

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Totus tuus ego sum et omnia mea tua sunt... I am totally yours and all that I have is yours."

Dear Friends,

I would like to take the opportunity this weekend to say a word of gratitude and then introduce a topic that I have chosen for the next couple of months of letters in the bulletin.

First, a word of gratitude. I want to say thank you to all of the staff, sisters, and volunteers who worked so generously and magnanimously for the Marian conference. It was truly a family affair and an opportunity for Mary's children to honor her and give thanks to God for such a wonderful Mother.

There are a number of ways in which we honor her here at Our Lady of Peace, whether it is through the recitation of the Rosary, the Pilgrimage to Fatima Masses, the Mother of Perpetual Help Novena, the Our Lady of Vailankanni novena, the Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary, and this past weekend was very special as we celebrated her Birthday Weekend. It was truly a grace to welcome two gifted priests to share their wisdom and their lives with us in the Marian Conference. I think that they helped us to acquire a deeper knowledge of Our Lady's role in the plan of salvation, as well as inspiring us to promote and bring about Marian devotion in our own lives.

We must be grateful to God for the grace of having Bishop Oscar Cantú preside over the mass for us on Friday evening. As he spoke about the important role of the Bishop in the events surrounding Our Lady of Guadalupe and St. Juan Diego, I think we all realized what a privilege it was for us to have our Bishop present with us, offering the mass with us, as we were offering our thanks to God for the Blessed Mother.

Then on Sunday, when we were placed all of our petitions into the Immaculate Heart for this year, I must say that we had more petitions than we have ever had before, and not to mention that more cake was eaten than in years past! This is great news, it means more and more people are entrusting themselves to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Let us pray that many souls will consecrate themselves to Mary Immaculate during this year's consecration.

The second point of today's letter is to introduce to you a theme for the next couple of months. I would like to capitalize on the momentum from this weekend's conferences and prepare us for the Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary that will begin in mid-October. What is the theme? The Virtues of Mary. This list is taken from St. Louis Marie de Montfort's masterpiece, True Devotion. On point number 108, he says the following: "True devotion to Our Lady is holy; that is to say, it leads the soul to avoid sin and to imitate the virtues of the Blessed Virgin, particularly her profound humility, her lively faith, her blind obedience, her continual prayer, her universal mortification, her divine purity, her ardent charity, her heroic patience, her angelic sweetness and her divine wisdom." If my math is correct, I think that this would be ten principal virtues of the most holy Virgin.

St. Louis de Montfort presents these virtues as a subset to a section that he presents on the holiness of Mary. In other words, he is connecting holiness with stable dispositions that are present within the Blessed Mother that are worthy of imitation. The Catechism defines a virtue as "a habitual and firm disposition to do good." (CCC 1833) And he introduces this idea as he is expounding on the characteristics of True Devotion to the Blessed Mother. Therefore, in the mind of St. Louis de Montfort, it is more than simply reciting a consecratory prayer after some days, it is acquiring stable and firmly rooted characteristics. The moral virtues, says the catechism, "grow through education, deliberate acts, and perseverance in struggle. Divine grace purifies and elevates them." In non-technical terms, "they don't come cheap!" I am confident that if we focus on these as a preparation for and in conjunction with the Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary, we will have a better foundation laid for the consecration to stand upon. Therefore, let us be ready to put them into practice, for virtues are powers of action and we need to learn, but then make deliberate acts and persevere in the struggle.

In summary, let us give thanks to God for the gift of Mary, Our Lady of Peace, and let us ask for her help, as we seek to imitate her virtues. We know that it will not happen overnight, nor easily, but with the grace of God and her powerful intercession all things are possible. "Totus tuus ego sum et omnia mea tua sunt...! am totally yours and all that I have is yours." (True Devotion, n. 216)




