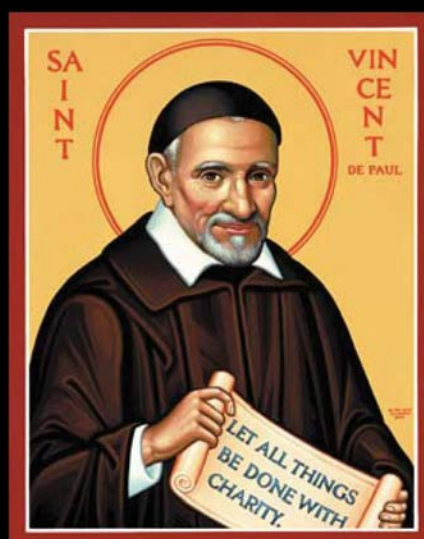

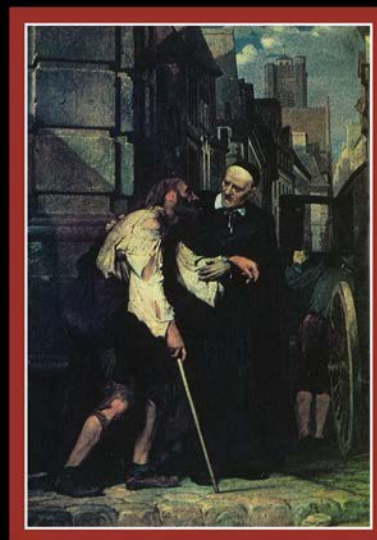

- Integrated formation of the person (spiritual, moral, intellectual and emotional)

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

You may be asking yourself, "Why this talk about the parish mission statement?" As I stated last week, the mission statement provides a concrete vision for each and every individual as well as different ministries and groups – placing us all on a common path and seeking a singular goal. I would add that it provides an important bond among members; for example, immediately linking those that are new (myself included) with those who have been here much longer. I think it will be helpful for us to see how this applies personally and what in particular do the parts of the statement mean.

There are two prominent sides to this whole mission statement thing: the mission statement itself and the one who is reading it.

Today, I would like to focus on the latter – the one who reads the mission statement, i.e., you. Why? Because I think that you (all of us included) must have a fuller understanding of who you are, in order to understand that the mission statement depends on you and how you depend on the mission statement.

Let us begin with being a disciple—a follower of our Lord Jesus Christ. As members of the Church, Jesus calls us to be disciples. You are a disciple of Christ. Has He not called us to take part in His mission and be His ambassadors, so that His Incarnation might be prolonged, through us receiving and giving according to His divine plan? If Jesus Christ thirsted for souls, should not a Christian also thirst? If He came to cast fire on the earth, should not a Christian be enkindled? The disciple contributes to this mission with the talents that God has given him or her, not because the plan sounds nice and there is an affinity with what is being accomplished; however, for the disciple, the sacrificial offering or contribution is a communion with the one sacrifice Jesus Christ and they trust is in God who alone is their Savior.

This is different than, for example, making a donation to the Boy Scouts for popcorn or to the Girl Scouts for cookies. Why do we buy the cookies? We make a donation because the cookies taste good (consumerism) or because it is my nephew who is selling popcorn(donation). We, as disciples, take part in the mission of Christ and this is an important distinction. Discipleship places the mission in our hands; we are personally integrated, through the tremendous gift of our baptism, into building up of the kingdom.

Therefore, the very mission statement is not something foreign or extrinsic to us, but it is part of our identity as disciples of Christ and members of Our Lady of Peace. It is a mission that we contribute to generously, sacrificially and proportionately according to the talents that we have been entrusted with by God. This is nothing other than being faithful stewards in God's kingdom, and particularly, here in the Silicon Valley.

Christ has called us to be his disciples, which is above all a standing invitation to friendship with him. I encourage you to look upon the mission statement again, with the eyes of a disciple or even better as a friend, who desires to contribute wholeheartedly to the mission that God has entrusted to our parish. God shares His salvific work with us and it is out of gratitude that we share with him, generously, sacrificially and proportionately, those gifts that He has entrusted to us in order to bring it about.

Mary, Our Lady of Peace, pray for us!

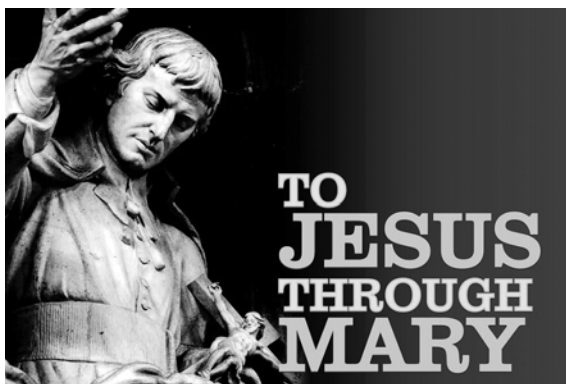

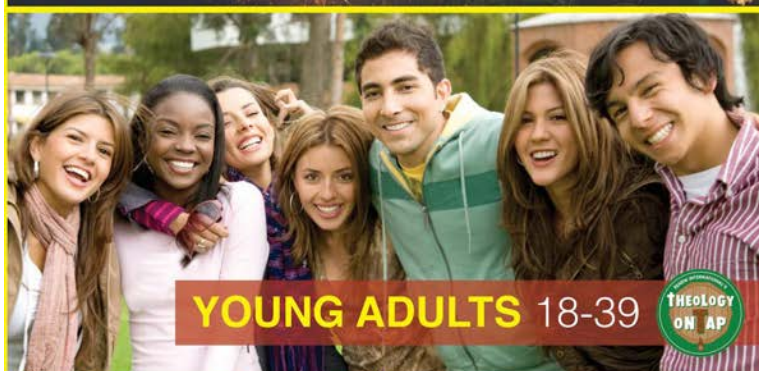

Bishop Patrick McGrath on Propositions 62 & 66

In these months before November, the electorate of California will prepare to cast ballots on a record number of propositions. Among these is Proposition 62, which would put an end to the death penalty, and Proposition 66, which seeks to expedite the application of the death penalty.

I join with the Bishops of California who favor Proposi-

tion 62 and oppose Proposition 66, and I appeal to Catholics of the Diocese of San Jose to do the same, to affirm that human life – all life – is a gift from God.

Society has the responsibility to protect the common good; however, the death penalty does not achieve this any more effectively than is possible within the prison system. In addition to this, the number of Death Row prisoners who have eventually been found to be innocent calls into question the viability of capital punishment. Among these is a disproportionate number who are members of minorities and/or the poor.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church echoes the teaching of popes, beginning with Saint John XXIII, against the death penalty. Most recently, Pope Francis declared that capital punishment “is an offense to the inviolability of life and to the dignity of the human person. . . It likewise contradicts God’s plan for individuals and society, and his merciful justice.”

I encourage you to affirm life as you vote in favor of Proposition 62, and against Proposition 66 on Nov. 8.
