Our Lady of Peace is a church and shrine dedicated to the greater glory of God and the salvation of souls.

- Frequent celebration of the Sacraments, particularly the Eucharist and Reconciliation
- Integrated formation of the person (spiritual, moral, intellectual and emotional)

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Our Lady of Peace is "a place of prayer and pilgrimage."

One might be tempted to rush past this little part of our mission statement, seeing it as a transition statement or introduction that leads us to the specific qualities of Our Lady of Peace. I think it is important, however, to highlight what this signifies.

Indeed, Our Lady of Peace is a place where people come and go, which also means where people are met and received; but these not just any "people," they are pilgrims. The very word parish derives from the Greek word *παροικία* (*paroikia*), meaning "a sojourning, dwelling in a strange land," or a place where pilgrims rest.

As a pilgrim, they are passing through in a state of travel (*homo viator*). As a sojourner, they are in search of something, looking for that which is lacking in their lives – whether it is to fill the void that has left their hearts empty, or to plead before Jesus and His Mother Mary to grant them a miracle, or simply to find a family or community of believers.

Whatever the case may be, people come here. We come here because our hearts are longing for Him. And He must be available and found when they come here to find Him. This speaks of the simple and common sense genius of Fr. Sweeny, "allow them to come and find the church open, and the priests in the confessionals, so they may find peace." Moreover, when they come, when we come, let us find Him in each one of us. We are the stewards of His gifts and therefore, just as the Lord makes Himself the source of rest and welcome for the pilgrim, the wayfarer and traveler, we too must offer the same, welcome and rest.

Since we are a place where pilgrims come and go, we must understand that we can meet them and receive them, i.e., practice hospitality. Christian disciples (stewards) should hold hospitality as one of their salient qualities. Why? Because it is an expression of reverence for human dignity, of love of God through our neighbor. There is an old Polish proverb that we learned in our recent World Youth Day pilgrimage to Krakow that states: "A guest coming into house - God coming into house."

To put it simply, hospitality can be understood as "Christian kindness." We, by our Christian discipleship, ought to know and care about each other, to share a deep sense of belonging, to welcome the stranger and to follow-up with them. In this way, the pilgrim who comes to encounter Christ and is searching for what is lacking in the world – they find it in us. We no longer live, but Christ lives in us (Gal 2,20). Is it possible for there to be a living faith, while lacking in Christian kindness? And part of this means helping others to practice this. So, for the one or two of you who read this little column, it is your job to teach others that we must meet, greet, and follow-up with the person sitting next to us or with the person who is standing in back or outside hesitantly looking inside. We must choose to welcome them, because they are worth it, their soul is worth my time!

A retired bishop from my home diocese of Wichita, Bishop Eugene Gerber would say: "Stewardship is a decision of the will not a feeling, although good feelings often follow. We can't wait for our attitudes regarding stewardship to change our behavior. By changing our behavior our attitudes will change to match the Gospel way of life."

May this be our way of life as we encounter and receive people searching for God and searching for miracles. May they find both of these, God and miracles, in each and every one of us.

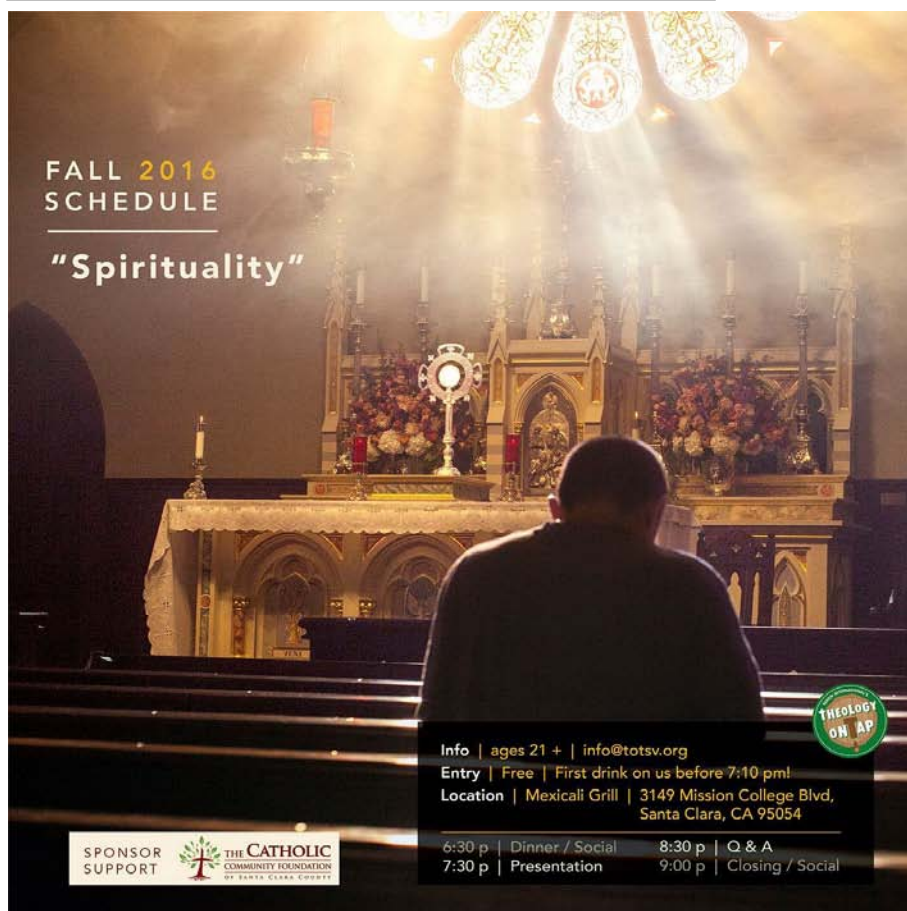

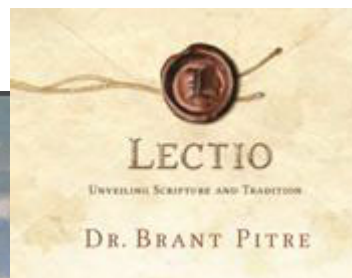

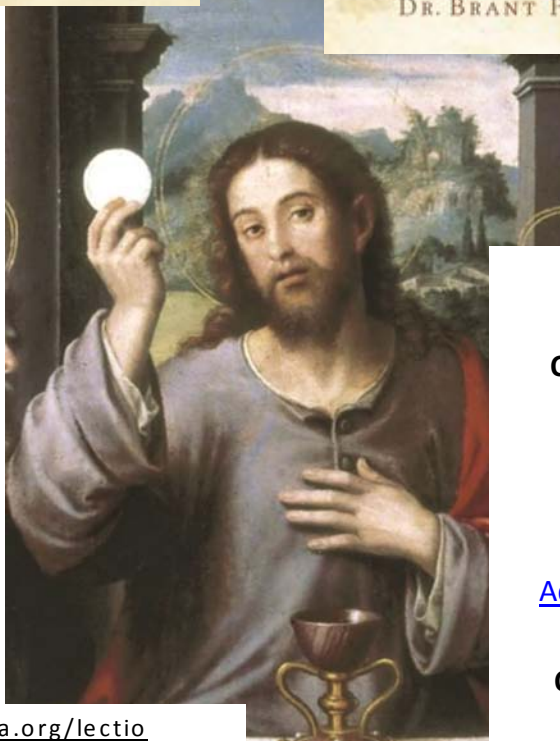
