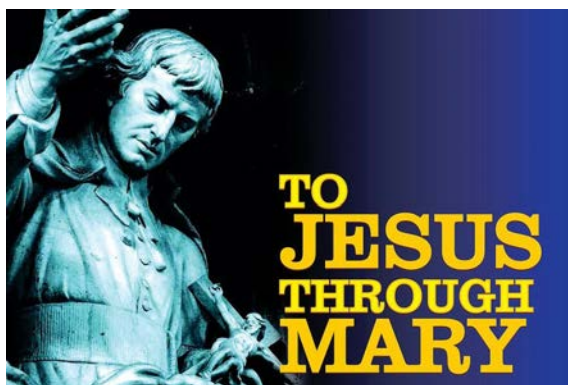


CELEBRATION OF THE NATIVITY OF THE BLESSED MOTHER

The Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary Program
at Our Lady of Peace Church and Shrine is based on St. Louis de Montfort's book True Devotion to Mary. This program consists of 33 days of prayer and exercises which help purify souls to prepare one for Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary.

In this program, there are two different periods assigned to these exercises:

- The first period includes 12 days of exercises employed in casting off the spirit of the world which is contrary to Jesus Christ
- The second period consists of 3 weeks: the first devoted to the Knowledge of Ourselves, the second devoted to the Knowledge of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the third devoted to that of Jesus Christ.

All Consecration Participants will consecrate together on November 19, the Vigil of the Feast of Christ the King at the 5pm mass at Our Lady of Peace Church & Shrine. Prayers can be recited at one's home if one is unable to go to the church.

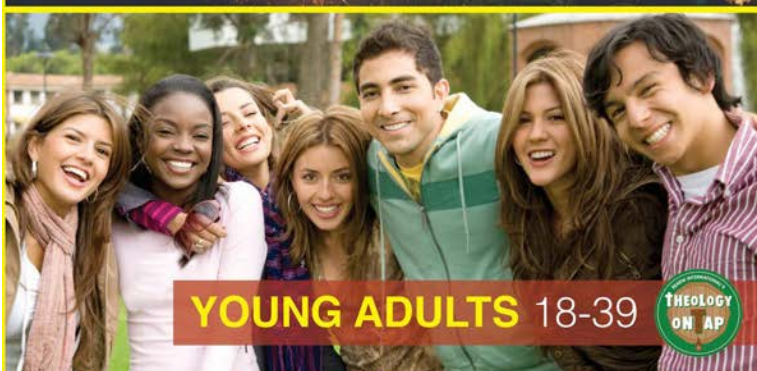

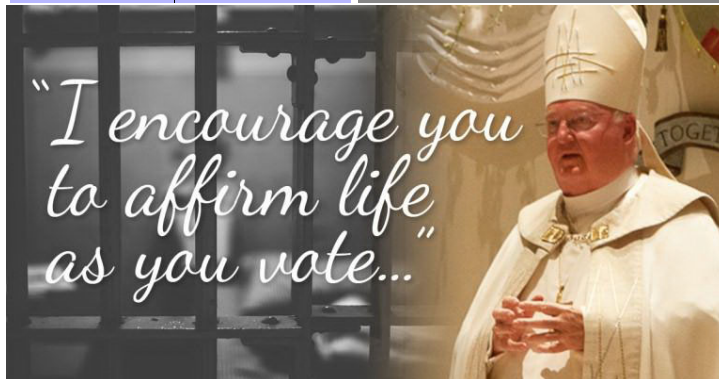

Bishop Patrick McGrath on Propositions 62 & 66

In these months before November, the electorate of California will prepare to cast ballots on a record number of propositions. Among these is Proposition 62, which would put an end to the death penalty, and Proposition 66, which seeks to expedite the application of the death penalty.

I join with the Bishops of California who favor Proposition 62 and oppose Proposition 66, and I appeal to Catholics of the Diocese of San Jose to do the same, to affirm that human life – all life – is a gift from God.

Society has the responsibility to protect the common good; however, the death penalty does not achieve this any more effectively than is possible within the prison system. In addition to this, the number of Death Row prisoners who have eventually been found to be innocent calls into question the viability of capital punishment. Among these is a disproportionate number who are members of minorities and/or the poor.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church echoes the teaching of popes, beginning with Saint John XXIII, against the death penalty. Most recently, Pope Francis declared that capital punishment “is an offense to the inviolability of life and to the dignity of the human person. . . It likewise contradicts God’s plan for individuals and society, and his merciful justice.”

I encourage you to affirm life as you vote in favor of Proposition 62, and against Proposition 66 on Nov. 8.
