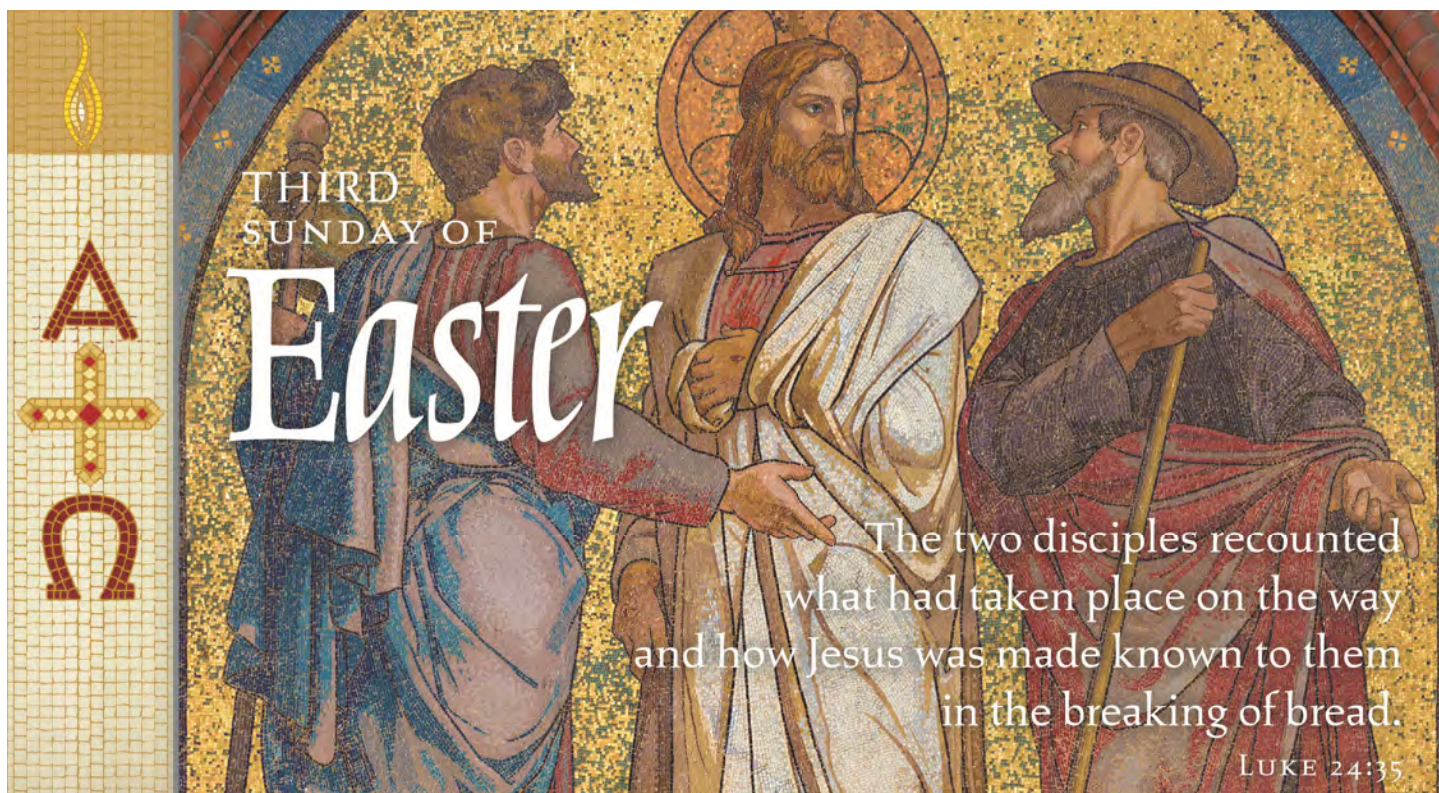

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Blessed are the Merciful, for they shall obtain Mercy"

Dear Friends,

Before the pandemic situation sprung itself upon our lives and our Lenten journey, I had planned to go through the Beatitudes. I plan to return to that plan. Perhaps now is a moment in which we can regroup and return to our marching orders. The Beatitudes are sort of like the written form of what God expects from us, and in turn what we can hope for ourselves. Picking up where we left off:

"Blessed are the Merciful, for they shall obtain Mercy." This Beatitude really ought to shake us into action. As you can tell, if being merciful in and of itself were not enough, we should at least acknowledge that the mercy shall be meted out to us kind of depends upon it.

Let us appeal to Ven. Fulton Sheen to help explain what we mean. He says, "there is a law about mercy just as rigid as the laws of nature. What we sow, that also we reap. If we sow sparingly, we reap sparingly. If we sow generously, we reap an abundant harvest. Raised to a spiritual level, this means, as Our Lord has said, "For with what judgment you judge, you shall be judged; and with what measure you mete, it shall be measured to you again" (Matt. 7:2). In other words, by thinking of others, we get God to think of us." (*Cross and the Beatitudes*)

Somedays it may be very difficult to remember this fact, that God is merciful, especially when it seems that everything is going wrong, everyone and everything is against me. And then, it can become even more difficult to find out that we are expected to show mercy towards others, otherwise God will not be so with us. I understand that this can become a sore point for people, especially when life is afflicting them or their loved ones. How do we proceed?

