FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"How Are You Getting to Mass?"

Dear Friends,

Today, I would like to talk about getting to mass. Now, I know what you are probably thinking, 'let's start talking about the mass already!' Well, we will get there, eventually. Here's the point, we are battling a culture of distraction and unfriendly to the interior life. Therefore, we have to do some foundation-laying to be prepared for what's to come; because, if we do not, it will be like building a house on sand.

First we have to talk about getting to mass. How do you get there? Now that Saturday can be a time to really slow things down and the Sunday clothes have already been picked out, what about getting there? Horse and buggy? Family-size skateboard? Italian Motorino?

I was speaking to a couple the other day and they told me that they walk to Our Lady of Peace every Sunday; it takes them two hours. They won't exchange it for an Uber. I know for most, at first glance, this could be seen as a complete waste of time. Maybe; but then again, maybe not. It is not a financially driven choice – it's about their relationship (with one another and God). It gives them time to talk and to prepare, together. Nothing is wasted.

Now, please understand that I am not necessarily suggesting that everyone begin walking to mass, nor am I really concerned with the means of transportation. This is, however, an invitation to re-evaluate what is considered valuable. Our relationships are not a waste of time. In fact, the pagan philosopher Aristotle considered friendship to be one of the most important virtues in achieving happiness. Therefore, in this little decision of walking to church, the couple is giving themselves time to walk and talk together and even prepare for what is to come – the most excellent event that takes place in the whole universe – the Mass.

Therefore, when I am asking "how are you getting there?" It does not refer to the means of transportation, but your individual disposition. Are you protecting your heart and your mind from worldly cares at this time? God and brethren should be the focal point of your interior in the moments before mass. There is one sentence that hangs in our sacristy that are always worth repeating, as it is succinctly and accurately articulates how we should approach each mass: "Priest of Jesus Christ, celebrate this Holy Mass as if it were your first Mass, your last Mass, your only Mass." If this were really the case and we really knew this would be the case, how differently would we approach that mass? How fervently would we pray? How many people would we pray for? How attentively would we listen to the readings? How engaged would we be, thinking of it as if it were the first, last, and only?

"Treasures, however great and precious," St. Leonard of Port Maurice beautifully pens, "are never appreciated until examined, counted over, and summed up. Hence it is, dear reader, that by many there is formed no due estimate of the holy and awful Sacrifice of the Mass. Though the greatest treasure which glorifies and enriches the Church of God, it is still a hidden treasure, and known to few. Ah, if this jewel of paradise were but known, who would not give up all things to obtain it! No one would then permit to escape from his mouth the scandalous words, 'A Mass more or less makes little difference.'" (Hidden Treasure: The Holy Mass)

So, in practical terms, there are probably things—TV, social media, video games—that will distract us in this critical moment prior to mass. If we are feeding on these right before we step into the pews, the mass does not stand a chance to captivate us.

Herein lies an important point, maybe it is not intended to captivate our senses, but our hearts and our minds. The mass is truly beautiful in this sense. It uses many sensible things, candles, incense, music, gestures, colors, and it uses them to guide us to a deeper reality. They are really trying to speak to our soul and not just our senses. So, we must prepare ourselves to have eyes that truly see and ears that truly hear. (Cf., Mk 8:18) Indeed, what is needed is silence, so that our senses may be heightened in an orderly way: "The celebration of the Eucharist requires first a great silence, a silence inhabited by God. It is necessary to pay attention to the material circumstances in order for this encounter to take place fruitfully." (God or Nothing, Cardinal Sarah)

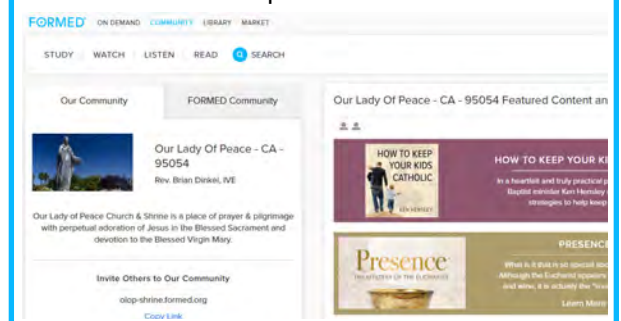

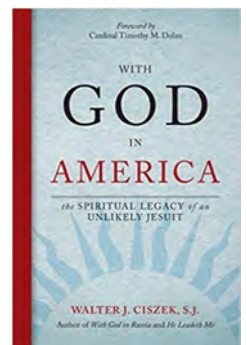
