FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God."

Dear friends,

This week we will consider "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God."

What is the peace spoken of in this beatitude? Ven. Fulton Sheen holds that the most perfect definition of peace ever given was that of St. Augustine: "Peace is the tranquility of order." Jesus Christ restored order with God the Father. He did so for us. And in so doing, He has shown us the way, He has shown us the truth, He has shown us the life.

Tranquility of order, explains Sheen, is a subordination of all things to the highest of goods, which is God. There is peace in a person when the passions and emotions are guided by right reason, when right reason is guided by faith, and then "the whole man to God as his eternal end and final perfection – that is the basis of peace." Oftentimes it is the other way around, we react. We allow our passions and emotions to get the better of us and simply try to overpower peoples or situations in order to get what we want, or what we think we want in a given moment.

Therefore, true and lasting peace will not necessarily be found through the volatile art of politics, nor shall it be found in financial security, or the human diplomatic service. It will be found in turning to Him who declared war on sin and selfishness so that we may enjoy peace, true and lasting peace between God and man. He intercedes for us.

It is on Calvary where we find the intercessor par excellence. Jesus, the Priest and Victim, interceding for all who have, by sin, declared war and violence upon the Goodness of God. In return, we might say, along with Fulton Sheen, "He too declared war, war against war, war against selfishness, war against sin, war against godlessness. And if His war against evil brought Him to the Cross, then His followers who preach His peace must also expect to be crucified."

In the Old Testament, for example, when the people grew weary of God's slow and mysterious plan of redemption, when they were filled with dismay, filled with discontent and grumbling towards God and Moses, even to the point of worshiping the golden calf. Through prayer, Moses intercedes for his people who have made a false God. Jesus instructs his disciples to pray and intercede for these people who were being tormented by demons. Jesus hangs upon the cross, praying to the Father so that we may be in communion with Him.

I think we should meditate upon this reality. Amidst much uncertainty and many trials, let us not forget that Jesus is seated at the right hand of the Father interceding for me. As Benedict XVI beautifully puts it: "Christ stands before God and is praying for me. His prayer on the Cross is contemporary with all human beings, contemporary with me. He prays for me, he suffered and suffers for me, he identified himself with me, taking our body and the human soul. And he asks us to enter this identity of his, making ourselves one body, one spirit with him because from the summit of the Cross he brought not new laws, tablets of stone, but himself, his Body and his Blood, as the New Covenant. Thus he brings us kinship with him, he makes us one body with him, identifies us with him. He invites us to enter into this identification, to be united with him in our wish to be one body, one spirit with him. Let us pray the Lord that this identification may transform and renew us, because forgiveness is renewal and transformation." (Benedict XVI, General Audience, 1 June 2011)

At the beginning of His public life on the hill of the Beatitudes, Our Lord preached: "Blessed are the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God" (Matt. 5:9). At the end of His life on the hill of Calvary, He practiced that Beatitude as, concluding peace between man and God, He uttered the triumphant cry: "It is consummated" (John 19:30).

May we, through our Lady of Peace, in this time of upheaval and uncertainty find peace with God. Let us turn to His Son. And to do it more perfectly, let us turn to Him with His blessed mother, Mary, Our Lady of Peace. May she obtain for us, from the heart of her Son, a heart that is respectful of the Divine Order and seeks to establish lasting peace in the world.

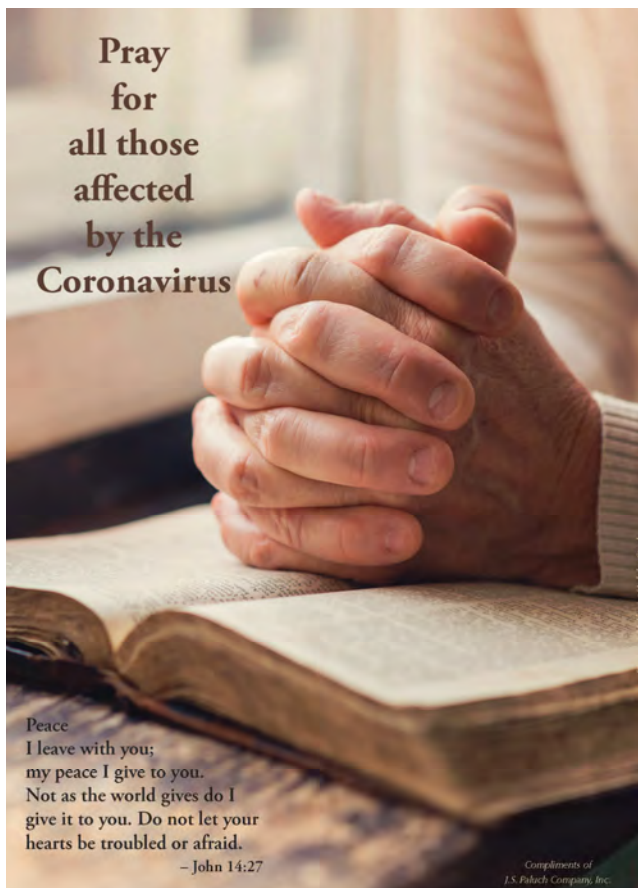

What is a Spiritual Communion?

St. Thomas Aquinas once defined Spiritual Communion as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament and in lovingly embracing Him as if we had actually received Him." You just need to approach Him with sincerity, humility and a desire to follow in His footsteps in acts of faith and charity. St. Jean-Marie Vianney, a French priest famous for converting countless souls to Christ in his parish of Ars in the 19th century, once said "when we feel the love of God growing cold, let us instantly make a Spiritual Communion. When we cannot go to the church, let us turn towards the tabernacle; no wall can shut us out from the good God."

PARISH REGISTRATION

Are You a Registered Parishioner?

If you attend Mass here regularly, we encourage you to register as a parishioner of Our Lady of Peace parish.

Why registering is important:

1. If we as a parish do not know who is out there, how can we serve the needs of all?

This includes single people or young families who may not see the need to register.

2. Make Sacrament prep easier when the time comes.

If you're not a registered parishioner, this may greatly delay the process for Sacrament prep.

3. Letters of Recommendation

There are occasions where letters of recommendations

are needed from your parish pastor (ie Catholic school enrollment, scholarships, godparent eligibility, etc.). If you're not registered, we cannot provide this letter.

Anyone, regardless of where they live is welcome to register at OLOP.

Please note: there is a three (3) month waiting period from the date of registration before being considered a full-fledged registered parishioner. Any requests for pastor signatures on any forms, letters, or wedding preparation paperwork cannot not be processed within the 3 months.

Disaster Relief Assistance for Immigrants Program (DRAI)

Key Facts

- *Program period:* **Monday, May 18 to June 30, 2020**
- *Days of operation:* **Monday through Saturday**
- *Hours of Hotline:* **8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.**

What is the DRAI program?

- The State of California will provide one-time disaster relief assistance to adult undocumented immigrant adults over the age of 18 who have been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.
- This program is funded by the State of California.
- The program is for adults who are ineligible for other forms of federal unemployment or pandemic related assistance, such as the CARES act or unemployment benefits.

What do I need to do to apply?

- The first step is to **CALL 866-490-3899**.
- You must provide a photo ID with a Santa Clara County address.

How much is the assistance?

- An undocumented adult who qualifies will receive \$500 of direct cash assistance (maximum of \$1000 per household). A household is defined as individuals who live, purchase, and prepare meals together.
- Assistance will be provided on a first come, first serve basis. Disaster relief application services and assistance are not guaranteed.
