From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Three weeks of Lent have now passed, it is time to repeat the words with which we began it: *Don't just wander for 40 days, but make a decision! Be a person of decision.* Lent is the time in which our hearts are called to change. In biblical terminology, the heart is the place of decision, the center of the person's being – properly speaking it is a power of the soul called the will.

How did the prayer thing go? Remember, prayer strengthens our will and in turn our will strengthens our prayer. If prayer is not enough to get the will going this Lent, perhaps something a little bit more concrete: fasting. I know what you are probably thinking, what an uninspiring topic for a parish bulletin letter: strengthen your will-power and do a little bit of fasting. So, before you put this down in fear of hearing me lecture about how you should eat potatoes and lettuce for the rest of lent, I want you to know that fasting is far more beautiful than will power and eating tasteless things. It is about encountering the divine and conversion, not diet and moderation.

What we must seek is true fasting, spiritual fasting that is far deeper than merely abstaining from food or technology. In the words of C.S. Lewis, "everyone knows that fasting is a different experience from missing your dinner by accident or through poverty. Fasting **asserts the will against the appetite** – the reward being self-mastery and the danger pride: involuntary hunger subjects appetites and will together to the Divine will, furnishing an occasion for submission and exposing us to the danger of rebellion . . . these practices, which in themselves strengthen the will, are only useful in so far as they enable the will to put its own house (the passions) in order, as a preparation for offering the whole man to God." (C.S. Lewis, *The Problem of Pain*)

It is important to note that in order for us to submit the will to God, we must remember that we have a will and that will must have an object. Fasting is not mere apathy (definition: lack of interest, enthusiasm, or concern) towards food and things of pleasure; rather, it is a readiness, a liveliness, a preference towards God over inferior things. We seek to be like Jesus who brought to Gethsemane and to Calvary a will that was balanced, strong, and free; balanced, strong, and free, to be completely obedient to the will of the Father—for our sake. "No one takes it [life] from me, but I lay it down on my own. I have power to lay it down, and power to take it up again." (Jn 10,18)

Well it's just so hard and my will is so weak, we have so much good food, so easily accessible, we have so many temptations—appealing to our senses—it's everywhere you turn. This is a legitimate claim, which indicates all the more we need to fast. I would add that it is time for you to pierce through the surface, go beyond the superficial and into the depths of reality. Herein lies the point of fasting, the point of choosing to darken my senses so that my intellect and will can be illuminated (and not the other way around).

Fasting is one of the means that we have at our disposal to truly see, hear, taste and smell. Because might it not be the case that the moment we *choose* to see, hear, smell and taste the Goodness of the Lord, will we begin to realize that He is everywhere as well? He is overwhelmingly all over the place – tempting us as it were to access Him, to feast upon His goodness, to hear His voice, to contemplate His beauty. This was the experience of St. Augustine, as he so poignantly expresses: *I asked the earth, and it answered, "I am not he"; and everything in the earth made the same confession. I asked the sea and the deeps and the creeping things, and they replied, "We are not your God; seek above us." I asked the fleeting winds, and the whole air with its inhabitants answered, I asked the heavens, the sun, moon, and stars; and they answered, "Neither are we the God whom you seek."* And I replied to all these things which stand around the door of my flesh: *"You have told me about my God, that you are not he. Tell me something about him."* And with a loud voice they all cried out, *"He made us."*

Late have I loved you, O Beauty ever ancient, ever new, late have I loved you! You were within me, but I was outside, and it was there that I searched for you. In my unloveliness I plunged into the lovely things which you created. You were with me, but I was not with you. Created things kept me from you; yet if they had not been in you they would have not been at all. You called, you shouted, and you broke through my deafness. You flashed, you shone, and you dispelled my blindness. You breathed your fragrance on me; I drew in breath and now I pant for you. I have tasted you, now I hunger and thirst for more. You touched me, and I burned for your peace. (*Confessions*, Bk. 10, 26. 37-29)

Therefore, what is true fasting? It fasting that no longer needs, nor wants, what the world unsatisfyingly offers. We want less of the world, for we have found something greater: the One through whose hands the world was made – Jesus Christ and His kingdom. So, if you haven't begun to pray or to fast – make a decision.




Celebrating Saint Joseph

Since this year March 19 falls on a Sunday, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Saint Joseph on Monday, March 20.

Let's meditate on Saint John Paul II's words in his Apostolic Exhortation Redemptoris Custos about Saint Joseph's interior life:

"The total sacrifice, whereby Joseph surrendered his whole existence to the demands of the Messiah's coming into his home, becomes understandable only in the light of his profound interior life. It was from this interior life that "very singular commands and consolations came, bringing him also the logic and strength that belong to simple and clear souls, and giving him the power of making great decisions—such as the decision to put his liberty immediately at the disposition of the divine designs, to make over to them also his legitimate human calling, his conjugal happiness, to accept the conditions, the responsibility and the burden of a family, but, through an incomparable virginal love, to renounce that natural conjugal love that is the foundation and nourishment of the family.

This submission to God, this readiness of will to dedicate oneself to all that serves him, is really nothing less than that exercise of devotion which constitutes one expression of the virtue of religion." (Saint John Paul II, Redemptoris Custos, 26)






