From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

Jesus drew near to Jerusalem as he came down from the mountains toward the temple. He was accompanied by a multitude filled that was filled with fervor and shouting praises to God. In a moment, Jesus stopped and contemplated the city of Jerusalem that was beheld by His sight. "He saw the city and wept over it." (Lk 19, 41) It was a cry that must have unexpectedly broken the joy of the moment. At that moment, Jesus saw the city, that He loved very much, how it was heading towards destruction because it "did not recognize the time of its visitation." (Lk 19,44) The Messiah had walked through its streets, he had taught the Good News, its inhabitants had seen miracles, and they continued on the same path.

Let our Lord's words stand on their own: "If this day you only knew what makes for peace but now it is hidden from your eyes. For the days are coming upon you when your enemies will raise a palisade against you; they will encircle you and hem you in on all sides. They will smash you to the ground and your children within you, and they will not leave one stone upon another within you because you did not recognize the time of your visitation."

In these lines, we can see the anguish that oppressed the heart of the Lord, "But why," we may ask, "did Jerusalem not understand the most special grace that was being offered to them, the grace of conversion? Why did they remain obstinate in front of this, closing their eyes to the light? Jerusalem, to be sure, had occasions to recognize Jesus as the Messiah and Redeemer; this sign that is given to them know would be the last." Jesus, filled with affliction, does not remain indifferent in the face of the fate of man, the fate of this city. His sorrow is so great that his eyes are filled with tears.

This affliction shows Jesus's love for His people. It is the human expression of the love that God has for all men, the sensible manifestation of the compassion that He has toward us. And today, this this brief moment, we witness the spontaneous tenderness of Christ, which manifests that He is not indifferent to our correspondence or cooperation in His offering of friendship and salvation. He is not indifferent to whether we go and visit Him for 5 minutes in front of the tabernacle. He is not indifferent to our daily desire to deepen our relationship and friendship with Him. He is not indifferent to the communion that we share with one another and our desire to extend His kingdom. Nor is He indifferent to our indifference, the divisions, the rivalry and the infidelities that belong to us. All of these things bring joy or sorrow to His heart – He is anything but indifferent. God Himself takes the initiative to save man. As the Gospel of Luke relates this moment: "He turned his eyes steadfastly towards the way that led to Jerusalem." God has never been, nor ever will be, indifferent to His creatures. For, "He so loved the world that He sent His only son" into it so that they may have eternal life. (Cf., Jn 3,16)

In turn, I seek to reciprocate this love through concrete actions—my time, my gifts, through my very life. "How are we to make a return to the Lord for all of the Good that He has done for me?" Humility should lead me to gratitude. Gratitude because I see exactly what the Lord has done. Not only once, but look down through the years how often the Lord has given me Himself, His grace, His blessing.

It is part of the love that I have in the Lord. It is not a contractual thing, He does this and I do that, and we both agree, no. This most holy of weeks, we will recall that the love of God being poured out upon me, and in view of this love, I respond in kind. "For when God loves," St. Bernard writes, "all He desires is to be loved in return; the sole purpose of His love is to be loved, in the knowledge that those who love Him are made happy by their love of Him."

Through our Sorrowful Mother's intercession, I pray that you will have a most blessed Holy Week.
