

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Let's Begin Sunday on Saturday"

Dear Friends,

Let's begin with the same question posed last week: If we understand the sacredness and the magnificence of the Holy Mass, wouldn't it make sense for us to approach the day especially set aside for this, Sunday, accordingly?

Last week we acknowledged that the culture around us is fostering a way of living that averts us, practically speaking, from observing Sunday in such a way that is Holy, Sacred, set apart and different from all the rest.

Perhaps one of the most important tips to highlight will be: Sunday can begin on Saturday.

Just as the solemnities of the Church's calendar begin the night before, for example, Christmas Eve, the Easter Vigil, such is the case on every Sunday. Therefore, Saturday should have a solemn character to it, because Sunday has already begun.

When Saturday becomes a quiet night, a night of preparation, the joy and sacredness of Sunday can be anticipated and expected, rather than something we stumble into or, even worse, sandwich-in between other items on the to-do list. Therefore, rather than being a noisy night of distractive partying or consumptive binging, Saturday can be a quiet moment of recreation and prayer. Recreation or leisure being defined not as just "taking it easy or letting loose," but it is a receptive, relaxed, and celebratory attitude of mind in which one can attend carefully to reality. (Cf., Josef Pieper, *Leisure: The Basis of Culture*) And the reality about us is that we are created, in His image and likeness, and we are made for relationships. Therefore, Saturday evening is a moment in which we can concentrate on this and truly place ourselves in His presence.

After dinner, how about praying the Family Rosary, which can be followed by the reading (out loud) of the Sunday readings. This will help plant the Word of God in the minds and hearts of everyone for the following day. All of this can be done in front of an oratory in the home. What is an oratory? Literally, a place of prayer. Perhaps, it could be in the living room where an image of the Sacred Heart hangs and a statue of the Blessed Mother stands accompanied by the patron saints of the family. There could also be votive candles lit while the time of prayer is taking place. Simply said, the oratory is the place where the family gathers for prayer.

What if, rather than being a night "out and about," Saturday could be a night "in and around," appreciating what is in the home? Given the fact that most meals throughout the week are no more than a pit-stop to fuel us for more schoolwork or to recover from a hard day's work, perhaps Saturday evening should be seen as a meal to be spent together, slowly and leisurely. The moment that everyone can look forward to is an evening meal spent together. We could call it making time to take time just for talking, telling stories, taking time to be together for the sake of being together. This may be a novel and perhaps intimidating idea, I know. We like to stick to what is comfortable, which oftentimes is to have some form of distraction so that we can perhaps sit together but not necessarily have to be together.

You see, by expanding our application of "keep holy the Lord's day" as something much richer than simply "making it to mass before the Gospel," our life begins to have some order. When we truly prepare for Sunday other areas of our life are impacted. Not only can you begin to reclaim Sunday, but the home as well. Could it be said that homelessness is a poverty that strickens not only those who lack a physical place to rest, but those who possessing the physical place are deprived a spiritual place to rest? Sundays help address this.

A home is not a mere physical structure, or a place where people eat and sleep, or pursue their private interests behind closed doors; they dwell with one another and for one another. A home is a domestic church and can be rightly described along with G.K. Chesterton as: bigger on the inside than on the outside.

Conclusion: think about beginning Sunday on Saturday!








Feeding Faith Book Club Featured Title 1:


