From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Our Lady of Peace is a *place of prayer and pilgrimage* with integrated formation of the person (spiritual, moral, intellectual and emotional).

Rather than simply listing the classes and programs that we conduct to carry out this part of our mission, I wanted to highlight why it is so important.

Perhaps no age has seen a greater need for an integrated formation than ours. I know that every time someone says something like "oh, no time has been as bad as ours," runs the risk of sounding like the broken record of every generation. "This age," says St. John Paul II, "has also ushered in a technological mentality which challenges Gospel value." As we have expanded our horizons into the technological and virtual frontier, the need for integrated formation has perhaps never been more necessary. Why? Because, as we connect socially in so many more ways than ever before, perhaps we have become socially disconnected in so many more ways than ever before.

Take for example, an hour or two spent in an airport waiting area, assuredly one will find the majority of people with their heads down glued to the palm of their hands, waiting with one another while utterly alone. How often does this same scene replay itself in the household of modern families? Sitting in the living room, together but disconnected. I do not wish to detract our focus from the point of our mission statement, however, it is important to include these observations so as to highlight its timeliness. Today more than ever, we must be strikingly human and excel in developing solidarity among all persons, so that we are able to relate to others – to be a "people of communion." Paraphrasing a document on priestly formation, which can be fittingly applied to all disciples of Christ: we must cultivate a series of human qualities, not only out of proper and due growth and realization of self, but also with a view to our discipleship. These qualities are needed for us to be balanced people, strong and free, capable of bearing the weight of what it means to be a Christian disciple.

It is true, as St. Thomas affirms, grace perfects nature (it doesn't destroy it). Therefore, we must also seek to cooperate with the gift of God's grace by cultivating within ourselves a clear and integral vision of who we are. This concern for integral formation, helps us to open ourselves more and more to reality, and to form in ourselves a clear idea of the meaning of life.

Spiritual, moral, intellectual and emotional formation cooperate and collaborate with one another to develop and form the whole person. Just as an athlete does not achieve greatness by exercising one single muscle, we do not achieve sanctity or charity by focusing on just one while neglecting other parts of our personal formation. They work together, influencing and helping one another, to be integrally complete men and women capable of giving oneself to another (God and neighbor) in a way that is balanced, strong and free.

Net Income was \$108,341 over budget mostly because of continued growth of the Parish resulting in larger collections and donations as well as more expense in religious education, liturgy and other projects and programs.

Increase in other Parish projects and programs includes \$94,968 spent on the development of the Master Plan and \$100,125 spent on special Shrine and Parish events including the RISE Conference.

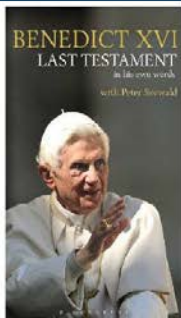

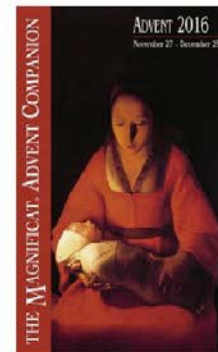
