FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Let Silence Speak Loudly in the Holy Mass"

Dear Friends,

Having coursed through the component parts of the mass, I want to highlight a part of the active participation of mass that is easily overlooked or, even worse, disrupted. I am speaking about silence. Silence at Mass is something active, it is not a moment of passivity or absence. Silence is not for drifting off, but for a deep and active work. Therefore, it is not just a matter of "being quiet," but we need to be silent.

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI explains it in this way: "We are realizing more and more clearly that silence is part of the liturgy. We respond, by singing and praying, to the God who addresses us, but the greater mystery, surpassing all words, summons us to silence. It must, of course, be a silence with content, not just the absence of speech and action. We should expect the liturgy to give us a positive stillness that will restore us". (*The Spirit of the Liturgy*, 209)

From an early age, our fast-paced noisy culture discourages moments of silence. Moments of silence deemed awkward and uncomfortable for most – avoid it at all costs! We oftentimes find the need to fill any and every gap with something, this is evidenced in our daily lives. What is one major ill-effect of this? Cardinal Robert Sarah, prefect of Divine Worship, says "without silence, God disappears in the noise. And this noise becomes all the more obsessive because God is absent." (*Power of Silence*, n. 142)

Does silence have a significant role to play in the celebration of the Holy Mass? Well, the Church seems to think so, as the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) has this to say: "Sacred silence also, as part of the celebration, is to be observed at the designated times. Its nature, however, depends on the moment when it occurs in the different parts of the celebration. For in the Penitential Act and again after the invitation to pray, individuals recollect themselves; whereas after a reading or after the Homily, all meditate briefly on what they have heard; then after Communion, they praise God in their hearts and pray to him. Even before the celebration itself, it is a praiseworthy practice for silence to be observed in the church, in the sacristy, in the vesting room, and in adjacent areas, so that all may dispose themselves to carry out the sacred celebration in a devout and fitting manner." (GIRM 45)

If you pay particular attention to the counsel given in this last sentence, you will see that the first moment of silence is not even found within the mass itself, rather it is a disposition prescribed for preparations. The disposition with which we begin the celebration of the Eucharist will most certainly set the tone for how actively we will involve ourselves in these transcendent and other-worldly mysteries. Without a spirit of recollection and contemplation of the mystery of Jesus Christ on the Cross, how else may we adequately prepare ourselves to participate in something that should inspire us to fear and trembling? (Cf., *Power of Silence*, n. 261)

Here are few specific moments that the GIRM highlights for silence:

The Collect. "Here the Priest calls upon the people to pray and everybody, together with the Priest, observes a brief silence *so that they may become aware of being in God's presence and may call to mind their intentions*."

The Liturgy of the word. "The liturgy of the word must be celebrated in a way that fosters meditation; clearly, any sort of haste that hinders reflectiveness must be avoided. The dialogue between God and God's people taking place through the Holy Spirit demands short intervals of silence, suited to the assembly, as an opportunity to take the word of God to heart and to prepare a response to it in prayer. Proper times for silence during the liturgy of the word are, for example, before this liturgy begins, after the first and second reading, after the homily."

After Communion is another opportunity for silence. It is really a moment to give thanks to God, who chose to enter under my roof and enter into communion with me. It is a moment for thanksgiving. We are capable, in this moment, of withdrawing into our inner room so that we may converse with the Beloved guest. Turn to Him and the things which God has commanded you to do. Close the door upon yourself and call to you Jesus, your Beloved. Remain with Him in your cell, for nowhere else will you find such peace. (Cf., *Imitation of Christ*, bk 1, 20)

Each of us would do well to protect and carve out more space for silence in our lives – both interior and exterior. Through silence the Lord wishes to bring us a peace that the world does not know and joy in the Holy Spirit.

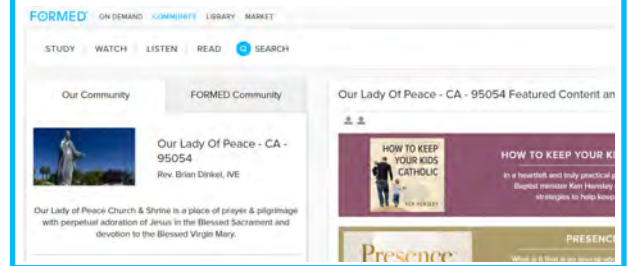

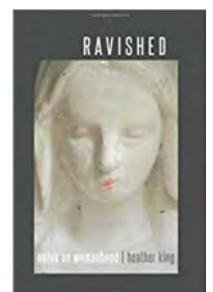

BISHOP'S STATEMENT ON SB 360

Statement from Bishop Oscar Cantú and the Diocese of San José

The Diocese of San Jose has learned that State Senator Jerry Hill has withdrawn his bill, SB 360, regarding the Seal of Confession, from the California Assembly Public Safety Committee, just a day before its scheduled hearings.

I want to thank the many parishioners who made their voices heard to their Assembly representatives in opposition to SB 360, as it violates the free practice of our faith. Our priests and I are grateful that we do not have to be subject to prosecution by law for being faithful to the privacy of Confession. The Seal of Confession is sacred and should not be broken.

There is strong evidence that training priests, teachers, staff, parents, and children to recognize suspicious behavior, report any and all instances of abuse and neglect, and prioritize the safety of children is resulting in the dramatic increase of safe spaces for children and families.

The Church in San José continues to be vigilant in creating an environment which is safe and nurturing for all. The reporting requirements and protections for clergy members are already identical to the requirements and protections for other mandated reporters, except for the provision exempting information acquired during a Confession.

The Diocese of San Jose conducts background checks and requires recertification training every three years for diocesan bishops, priests, deacons, employees, and volunteers. Since 2002, approximately 52,500 adults in the Diocese have been trained to recognize and report child abuse. Working together to be vigilant and keep children safe, our Catholic community is committed to creating a safe environment for all children and families.
