From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Our Lady of Peace is a place of prayer and pilgrimage . . . with devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. We can simply say that if the Eucharist is the heart and the foundation of Our Lady of Peace, Mary is the arms and the crown.

As the arms, she is the mother that welcomes her children from near and far. Countless souls drive along Highway 101, day and night, looking curiously upon her image, so pure and lovely, and wondering what sort of comfort she may provide for them. It is something so different. A perpetual and silent sign of the peace that we long for – the Peace that Jesus gives to humanity. Men and women on their commute to/from work, dried up by the stress stemming from the trials and trivialities of corporate life, come to find meaning. How many souls have just finished an afternoon of shopping or dining in “El Mercado” center and coming around the bend on Mission College Blvd. They see individuals standing prayerfully and lovingly before the image of Mary.

This silent testimony and public witness of the faith is priceless! It must produce within the onlooker the question, “what brings them there?” It is a treasure to witness the young family brining flowers to Mary every Sunday, or the single solitary soul that stands in prayerful silence – pouring out to her the most intimate longings of their heart. How important it is to see a married couple spend an early evening together, walking hand in hand around the shrine, spending time with one another and spending time with Mary. How captivating is it for the passer-by to witness the dramatic candlelit Fatima Mass procession—thousands gathered in peaceful prayer to pay homage to their queen and mother. We are speaking about a public testimony of faith. It is a devotion or consecration to Jesus through the Immaculate Heart of His mother.

As people pass by, amidst the frenetic pace of their lives, they see something unique and different in all of this, something that goes beyond their immediate understanding. It raises within them a question, that produces a longing, that will ultimately lead to a simple visit. They come to visit her. And they are drawn, in no small part, by our prayers and our devotion. Through our rosaries, as she has promised us time and again, we allow her arms to extend much further than the physical limits of the statue planted on the shrine lawn. The rosaries that we pray and acts of devotion we offer help to bring about the conversion of sinners and the salvation of souls. We offer countless rosaries here at the shrine and it is through them that she reaches the hearts of her wayward children, gently leading them to return to the heart of her Son. The formula is really very simple: through our prayers and public witness of the shrine, we allow the purest love that exists to pour forth, which is the love of a mother for her children.

Through Mary we carry out the essential aspects of our mission statement, i.e., giving glory to God and working for the salvation of souls. She herself said, “many souls go to Hell because there is no one to pray and make sacrifices for them.” She is asking us to dedicate ourselves to prayer and sacrifice for the conversion of sinners and we take her at her word. This is what we do and in all humility, we ask Mother Mary to continue to intercede for us, granting us the grace to faithfully persevere in this wonderful work that has begun here: to draw all people to Jesus through Mary.

Dear Friends,

Since 1796, when John Adams succeeded George Washington as President, a founding principle of our great nation has been the orderly transfer of power, as an expression of the will of the people. The notion of a democracy relies upon this.

As hard-fought as many of our elections have been, our nation has always succeeded historically in coming together in a mature and civil manner, for the benefit of all, for the good of all of the people. No matter the outcome, we have united – in word and in deed – as one nation.

This year's contentious and unsettling presidential race threatens our ability to come together as one people. The claims by some of our fellow citizens that they will not accept the final outcome of the election borders on the seditious, portending a future that would be neither civil, nor true to our common roots as Americans. Bishop Patrick McGrath on Propositions 62 & 66

In these months before November, the electorate of California will prepare to cast ballots on a record number of propositions. Among these is Proposition 62, which would put an end to the death penalty, and Proposition 66, which seeks to expedite the application of the death penalty.

I join with the Bishops of California who favor Proposition 62 and oppose Proposition 66, and I appeal to Catholics of the Diocese of San Jose to do the same, to affirm that human life – all life – is a gift from God.

Society has the responsibility to protect the common good; however, the death penalty does not achieve this any more effectively than is possible within the prison system. In addition to this, the number of Death Row prisoners who have eventually been found to be innocent calls into question the viability of capital punishment. Among these is a disproportionate number who are members of minorities and/or the poor.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church echoes the teaching of popes, beginning with Saint John XXIII, against the death penalty. Most recently, Pope Francis declared that capital punishment "is an offense to the inviolability of life and to the dignity of the human person. . . It likewise contradicts God's plan for individuals and society, and his merciful justice."

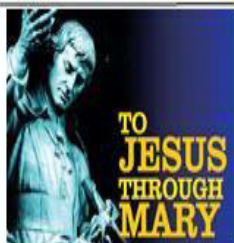
I encourage you to affirm life as you vote in favor of Proposition 62, and against Proposition 66 on Nov. 8.

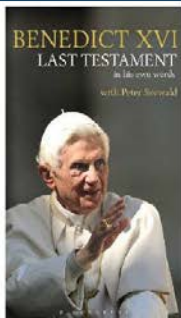

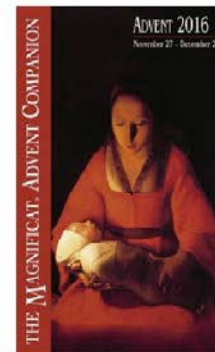
