From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

You may have wondered what the “pastor’s desk” looks like, or if he does in fact write it from his desk, or if it is just a title of endearment. I can remember wondering this myself, while reading a column titled, “The View from the Rectory Window,” written by a priest from my home diocese of Wichita. Based on the title, I imagined Fr. Ken jotting down his clerical musings while peacefully sitting at a large bay window peering off into the distance. A sort of standstill moment where everything just sort of flows out onto the paper while he sits fireside and reflects on life as a priest.

Well, just in case you have ever wondered, when it comes to “From the Pastor’s Desk,” there is no such Kodak moment (as I know was not the case for Fr. Ken either). There are early mornings spent with the Eucharist, a bit of typing on the keyboard here and there between appointments, there is a desk, there is coffee (and some more coffee), and every so often a few interesting things that end up on the desk as a photocopy or pen scratches on paper. This final one is really the sole purpose of this longwinded introduction—two pieces ended up on my desk this week that I want to share with you. They are the words of two completely different people: Paul Harvey (a radio personality) and St. Teresa of Calcutta (no biographical descriptors needed).

First published in 1964, Paul Harvey wrote a radio essay titled, “If I were the Devil,” which is a “what I would do, if I were him” narration of strategy to engulf the whole world in darkness. Among the litany of plots and ploys by the evil one, the plot aimed at the Church reads, “If I were the devil, . . . I would begin a campaign of whispers (subverting the Church). With the wisdom of a serpent, I would whisper to you as I whispered to Eve: “Do as you please. To the young, I would whisper that the Bible is a myth. I would convince the children that man created God instead of the other way around. I’d confide that what’s bad is good and what’s good is square.” That is the first one.

The second, entirely unrelated, piece that found its way to my desk is about Mother Teresa of Calcutta. Mother Teresa had a prayer card that bore an image of Jesus in His agony and below it was a verse from one of the Psalms we often hear during the Passiontide – Psalm 69. It foretells the “Suffering Servant” and verse 21 of the Psalm says, “I looked for one that would comfort me, and I found no one.” Below the image and the words of the psalmist, Mother Teresa wrote: “Be the one.” What disarming simplicity! When Pilate presents Jesus before the tribunal crowned with thorns, cloaked in purple, scourged and beaten, these are the sentiments hidden beneath it all: “I looked for one and found no one...” He calls from the Cross and here it is answered by Mother Teresa. Note, however, it is not a pious act of devotion, but she commands herself.

As you read this, I hope that you are thinking to yourself, didn’t Father say all of November we would be talking about Eucharistic Adoration? You are correct, and thank you if you were thinking about that. It is precisely in Eucharistic

Are You a Registered Parishioner?

If you attend Mass here regularly, we encourage you to register as a member of Our Lady of Peace Catholic Church.

Three main reasons why registering is important:

1. If we as a parish do not know who is out there, how can we serve the needs of all?

This includes single people or young families who may not see the need to register.

2. Registering in the parish makes Sacrament prep easier when the time comes.

Infant baptisms, religious education registration, being a godparent/sponsor for baptisms or confirmations, and especially getting married (whether you are getting married at this parish, another parish, or having an international Catholic wedding). If you're not a registered parishioner, this will greatly delay the process.


3. Letters of Recommendation

Sometimes there are occasions where letters of recommendations are needed from your parish pastor (ie Catholic school enrollment, scholarships, godparent eligibility, etc.). If you're not registered, we cannot provide this letter to you or your family.

Anyone, regardless of where they live (and even though the Diocese is divided into parish geographical areas), is welcome to register at OLOP. Please note: there is a three (3) month waiting period from the date of registration before being considered a full-fledged registered parishioner. Any requests for pastor signatures on any forms, letters, or wedding preparation paperwork will not be processed within the 3 months.





