FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Gloria & Collect - Concluding the Introductory Rites"

Dear Friends,

Alright, I am going to cover two points in the mass today, the Gloria and the Collect. Now, I realize that the melancholics in the crowd are applauding all of this detail and the slow pace; however, I am probably driving the choleric nuts, who are just saying "get on with it already!" Well, I am going to have to side with the melancholics here, because at some point we need to undergo the painstaking—yet worthwhile—task of looking unpacking the mass and trying to understand, appreciate, and love the whole thing and all of its parts. It is such a common thing for us to simply pass through it and pay little to almost no attention to what is being said or done. Moreover, we cannot underestimate the value of knowing the "why" behind the things that we do.

Let's resume our discussion with the Gloria. Much like the Kyrie, the Gloria was not created originally for the liturgy of the mass. According to the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (the priest's guidebook for the mass), the Gloria in excelsis "is a most ancient and venerable hymn by which the Church, gathered in the Holy Spirit, glorifies and entreats God the Father and the Lamb. The text of this hymn may not be replaced by any other. It is intoned by the Priest or, if appropriate, by a cantor or by the choir; but it is sung either by everyone together, or alternately with the choir." (GIRM, no. 53) The General Instruction also adds that "it is sung or said on Sundays outside Advent and Lent, and also on Solemnities and Feasts, and at particular celebrations of a more solemn character."

In short, through the Gloria we are standing upright proclaiming God's glory and in an indirect way reminding ourselves of who is, in a way giving thanks to Him for being so transcendent, so exalted, in a word, so glorious.

The second piece to today's edition is the Collect. This is the prayer that the priest says at the beginning of the mass, just before the first reading. The General Instruction explains this part very well: "Next the Priest calls upon the people to pray and everybody, together with the Priest, observes a brief silence so that they may become aware of being in God's presence and may call to mind their intentions. Then the Priest pronounces the prayer usually called the "Collect" and through which the character of the celebration finds expression. By an ancient tradition of the Church, the Collect prayer is usually addressed to God the Father, through Christ, in the Holy Spirit, and is concluded with a Trinitarian ending.

The people, joining in this petition, make the prayer their own by means of the acclamation Amen." (GIRM, no. 54) Therefore, this is a prayer that is Trinitarian and we directed to the Father and/or the Son in unity with the Holy Spirit. Msgr. Ronald Knox, a convert to the faith, applying his usual English wit, says: "The Collects we ought to think of perhaps as SOS messages expressing, in as brief terms as possible, the needs of the Church."

To conclude this point, I would like to point out something that is of much greater importance than we can imagine, silence. Just before the Collect prayer is read, the Instruction states that "a brief silence is observed so that they may become aware of being in God's presence and may call to mind their intentions." This silence should take place and it is not to be avoided or filled with something. Sacred silence is an important part of the liturgy. I hope to dedicate on full page to this at the end, but for now suffice it to say that it is a positive contribution to our worship that we must have. The General Instruction says this: "Sacred silence also, as part of the celebration, is to be observed at the designated times." Our hearts and minds are starving for silence, therefore, in the liturgy embrace the moments of silence – recollect, reflect, bring to mind all of your intentions.

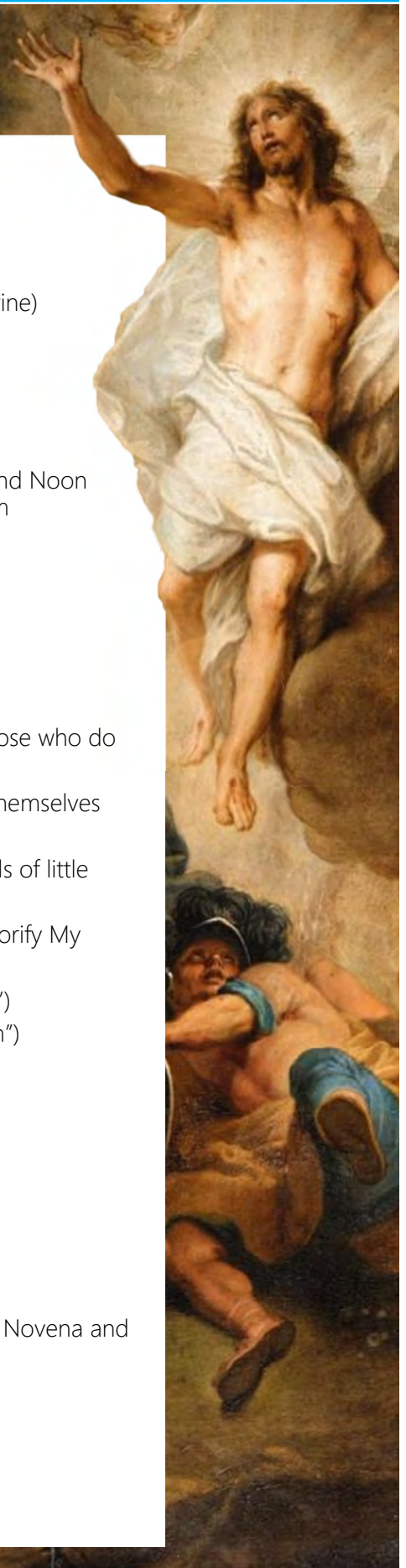
