From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

As we have been looking at the Mission Statement of Our Lady of Peace these past several weeks, it is finally time to get to the specifics.

In order to answer the question, how do we dedicate ourselves to the greater glory of God and the salvation of souls? We must say firstly, by adoring Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. This is perhaps a silent miracle that has been taking place here in this "old pear orchard" for the past 40 years. Deo Gratias!

As a newcomer, so many people are excited to share with me how Our Lady of Peace is such a special place. One does not have to look very far or for very long to know that we are blessed beyond measure here. I would simply say that this is so because Eucharistic adoration is a long-standing custom, being passed along here from grandparents, to parents, to children. In whatever way we have been blessed here, either individually or as a parish, we have been blessed because of the men and women who spend time before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Not only is it an important way to deepen our relationship with the Lord, it is also an important part of our mission.

For example, if you stop to think about it, we sit in the middle of Silicon Valley, perhaps the global center from where information and new advancements in science and technology seminate. We are situated within the heart of the internet, a powerful tool that can be used for an immense amount of good and likewise an immense amount of evil. We are a civilization of the information and digital age, where magnificently complex amounts of data and communications can be collected, stored and shared at a lightning-fast pace. Yet, amidst all of this, we find that our Lord, has placed Himself silently, quietly, humbly, within its heart. Here He injects into the veins of this valley the one bit of information that really matters, that "when we contemplate him present in the Blessed Sacrament of the altar, Christ draws near to us and becomes more intimate to us than we are to ourselves. He grants us a share in his divine life in a transforming union and, in the Spirit, he gives us access to the Father." St. John Paul II) It is a Eucharistic proclamation of truth, the truth about God and the truth about man. That God loves man, and man finds Himself transformed by this love when in His presence.

The impact of adoration often goes unnoticed. Humble, quiet, simple prayer, which begins every good work, is often forgotten, or dismissed. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament can have a profound effect. We must not underestimate the great and important work that began here in our parish, and thus know that adoration can transform cities and nations, and it can transform hearts. This seems to me to be a specific and important task that we have been entrusted with, given our location, given the paralleled history that we share with the other buildings and enterprises that surround us. Let us pray that Our Lady of Peace may be the light that never goes out, the door that is always open, remaining silently and prayerfully with our Lord as He remains with us, so that all may know the truth and the truth may set them free. (Jn 8, 32)

Let us pray and work for another generation of adorers, inviting and drawing people into a deeper relationship with our Eucharistic Lord and thus carrying out our mission of glorifying God and saving souls.

Mary, Queen of Peace, Pray for us!

Dear Friends,

Since 1796, when John Adams succeeded George Washington as President, a founding principle of our great nation has been the orderly transfer of power, as an expression of the will of the people. The notion of a democracy relies upon this.

As hard-fought as many of our elections have been, our nation has always succeeded historically in coming together in a mature and civil manner, for the benefit of all, for the good of all of the people. No matter the outcome, we have united – in word and in deed – as one nation.

This year's contentious and unsettling presidential race threatens our ability to come together as one people. The claims by some of our fellow citizens that they will not accept the final outcome of the election borders on the seditious, portending a future that would be neither civil, nor true to our common roots as Americans. We cannot do this. It is not who we are, not who we are called to be.

I ask Catholics and all people of good will to come together on November 8th and 9th and on all of the days that follow to continue to forge one nation, subject to the rule of law and to unite as one American people, committed to the common good of these United States, with its government "of the people, by the people and for the people" (Abraham Lincoln, Gettysburg Address).

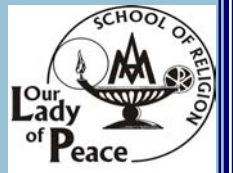

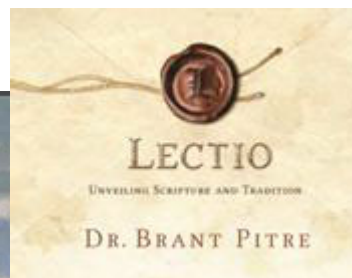

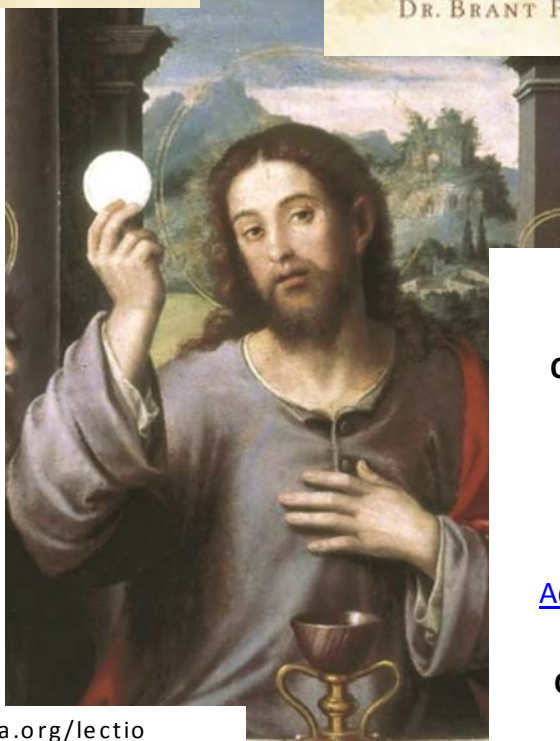
