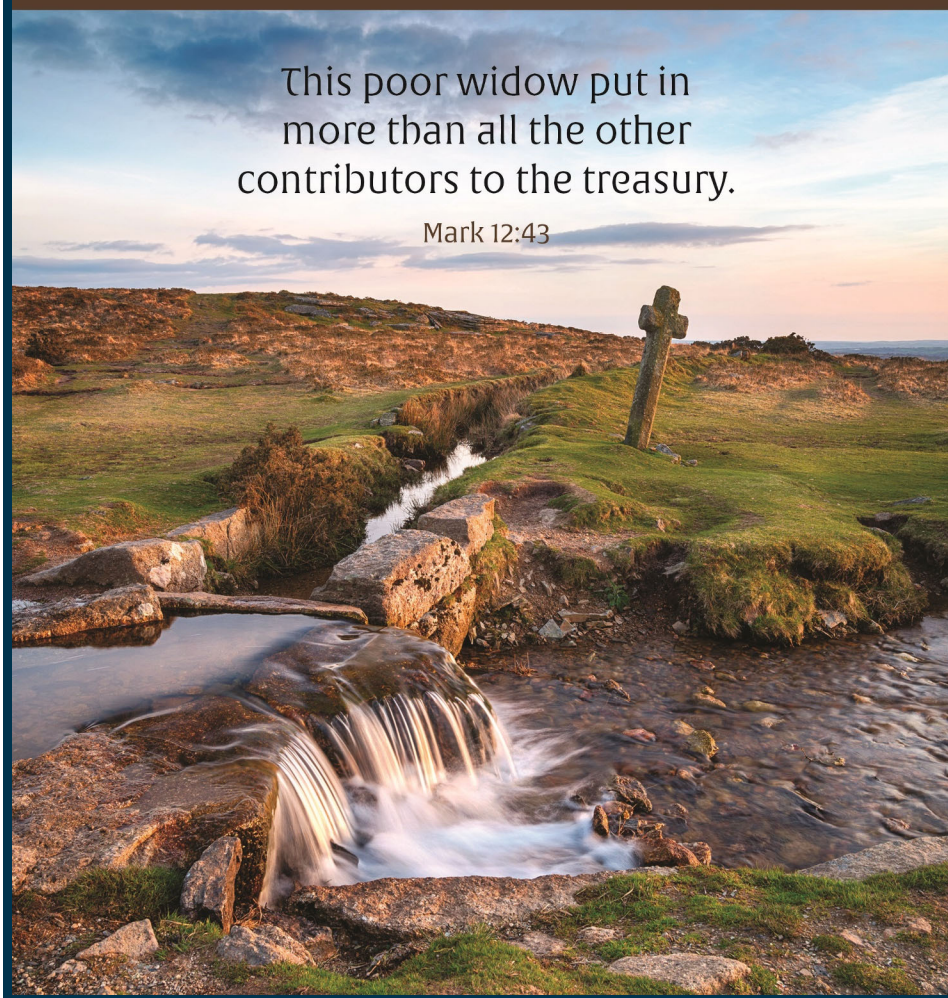

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

In 1949, in his book "The Weight of Glory," C.S. Lewis wrote: "We live, in fact, in a world starved for solitude, silence, and private: and therefore starved for meditation and true friendship."

As the world runs around at a frenetic pace trying to produce, innovate, accomplish and connect, we can become increasingly dissatisfied, disconnected with one another, and bombarded with stuff. We can become fragmented and even unable to connect with our senses in a healthy way – to listen, to see, to touch, to taste, to feel. In a word, when we are overstimulated by sensible data we become desensitized or, in a word, numb.

According to Aristotle, man naturally desires to know and man is naturally a social being (cf., Aristotle, *Metaphysics & Politics*). Therefore, he longs to gaze upon the truth and establish relationships. In many respects, these natural desires in man are not being fed. I would tend to agree with Lewis in the assertion that we are starving for authenticity, contact with something that is real, and relationships that are not superficial and guarded but deep and built on trust. Where do we begin to cultivate this? Well, as Ven. Fulton Sheen says: "As men cease to love God, they also cease to love their neighbor." We can just reverse course here by stating: "as men increase their love of God, and will also increase their love of neighbor."

Eucharistic Adoration feeds our hunger. It cultivates solitude, silence and privacy (intimacy): and it is built upon meditation and true friendship. We long for Him, while He longs for us.

The aforementioned words of C.S. Lewis can rightly be said of Our Lord as he frequently reveals the intimate sentiments of his heart. He starves for our true friendship. First in the Garden of Olives, when he asks his friends to remain with him: "My soul is sorrowful, even unto death. Remain here and keep watch with me." He goes off to pray and upon His return finds His friends sleeping, he asks: "So you could not keep watch with me for one hour?" (Mt 26,40)

Then upon the Cross Jesus said, *sitio*, I thirst. "My thirst is for your salvation," is the reply which St. Augustine makes for him. This was his thirst, wrote St. Laurence Justinian: "He thirsted for us, and desired to give Himself to us." St. Basil of Seleucia says, moreover, that Jesus Christ, in saying that he thirsted, would give us to understand that he, for the love which he bore us, was dying with the desire of suffering for us even more than what he had suffered: "O that desire, greater than the Passion!" (*Sitit sitiri Deus – He thirsts that we thirst for Him*)

This is a strikingly similar request came to us from the hearts of Jesus and Mary through an angel appearing to the shepherd children in Fatima in 1916: "*My God, I believe, I adore, I hope, and I love You. I ask pardon for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope, and do not love You.*" It reveals the heart that is longing for company, especially for us who hear his words to spend time with the Lord and to do so for those who do not. These words, I know, are rooted deeply in the memory of so many here at Our Lady of Peace.

A year ago, all of us priests here at Our Lady of Peace, throughout the month of November extended invitations to you to come and sit with our Lord in Eucharistic Adoration. Perhaps some of you did

12:30pm - Rally for Life

1:30pm - Walk for Life route is from Civic Center Plaza, along Market Street (2 miles), towards Justin Herman Plaza/Ferry Bldg. Bus Pick Up Locations TBD.

3:00pm – Meet at Bus, prepare for return to OLOP

3:30pm – Bus leaves promptly to avoid overtime bus fees. **Do not be late!**

5:30pm –It takes awhile to leave the streets of San Francisco, but the **bus should arrive before**

5:30pm latest.

How to prepare:

You will receive route/bus instructions on the day of the walk. Just make sure you get to OLOP before the bus leaves and that you plan to return on the bus on time. *Bring comfortable walking shoes, a bagged lunch, and bottled water.* We walk rain or shine, so check weather conditions to plan accordingly. Don't worry - even the one year it rained buckets, it was a great experience.