We would do well to remember that Jesus has always gone before us. He will never ask us to do something that He Himself did not first do for us. Remember, "for our sake," that is for your sake, "he made him to be sin who did not know sin, so that we might become the righteousness of God in him." (2 Cor 5:21)

St. John Paul II helps us to remember this teaching within a larger, but no less personal, context: "Christ, precisely as the crucified one, is the Word that does not pass away, and He is the one who stands at the door and knocks at the heart of every man, without restricting his freedom, but instead seeking to draw from this very freedom love, which is not only an act of solidarity with the suffering Son of man, but also a kind of "mercy" shown by each one of us to the Son of the eternal Father. In the whole of this messianic program of Christ, in the whole revelation of mercy through the cross, could man's dignity be more highly respected and ennobled, for, in obtaining mercy, He is in a sense the one who at the same time "shows mercy"? In a word, is not this the position of Christ with regard to man when He says: "As you did it to one of the least of these...you did it to me"?" (*Dives in Misericordia*, n. 8)

Therefore, mindful of this great show of mercy that the Father has extended toward us, through Jesus, we are also here reminded of a responsibility to enter into this mystery. We have received mercy and compassion, time and again. Mercy is a compassion, which seeks to unburden the sorrows of others as if they were our own. Moreover, the hidden pearl that lies beneath all of this, it is to our benefit, not only for eternity, but here and now, when we are active agents of mercy. Think about it; what would be the alternative? Indignance? Bitterness? Isolationism? I don't think that anyone, at the end of the day, would desire a heart filled with those sentiments as opposed to having a heart that is moved to action at the misery of another.

If, however, we have no such compassion, then how can compassion ever come back to us? Give, and you shall receive; be merciful, and you shall receive mercy. Dear Jesus! Your kindness to the penitent thief recalls the prophetic words of the Old Testament: "If your sins be as scarlet, they shall be made as white as snow: and if they be as red as crimson, they shall be white as wool." (Is 1:18)

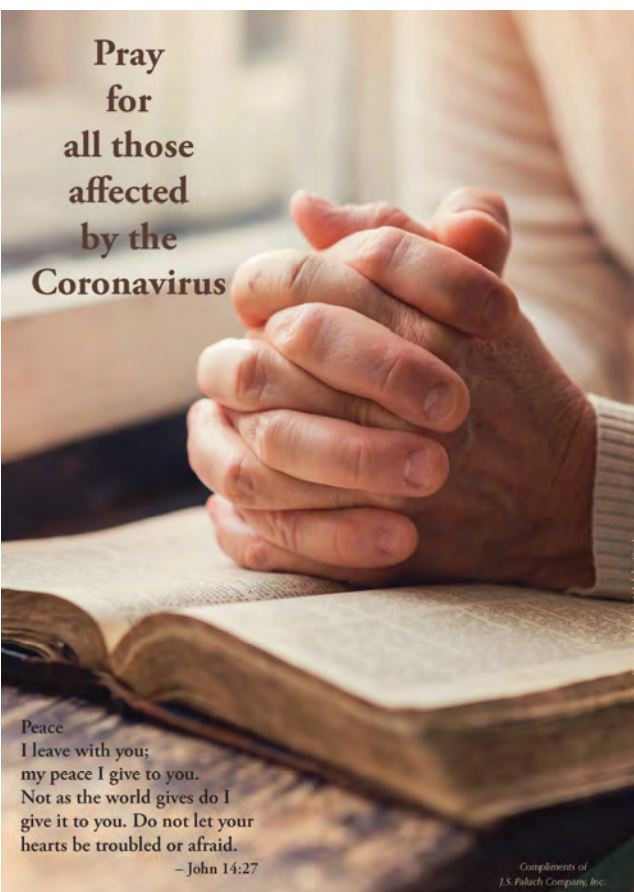

What is a Spiritual Communion?

St. Thomas Aquinas once defined Spiritual Communion as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament and in lovingly embracing Him as if we had actually received Him." You just need to approach Him with sincerity, humility and a desire to follow in His footsteps in acts of faith and charity.

St. Jean-Marie Vianney, a French priest famous for converting countless souls to Christ in his parish of Ars in the 19th century, once said "when we feel the love of God growing cold, let us instantly make a Spiritual Communion. When we cannot go to the church, let us turn towards the tabernacle; no wall can shut us out from the good God."

PARISH REGISTRATION

Are You a Registered Parishioner?

If you attend Mass here regularly, we encourage you to register as a parishioner of Our Lady of Peace parish.

Why registering is important:

1. If we as a parish do not know who is out there, how can we serve the needs of all?

This includes single people or young families who may not see the need to register.

2. Make Sacrament prep easier when the time comes.

If you're not a registered parishioner, this may greatly delay the process for Sacrament prep.

3. Letters of Recommendation

There are occasions where letters of recommendations

are needed from your parish pastor (ie Catholic school enrollment, scholarships, godparent eligibility, etc.). If you're not registered, we cannot provide this letter.

Anyone, regardless of where they live is welcome to register at OLOP.

Please note: there is a three (3) month waiting period from the date of registration before being considered a full-fledged registered parishioner. Any requests for pastor signatures on any forms, letters, or wedding preparation paperwork cannot not be processed within the 3 months.

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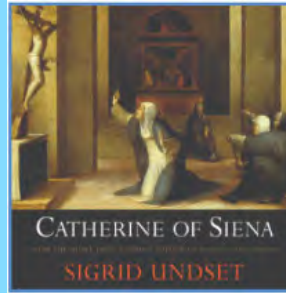
